Lindenwood Honors College: Aim High and Rise to Challenge

The Honors College at Lindenwood University offers academic distinction to top-performing students. The program encourages individuals to aim high and rise to the challenge of a more rigorous academic experience.

Incoming freshman with an ACT score of 29 or greater are encouraged to join the Honors College, as all courses are available for honors credit and students can begin taking courses immediately. To participate, a student must receive permission from the professor and then mutually agree on a project that is suitable and relevant to the course. An "A" grade in the course is required to receive honors credit.

In 2008, Lindenwood launched what is referred to as the "honors section," a group of classes designed specifically for students seeking credit in the Honors College Program.

"Unlike taking on an extra project in a typical class, all of the courses in the honors section are offered specifically for those enrolled in the Honors College Program," said Michael Whaley, Ph.D., associate professor of history and chairman of the Honors College Board. "Since all the students in the class are there for the same reason, it creates an even more intimate and supportive environment."

The most prestigious of accolades imparted by the Honors College is University Honors. Graduates have the distinction noted on their transcripts, receive a special certificate from Lindenwood President James D. Evans, Ph.D., during the annual Honors Convocation, and don a purple cord during commencement ceremonies to signify their achievement.

"University Honors is reserved for exceptional students who demonstrate intelligence, initiative, and perseverance in fulfilling requirements beyond those asked of others," said Whaley. "It's the highest honor the university gives."

Additionally, students who participate in the program and maintain a 3.3 GPA are recognized as Honors Scholars.

Other unique academic commendations awarded by Lindenwood University include Degree, Class, and Major Honors, as well as several different individual achievement awards.

Degree Honors are given by faculty members to students who have completed all degree requirements with academic distinction, including the cum laude requirement of a GPA between 3.70 and 3.85, the magna cum laude requirement of a GPA between 3.86 and 3.93, and the summa cum laude requirement of a 3.94 or higher GPA.

Class Honors are separated into four unique categories. Underclassmen who maintain a minimum GPA of 3.5 are admitted into the Alpha Lambda Delta honor society; upperclassmen who achieve standing in the upper 10 percent of their class are admitted into the international college honor society of Alpha Chi; seniors who achieve a cumulative GPA of 3.5 are admitted into Alpha Sigma Tau; and non-traditional students who have completed 34 credit hours at Lindenwood with a minimum 3.8 GPA are admitted into the Alpha Sigma Lambda Honor Society.

Major Honors and individual achievement awards recognize high performance in various academic, professional, and visual and performing arts disciplines. Special recognition also is given to students who combine athletic skill with high academic achievement.
