

The Saint Louis Ballet is the region's only professional ballet company. The company's repertoire includes full-length ballets such as *The Sleeping Beauty*, Don Quixote, and Swan Lake, as well as contemporary works from renowned choreographers George Balanchine, Twyla Tharp, and Amy Seiwert, among others. Its classically trained dancers are selected in a competitive national audition and come to St. Louis from all over the world. This performance includes a dazzling excerpt from audience favorite The Nutcracker, as well as some exciting contemporary pieces that demonstrate the company's artistry and versatility.

Artistic and Executive Director Gen Horiuchi, originally from Tokyo, Japan, moved to the United States after winning the Prix de Lausanne, the international ballet competition in Switzerland, and receiving a scholarship to study at the School of American Ballet. The great George Balanchine invited him to join New York City Ballet and roles were created especially for him. Horiuchi's Broadway and London credits include Andrew Lloyd Webber's Song and Dance and the role of Mr. Mistoffelees in Cats. He also choreographed the magnificent opening ceremony of the Winter Olympics in Nagano, Japan.

The Isley Brothers began singing together as youngsters in 1950. Ronald, Rudolph, Kelly, and Vernon started out as a gospel group, performing in churches and other venues throughout their hometown of Cincinnati. But in 1955, Vernon Isley was killed in a bicycle accident. The traumatized siblings would not reform the ensemble until 1956, the year they moved to New York. Still, Ronald Isley says they did not consider themselves a professional unit until 1959, when the trio logged their first hit, "Shout." Ernie Isley joined the family business in 1969, which opened the door to his now-famous bass work on "It's Your Thing." The Isley Brothers later expanded to include Marvin Isley and brother-in-law Chris Jasper.

Ultimately, though, it's the Isleys' relationship to each other and not to their fellow performers – no matter how renowned – that defines them. Ernie accounts for their enduring success: "The Isley Brothers are a family and support group in addition to being a musical group. Right now, there are two of us physically, but when you say 'The Isley Brothers,' all the brothers are with us in spirit. What we have is unique, beyond classification, and we are extremely grateful for it."

He sends Mistress Page and Mistress Ford identical love letters, but they discover his double dealing and set about turning the tables, arranging an assignation at Mistress Ford's house.

Frank Ford has heard of Falstaff's plan and decides to test his wife's fidelity. Pretending to be Master Broom, he pays Falstaff to seduce his wife on his behalf, twice almost catching them together. The Pages' daughter Anne is pursued by three suitors. The French physician Doctor Caius is her mother's choice, whilst her father prefers Slender, Justice Shallow's kinsman. Anne herself is in love with Fenton. Mistress Quickly is being paid by all three suitors to promote their cause.

A duel between Doctor Caius and Parson Evans is averted when the Host of the Garter Inn plays a trick on them, and they in turn pay him back. In Windsor Great Park at night, Falstaff is set up for his final punishment - and one of Anne Page's suitors is successful. – *The Royal Shakespeare Company*


