Proceedings of the Board of Trustees

At a regular meeting of the Board were present, C. J. Barway, Peter Beyer, J. E. Sancier, and E. J. Gamache. E. J. Gamache Post and J. E. Sancier Collector, produced, and compared their books and vouchers, whereby it appeared that the Collector had received and paid into the Treasury the sum of Eight Hundred and Seventy dollars and Sixty cents (\$770.60). The books of the Treasurer showed the whole amount accredited to the Town for the preceding year to be One Thousand, Six Hundred and Ninety Seven dollars (\$1697), and the whole amount paid out of the Treasury up to this date to be Nine Hundred, and Fifteen dollars and Four cents. (\$915.04)

E. J. Gamache presented a bill of Seventy Two dollars and Eighty Five Cents, (\$72.85), which was allowed, and also his commission as Treasurer, Thirty Three dollars and Ninety Four cents (\$33.94), and for services as Trustee, Five dollars (\$5).
