Missouri has a new state nut, and **Lindenwood College** fits right into the plan. The black walnut has been named the official state nut, and this past week, Lindenwood became home to 25 new black walnut trees. Biology students and staff planted 50 new trees on the campus Wednesday and Thursday.

Interim President **Dennis Spellmann** is excited about the project. According to Spellmann, "The new nut trees will be a major source of food for our campus birds and wildlife. I think the red, brown, gray and even the black squirrel may enjoy the nuts," he continued.

Besides the black walnut tree, flowering dogwoods and pecan trees were planted on campus in areas where they may prevent soil erosion and enhance other conservation efforts.
