### LINDENWOOD UNIVERSITY: A Proud Past...

Amidst the beautiful linden trees, Lindenwood University was founded on the highest ground between two rivers 170 years ago; today, it is the second oldest college west of the Mississippi. Since 1827, when it was founded by pioneering educator Mary Easton Sibley as a school for young ladies, it has enjoyed a reputation as an innovative force dedicated to liberal education in the highest sense and meaning of the term.

Mary Sibley, along with her husband Major George Sibley (himself a

prominent pioneer and frontiersman, who helped chart the Santa Fe Trail), sought to establish an institution which reached across all fields of knowledge, teaching a solid academic core along with the balanced sense of self-worth which accompanies dedication to the larger community and nation...an institution which was always up-to-date with the times, in teaching both the breadth of the liberal arts along with the attention to detail of the sciences, seeking to synthesize all knowledge in an effort to educate the whole person.

Lindenwood has changed through the years, in keeping with its innovative, pioneering heritage. Since 1968, the University has broadened its horizons by developing fully co-educational programs. Since 1974, a number of





Since joining the Lindenwood track and cross country program in January of '97, Coach Clark Wille's distance athletes have been burning up the Heart of America Conference.

Indoors, the women are lead by sophomore All-American Amy Knobloch. The men lead by freshman Neehall Philogene and Steve Humphries, have won or been involved in winning of 16 out of a possible 24 conference distance/middle distance races and relays at the conference meets. Amy was voted the outstanding

meet athlete after winning all four distance/middle distance races (800, 1500, 3000, 5000 meter races) along with setting new conference marks in each event outdoors.

The Lions will open their season on September 6 at Southern Illinois University in Carbondale, with stops at the Jayhawk Invitational Kansas, Eastern Illinois, Oklahoma State, Washington University, before entering the conference meet and national qualifying round.


### Participation + graduation = success

Walking onto the field, court or track in a Lindenwood uniform means a lot more than just another game...it is an opportunity and a privilege. The athletes Lindenwood sends into competition are top quality representatives of this historic institution. They are on a mission not just to be victorious on the field, but to succeed in the classroom and in life. Sports at Lindenwood builds character and produces well-rounded citizens.

Lindenwood is the fastest-growing four-year-institution in Missouri, and our athletic philosophy is one of the reasons for our dramatic growth. We have more than 15,000 successful graduates throughout the world, and for many of them, athletics were a significant part of their experience at Lindenwood. We are committed to top academic programs, values, scholar athletes, and maximum participation in athletics.

Coaches are among the best in their field, hired with our philosophy in mind. They must have a strong commitment to academic success of student-athletes.

Our commitment to athletics is exemplified not only in our philosophy of a top education for scholar-athletes, but also in the facilities we provide. Recently, Lindenwood completed a \$10 million arena for wrestling, basketball and volleyball. New practice fields are under construction for football and soccer, new tennis courts have been completed, and renovations are under way for baseball and softball.



The 1996 season finished with a bang. Winning three out of the last four contests propelled the squad into a strong off-season commitment and a desire to get the 1997 season started right away.

Playing very competitively against

Evangel, Benedictine, and Graceland put the team in position to defeat nationally ranked /Mid American-Nazarene, and finish the season with a 37-14 victory over perennial power Missouri Valley.

While Coach Dan Kratzer has helped develop a winning tradition at Lindenwood, his barometer for success isn't the win-loss

record. It is the total development of individuals--academically and athletically. He is particularly proud of his numerous players on Lindenwood's academic athletic honor roll

"Lindenwood is developing a great football tradition," said Kratzer. "We are experiencing success on the field. But even more important is the educational opportunity football has provided to more than 125 young men."

One of the keys to Lindenwood's success, Kratzer said, has been recruitment of good athletes who are also good citizens.

On the field, the 1997 season is



filled with optimism. With eight defensive starters and six defensive starters back the Lions can field their first experienced team since Coach Dan Kratzer has been at Lindenwood.

Key players on offense include quarterback Max Brown, who must show great leadership in 1997. His talented arm can propel the Lions up and down the field. Carlton Rivers looms as a big target and a good blocker for the running game. Cecil Severado is back after leading the team in rushing last season.

Mandeep Atwal will also be a key player in the Lions potent attack, at 6'3 245 lbs. he also looms as a big target.

Key defensive players include Brandon Baker, a 6'2 230 lb. linebacker who led the team in tackles in 1996. Bret Wagner will

also return and give the defense much help in run support. Mark Fellicilli will hold down the secondary in hopes that young players can contribute right away this season.



### Head Coach Art Siebels

For the second season in a row, the Lindenwood Lions mens and women's golf teams made it to the top--the National Tournament. The men finished the season record of 19-4. They advanced to the National Tournament as a result of their 13-stroke victory in the Heart of America Conference Tournament. Kyle Jones, a freshmen, was



the tournament medalist with a two day total of 149 (78/71). Kyle and Jay Story were named to the "All Conference" team. The teams line-up was composed of three freshmen and two sophomores, so the Lions are hopeful of a three-peat at the National Tournament in 1998. The Lions placed three players in their all-time top seven scorers in the 1997 season, led by freshmen Jay Story with a 77.0 stroke average. Kyle Jones(78.1) and Jeff Escott(78.4) also broke into the top seven scorers. Lindenwood will host the conference tournament in 1998.

Under Coach Art Siebels, the Lions have compiled a 103-51-1 record for a .665 winning percentage. In the six years they have won three conference championships, a regional championship and made two appearances at the National Tournament.

The Lady Lions also made their second appearance at the National Tournament. They advanced due to their team score of 366 shot during their regular season tournament at MidRivers Golf complex. The team finished with an 8-4 team record. They were led by junior Leigh Ann Buschjost with senior Nichol Schoeneweis both with a 93.5 stroke average and freshman Amy Kettle who averaged 97.0. Nichol also earned All-American Scholar Athlete honors.


Dale Ribble

the athletic program."






prise a lot of teams.

The squads were led by returners Jason Wood (throws), Julian Smith (long and triple jump), Amy Knobloch (distance), Shanna Weber (sprints), Karen Isaac (hurdles) Jennifer Coplin (hurdles), and Amy Gravitz (throws. New athletes who had an impact included John Grebe (hurdles), Jason Jones (hurdles), Neehall Philogene (distance), Gary Rice (throws), Andrew Rootz (throws) Tom Davis (throws), Tina Hall (hurdles-middle distance), Gina Schroder (middle distance) Tasha Earl (sprints), and Camille

Davis (sprints).

The teams had 24 representatives at the National Indoor Championship with Amy Knobloch placing 5th in the mile and 6th in the 5,000 meters. Jason Wood placed tied for 6th in the shot put. Another 15 athletes competed at

He has led teams to three women's and four men's national track and field championships and received seven national Coach of the Year honors. Creer has coached two World Champions in track, as well as four Olympic medalists and nine participants. In addition he has coached 98 individual national champions and 360 All-Americans. Bingham, the assistant head coach, is widely recognized throughout the state and around the country as a outstanding coach and recruiter. He works with sprints, jumps, hurdles and multievents. Cross Country coach Clark Wille works with the distance events. Wille is the alltime winningest high school coach in Missouri. He also led Missouri Baptist College to eight national top 10 finishes in cross country and track and field in seven years. The recipient of one national Coach of the Year honor, Wille has also been inducted into the Missouri Track and Field Hall of Fame.

### **Athletic Training Program**

Randy L. Biggerstaff joins the Athletic Department as the new Athletic Trainer. His duties include directing the new athletic trainer education curriculum program and starting a masters program. He will be pursuing the the approval of the athletic curriculum by the National Athletic Training Association.




