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herself in a marketing position at a US-based family-owned yarn company founded in 1878. That was also the year that Blumenthal founded the anti-bullying campaign called #HATNOTHATE (HNN). Hearing about a 9-year-old student who had experienced bullying and used that negative experience to empower other students, Blumenthal recognized the ways she had been impacted by bullying personally 20 years earlier and she decided it was time to respond to this universal problem with some strategies focused on prevention. Working for a yarn company, gave her a great idea for finding supporters.

Through #HATNOTHATE, knitters and crocheters make blue hats all year long and send them to HNN Headquarters. During October, National Bullying Prevention Month, hats are distributed in partner schools all over the U.S. along with an assembly and lessons (virtual or in person by HNN educators) that reinforce kindness and empower students to be strong and stand up to bullying. The HNN organization has seen growth each year as word has spread and during the pandemic while many were staying home more and looking for ways to connect, the message of #HATNOTHATE seemed to be the right thing at just the right time. In 2021, HNN collected over 65,000 hats, more than in all previous years combined!

This Spring, CAB, Self-Care Club, and Library Services, are joining in with the work of #HATNOTHATE through a launch event in the LARC, and 6 blue hat making sessions in March and April. Blue yarn is provided (while supplies last) and looms, crochet hooks, and knitting needles are available to borrow. Sessions are facilitated by faculty and staff in the Learning Academy and hats are collected at the end of each session. Hat making time can count toward service hours!
