
Dear Friends,


We see and hear his fireside chats; his controversial packing of the Supreme Court; his personal life with Eleanor and his discreet but definite affair with Lucy Mercer; his courage to break the Neutrality Act; his manipulation of Congress (in order to get the country to have a draft); the Pearl Harbor controversy; and the benevolent dictatorship he called the presidency from 1933 to 44, which made him the first man in history to be elected to four terms.

Asner is an American actor primarily known for his Emmy-winning role as Lou Grant on The Mary Tyler Moore Show and its spin-off series, Lou Grant. He also appeared in a recurring guest role as Wilson White on the television series Studio 60 on the Sunset Strip. As the recipient of seven Emmy Awards (Mary Tyler Moore Show, Lou Grant) and 16 nominations, and five Golden Globe Awards, and as a member of the TV Academy Hall of Fame, there is no doubt that Asner is prepared for the challenge of bringing such an iconic president to life before your very eyes.

THE GLENN MILLER ORCHESTRA

February 10, 2012 | 8:00 PM

The legendary Glenn Miller was one of the most successful of all the dance band leaders back in the Swing era of the 1930s and '40s. A matchless string of hit records, the constant impact of radio broadcasts, and the drawing power at theaters, hotels, and dance pavilions built and sustained the moment of popularity. Glenn disbanded his musical organization in 1942 at the height of its popularity, volunteered for the Army and then organized and led the famous Glenn Miller Army Air Force Band. It went to Europe to entertain servicemen, and then, on December 15, 1944, Major Miller took off in a single-engine plane from England to precede his band to France, never to be seen again.

Due to the popular demand, the Miller estate authorized the formation of the present Glenn Miller Orchestra in 1956, and it has proven its staying power by still being popular today. Indeed, the Glenn Miller Orchestra today is still the most sought after big-band in the world, just as it was in Glenn's day.

Being known and recognized for his accomplishments and high standards, Gary Tole became the next leader and director of the Glenn Miller Orchestra in January of 2011.

The Tschaikowski, St. Petersburg Symphony Orchestra was founded in the years following World War II. During this time, the orchestra successfully worked in different musical genres and received broad acknowledgement and popularity throughout Russia. In the history of the orchestra it has worked with many of the outstanding conductors from the St. Petersburg Conducting School. The orchestra has undergone much change since its inception, including a change of name and leadership, but through all this time it has been developing its repertoire strengths and building a devoted audience.

For the past 10 years, the Tschaikowski St. Petersburg Symphony Orchestra has become an ensemble with unlimited musical possibilities, including the regular commissioning and performance of new compositions, a testament to the high standards of the orchestra, which commissions many new works written especially for the orchestra each season. The orchestra has a special relationship with several local composers in St. Petersburg but also collaborates and premieres works of foreign composers, who have dedicated many of their works to the orchestra.

The Tschaikowski St. Petersburg Symphony Orchestra tours regularly all over the world and is currently under the musical direction of Roman Leontiev, who is also the chief conductor. The orchestra also features piano soloist Alexandre Pirojenko.



Twenty million records and several thousand concert shows ago, three young men in letter sweaters hit the music charts with their first single, "The Way You Look Tonight." The soft, melodic tune was a departure from the hard-driving music of that day, but listener requests made it a must for disc jockey play lists all over the country. In almost every poll, the Lettermen became "Best Vocal Group" or "Best New Group."

Hit after hit followed: "When I Fall in Love," "Theme From a Summer Place," "Put Your Head on My Shoulder," "Hurt So Bad," and "Shangri-La" as well as over 50 albums filled with special romantic Lettermen harmony. One of their better known songs, "Goin' Out of My Head/Can't Take My Eyes Off You," was a first of its kind when it was released; it was the first hit record ever to completely integrate two songs as one. One deejay said The Lettermen sound was "the best thing that happened to romance since moonlight." Over the years, however, The Lettermen have been aware of the ever-changing music scene. Therefore, the group has constantly updated its shows through the trends of folk sound, amplified guitars, and synthesized keyboards to always keep the act "today." Through all these trends, the Lettermen theme still remains the love song.

Although they have had more than their share of recording success, the Lettermen pride themselves on their live performances. Each show is a valentine to every audience as they maintain a whirlwind touring schedule throughout the United States and abroad. The music of these true entertainers transcends all language barriers and warms the hearts of millions.

Located at the west end of The Grand Lobby, The Boyle Family Gallery a short distance from The Emerson Black Box Theater, and The Bezemes Family Theater.





Take Interstate 70 west across the Blanchette Bridge (Missouri River). Take Exit 228 and turn right onto First Capitol Drive. Turn left onto West Clay. Entrance will be on your right.

From Interstate 64 in Chesterfield:

Travel west across the Daniel Boone Bridge (Missouri River). Exit at Highway 94. Turn right. Follow Highway 94 north and cross I-70. Turn left onto West Clay. Entrance will be on your right.
