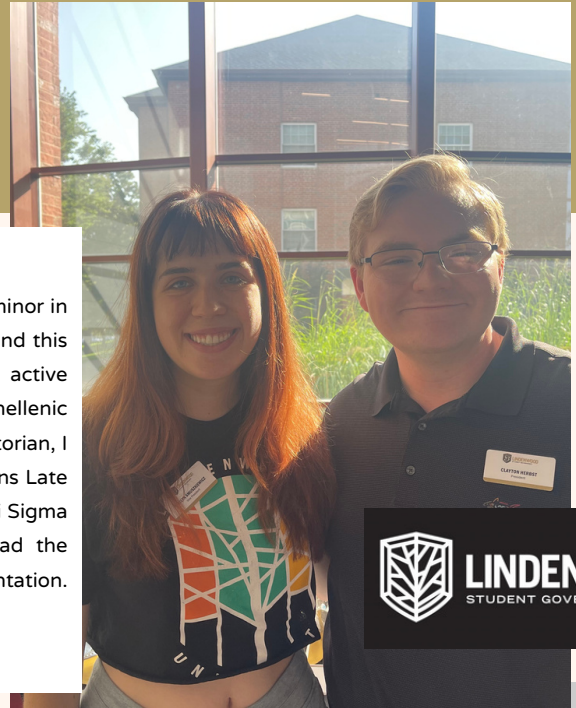
Lindenwood University has over 60 different clubs and organizations for students to get involved with.

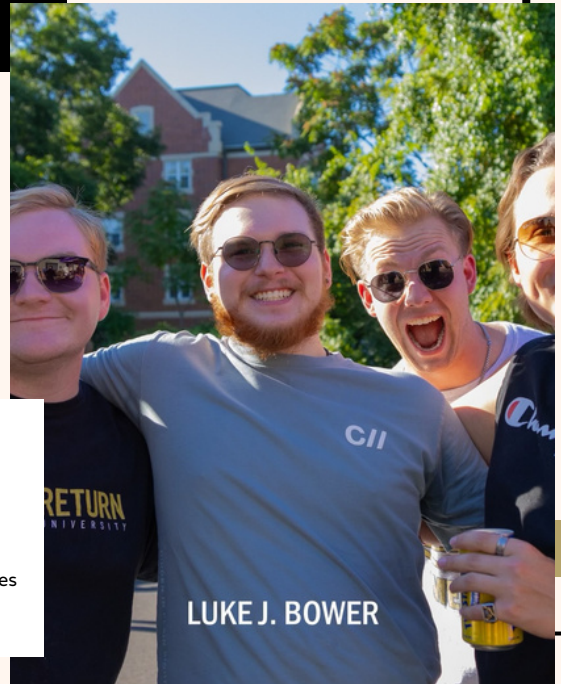
EXCITING UPCOMING EVENTS

Emails focusing on each topic will go out at the beginning of each week in addition to informational slides distributed across the digital displays around campus.



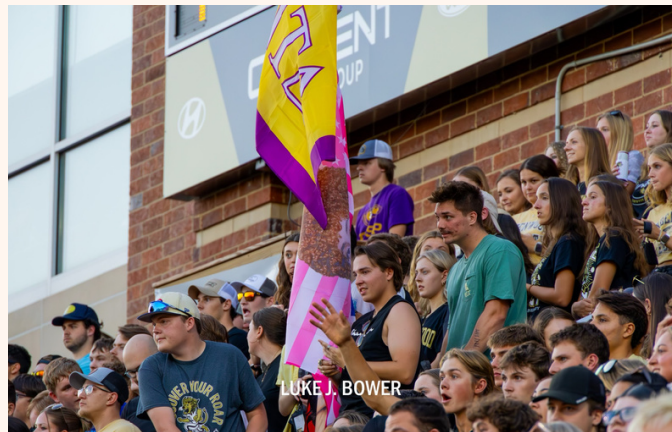
