

- 23% of our graduate students complete their degrees in under 18 months






(PODCASTS &) ALUMNI FEATURE

- The Alpha Chi National Honors Society awarded its highest annual distinction of Star Chapter to our Missouri Pi chapter, led by the College of Arts and Humanities.
