Beilsmith, dragging streets \$16.⁵⁰ Le Roy Barnard, labor on ditches \$9.⁰⁰, Jerome Feldmann, labor on ditches \$3.⁰⁰, W^m Le Claire, grading streets \$48.³⁴, C.A. Rothermich labor on sewers \$3.⁰⁰. Bill for street light service was presented and warrant was ordered issued for \$52.⁵⁰, in payment thereof.

Upon motion duly made and seconded, the treasurer and Clerk, were authorized to issue treasury warrants in payment of ordinary and incidental expenses as they may arise, so as not to delay settlements to creditors and laborers.

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Portage des Sioux, Missouri met at the bank building in said town this day in regular form of meeting. Meeting was called to order at 8 o'clock P.M. with C.A. Barnard in the chair. Those present were: C.A. Barnard, A.J. Duvall, Al J. Echelé, W. Le Claire and C.A. Rothermich.

Minutes of the last meeting were read and approved. The Collector, C.A. Rothermich then presented a statement of the collections of town taxes and there being a number of delinquents, he was ordered to advise each such delinquent that such tax was due and payable at once in order to avoid penalties and the necessity of turning such collections over to the County collector for settlements.

An motion duly made and seconded, and in accordance with Ordinance No. 3, there was a Poll Tax levied for the year 1929 in the amount of Three (\$3⁰⁰) Dollars on each male citizen who has resided within the corporate town limits for thirty days next preceding this levy, who being between the age of twenty one (21) years and fifty (50) years old.

An motion duly made and seconded, and in conformity with Ordinance No. 4, there is hereby an automobile, truck and trailer registration with license fees of \$2⁰⁰, \$3⁰⁰ and \$2⁰⁰ respectively levied on each automobile, truck and trailer owned and operated within the corporate town limits for the year 1929. The Poll Tax to be due on the 1st Day of May 1929 and to become delinquent on June 1st 1929 and the Automobile and truck and trailer registration to be due on February 1st, 1929 and become delinquent on March 1st 1929.

Upon presentation of bills and accounts by the Clerk, Warrants were ordered issued in payment

Thereof as follows: Warrant #82 issued to the Ursuline Sisters in payment of tuition of 54 town children for month of December 1928, Warrant #83 issued to the Ursuline Sisters in payment of tuition for 54 town children for month of January 1929, Warrant No. 84 for \$30⁰⁰ issued to Postage Mutual Electric Assn for street light service to Jan. 15, 1929. Warrant #85 for \$8.50 issued to W. Le Claire for repairing gravel streets, all being approved.

At the request of the board, Mr. H. J. Prohibiting the parking or placing any automobile or any other obstruction on any of the streets of the corporate town limits, without having signal lights thereon to indicate its presence and prescribing penalties for violation thereof, was duly introduced and upon motion duly made and seconded said Bill was read for the third time, and upon motion duly made and seconded said bill was approved and same was then incorporated and classed as

Ordinance No. 5. which was as follows:

(AN ORDINANCE) BE IT ORDAINED By THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF PORTAGE DES SIOUX, MISSOURI, as follows:

SECTION 1.- That all motor and other vehicles and any and all of any other articles that may be parked or placed on any of the thoroughfares of this town and which may so remain thereon for any time, between the hours of dusk and dawn of any night, must have parking lights or lanterns thereon indicating to the traffic their or its presence on such thoroughfare.

SECTION 2. That there shall be a fine of not less than Three (\$3⁰⁰) Dollars nor more than Ten (\$10⁰⁰) Dollars for violation of this ordinance.

SECTION 3. That it is hereby made the duty of the Marshal to enforce this ordinance.

SECTION 4. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval by the Chairman of the Board of Trustees.

ORDINANCE NO. 6.) A BILL providing for the prohibition to drive, tow or pull any cleated tractor, traction engine, truck or other vehicle or implement over the oiled streets of the town, and providing penalties for violation of same was upon motion duly made and seconded read for the third time, and upon motion duly made and seconded, same was designated as ORDINANCE NO. 6. and was in terms as follows:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF PORTAGE DES SIOUX, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. That it is prohibited for anyone to drive, tow or pull any cleated tractor, traction engine or truck or any other vehicle or machine over any of the oiled streets of this town, exception to the foregoing being made at intersections of other streets, at such point or points, such cleated tractor

traction engine, truck and etc, shall be and are hereby allowed to cross such oiled street, should it become necessary to cross such oiled street.

SECTION 2. That there shall be a fine of not less than ten (\$10⁰⁰) Dollars nor more than (\$100⁰⁰) One hundred Dollars for violation of this ordinance.

the Mississippi River, and that portion of Latour Street, in the Town of Portage des Sioux, in the State of Missouri which lies between the northern line of Main Street and the southern line of the Perpetual Sixty Foot Street along the Mississippi River, and that portion of Diamond Street in the Town of Portage des Sioux, in the State of Missouri which lies between the northern line of Main Street and the southern line of Front Street, and that portion of Front Street, in the Town of Portage des Sioux, in the State of Missouri, which lies between the western line of the Town Limits and the western line of Le Claire Street, and that portion of Main Street, in the town of Portage des Sioux, in the State of Missouri, which lies between the eastern line of Latour Street and the western line of Le Claire Street, he, and the same are hereby vacated and discontinued as public thoroughfares of the said town of Portage des Sioux, Missouri, and that the said portions of said streets so vacated and discontinued are hereby relinquished and released forever to the owners of the properties fronting or abutting on said described and vacated and discontinued portions of said streets.

SECTION 2. All ordinances, or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance, in so far as they are in conflict with this ordinance, are hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
