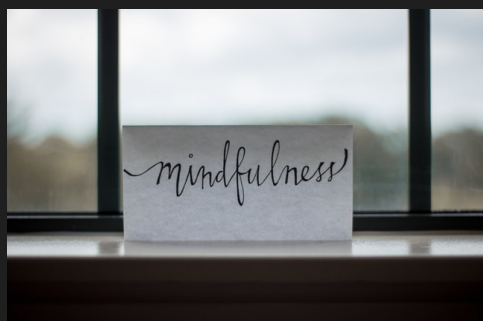

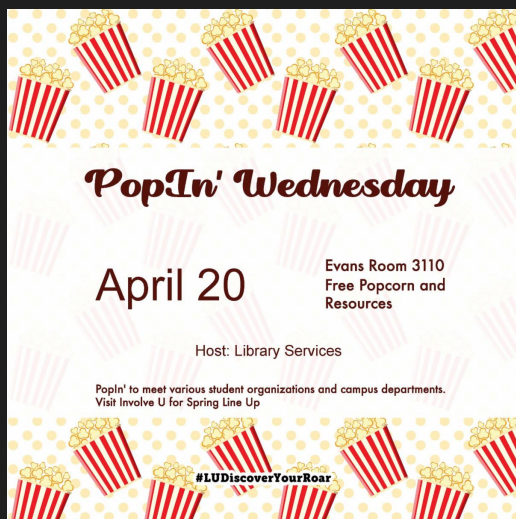

Michael Feters and Leah Rosenmiller will be on-hand to showcase the services and resources available to you from the Library.

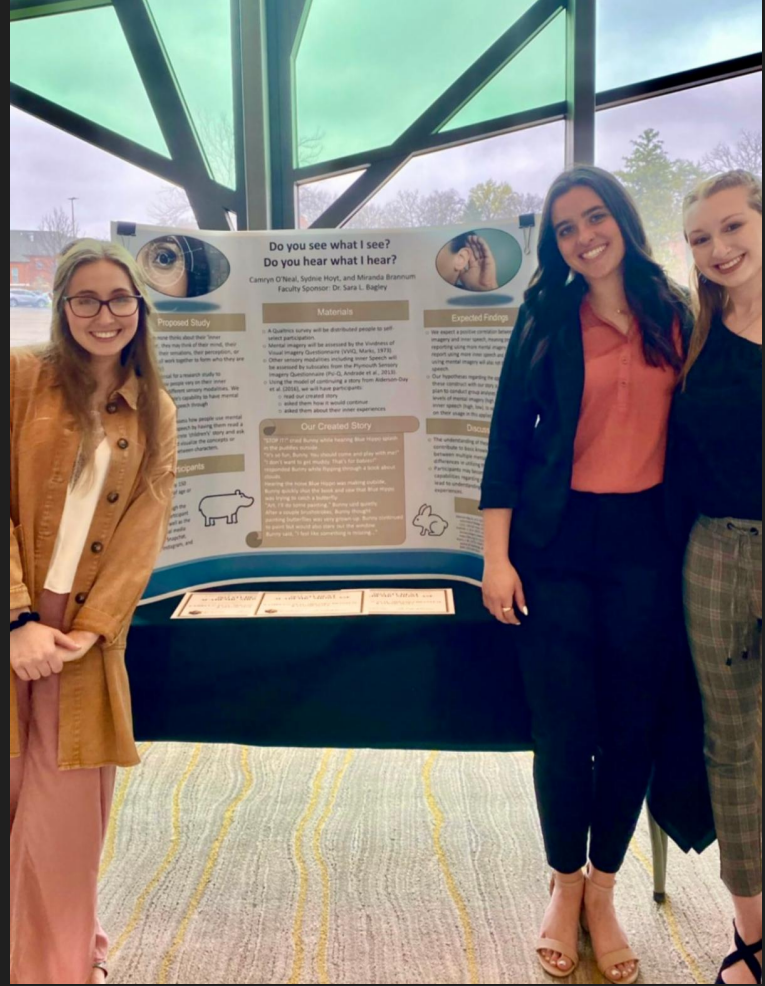
