CHOREOGRAPHERS

TRACY B DUPRE (FACULTY) has been an Adjunct Dance Professor at Lindenwood University since 2003. She has a cross-disciplinary focus in dance and digital media and teaches courses in tap, jazz, dance theory and composition and choreographs for concerts. She taught at the Performing Arts Centre and has served as the Tap Dance Coordinator at COCA (Center of Creative Arts) where she taught tap, jazz and choreographed for COCAdance, COCAbiz and COCAcabana. Her training was with the Performing Arts Centre where she was a member of the Dance Company of St. Charles. Tracy studied modern dance, musical theatre, West African dance, ballet, choreography, Pilates and video production at Stephens College. She has earned a Bachelor's Degree in TV & Video Production, Master of Arts in Mass Communication & Digital Media and has completed coursework for her Master of Fine Arts in Dance. In 2019, Tracy's piece titled, "The Sweetest Sound," was chosen to perform in a new choreographer's showcase, "Something's Afoot" put on by Brenda Bufalino's American Tap Dance Festival in New York. In 2018, Tracy presented a tap pedagogy lecture and master class at the MDO (Missouri Dance Organization) conference. In 2013, Tracy earned the Adjunct Teaching Award at Lindenwood University. She choreographs for corporate events and dance companies, teaches dance intensives, master classes and has taught at the American College Dance Festival. She has judged regional & national dance competitions and her choreography has won national titles and choreography awards. Choreography credits include the Bob Costas charity event, 60x60 Project, Spring to Dance Festival, Dancin' In the Streets, St. Louis Bilikens basketball team, St. Louis Panera Bread Company, the opening act for a Bobby McFerrin concert as well as a Love & Unity town hall event. Tracy has been interviewed by Dancer Magazineregarding the tap dance scene in St. Louis. She has danced in the Cotton Bowl Parade and attends National Tap Dance Festivals around the country where she has studied & taken class from Jason Samuels Smith, Andrew Nemr, Chloe Arnold, Sarah Reich, Diane Walker, Arthur Duncan, Bril Barrett, Michelle Dorrance, Lane Alexander, Anthony LoCasio, Jumaane Taylor, Diane Walker, Brenda Bufalino, Acia Gray, Savion Glover, Sam Weber, Henry Le Tang and Van Porter. Tracy is also owner of Brookstone Video where she is a freelance videographer & video editor. Professional organizations include the Missouri Dance Organization (MDO) and the International Tap Dance Association (ITA).

AMY GAMMON (FACULTY) is a performer of MoSTLy TAP, a St. Louis based tap dance company. She holds a Bachelors of Arts in dance, with a Masters of Art in Teaching dance from Lindenwood University where she is now an Adjunct Professor in the dance department. Amy is a member of Dance Masters of America, a graduate at DMA's Teachers Training School earning the Bachna Scholarship, and a proud member of The DANCE CO. of St. Charles. She is a convention teacher, choreographer and director with Beyond the Stars Dance Competition/ Convention where she has had the honor of teaching master classes and the opening number for the past few years. She is proud to have set the choreography for Urinetown the Musical for Lindenwood University and Love At First Fright for Six Flags. Amy enjoys teaching and setting choreography in hopes to inspire the future generation.

MARCUS JOHNSON (FACULTY) began his dance training at the age of 15 and soon after received a full scholarship to COCA (Center of Creative Arts) in Saint Louis, joining the First Company and the Pre-Professional Program under the direction of Lee Nolting and Alicia Graf-Mack. Marcus has performed pieces by Antony Tudor, Antonio Douthit-Boyd, Kirven Douthit-Boyd, Alicia Graf-Mack, Michael Uthoff, Maurya Ker, Nejla Yatkins, Hanna Brictson, Gina Patterson, Roni Koresh, and Lara Teeter. In the summer of 2011. he performed the Antony Tudor masterpiece Dark Elegies for the Corps De Ballet in Kansas City, Missouri. Marcus trained with the Perry Mansfield School, Kansas City Ballet, "Real World" with Jon Lehrer and Lehrerdance, and Hubbard Street Dance Chicago. Marcus received his Bachelor of Fine Arts degree in Dance from Webster University with honors with an emphasis in ballet. After receiving his degree, Marcus danced professionally with the Modern American Dance Company (MADCO). Currently living in Saint Louis, Marcus is a freelance competitive and concert dance choreographer, judges under the Star Dance Alliance, and is an MFA graduate in Dance at Washington University in St.Louis, class of 2020. Marcus is also proud to be the a director and instructor at RJ's Dance Studios-Chesterfield and adjunct faculty at Lindenwood University.

MADISON HICKS (GUEST ARTIST) originally from Dallas, TX, graduated from Booker T. Washington HSPVA in 2014. She received her BFA from The Juilliard School in May 2018 and her MFA in Choreography in 2021 from California Institute of the Arts. Madison was one of eight choreographers chosen for The Jacobs Pillow Ann and Weston Hicks Choreographic Fellowship in 2021. She is the Director and Founder of Moving Forward Dallas, an innovative dance intensive and Non-Profit Organization for young artists. Madison identifies as a freelance creator, performer, and educator. In 2021 she has been commissioned by New York Dance Project, Mash-Up Contemporary Dance company, Ballet Project OC, Orange County School of the Performing and Visual Arts, Water Street Dance Milwaukee, and Lindenwood University to create new work. In 2020, she created new work for Ballet Arkansas and Avant Chamber Ballet while also presenting work in Boston Dance Festival and LA Dance Festival. Madison has also presented work at Palm Desert Choreography Festival and Mash-Up's International Women's Day Festival along with premiering her recent solo work "Sparkle with a K" at The Navel Theater in Downtown Los Angeles in 2020.

She has been a guest choreographer for Booker T. Washington HSPVA Rep II Ensemble, The University of Texas at Austin, Center of Creative Arts, Houston MET Too, San Diego Civic Center, and The Windward School along with rigorously teaching artists of all ages. Madison is currently a faculty member for Steps on Broadway and REVEL Dance Convention. She was a full-time company member with LA Dance Project under the direction of Benjamin Millepied for the 2018/2019 season. Since then, Madison has been a lead dancer in both Noosa Yoghurt and Lexus Commercials along with choreographing music videos for Eleanor Kingston and the Handsome Ghost. She was a 2013 YoungArts winner for modern dance, 2014 US Presidential Scholar in the Arts Nominee and a guest artist in the 2014 YoungArts Presidential Scholar Gala under the direction of Bill T. Jones. In January of 2017, she performed as a distinguished guest alumnus in the YoungArts annual Backyard Ball under the direction of Tony Yazbeck. She received a choreography award from YAGP in 2014 and had three choreographic works chosen to perform in The Choreographic Honors show at The Juilliard School. Madison was awarded the Gene Kelly Legacy Scholarship for her choreography

and jazz technique in 2016. She has performed works by Nacho Duato, Jiri Kylian, Emily Molnar, Kyle Abraham, Ohad Naharin, Peter Chu, Merce Cunningham, Martha Graham, Aszure Barton, Gustavo Ramirez Sansano, Benjamin Millepied, and Pam Tanowitz.

MARIKO KUMANOMIDO (FACULTY) from St. Louis MO, began her formal dance training at Alexandra School of Ballet. She graduated from University of Missouri – Kansas City with her BFA in Dance. She then moved to New York City, where she was a scholarship student at the Ailey School. In New York she danced professionally with Buglisi Dance Theater, Jessica Danser/Dansfolk, and C. Eule Dance. She also danced with Graham II, and she received her Graham Teacher Training certificate from the Martha Graham Center of Contemporary Dance. She moved back to St. Louis, MO and danced with Common Thread Contemporary Dance Company, under the direction of Jennifer Medina. In 2018 she graduated from Washington University with her MFA in Dance. She currently teaches at COCA, Webster, and Lindenwood University.

KERRYAUNNA ROSS (STUDENT) is from Kansas City, Missouri where she started dancing at the tender age of three when her great-grandmother enrolled her and two of her cousins in the Forever Dancing studio. While developing her dance skills in the studio, at home she was developing athletic skills due to the influence of growing up with three brothers. In middle school, Kerryaunna played volleyball, basketball and ran track along with playing in the Symphonic band and keeping up her dance studies. Kerryaunna participated in the Alvin Ailey summer camp and continued dancing with KCFAA (Kansas City Friends of Alvin Ailey) throughout high school. She also continued to play in Symphonic and marching band in high school, competing in both solo and ensemble competitions and receiving recognition as an "all-state-player." Kerryaunna also received awards as an All-American cheerleader and dancer. She also found time to perform and choreograph for her high school musicals. At Lindenwood, Kerryaunna has participated in marching band, track team, and multiple student organizations including serving on the board of Black Student Union, and as a member of Black Student Excellence and Engagement. Kerryaunna will be graduating in December with a Bachelor of Arts in Dance and a minor in Dance Studio Management. She plans to travel after graduation, and

hopes to eventually settle down and open up her own dance studio.

JANET STRZELEC (FACULTY) holds a Bachelor of Science degree in Dance from Southern Illinois University Edwardsville and a Master of Fine Arts in Directing with a Musical Theatre emphasis from Lindenwood University. Professor Strzelec has been teaching at Lindenwood since January 1998, and served as chair of the dance department from June 2005-May 2021. She has an extensive history of teaching, directing and choreographing in the greater St. Louis area including work with dance studios, K-12 schools, universities, and professional dance and musical theatre companies. At Lindenwood, Professor Strzelec has enjoyed teaching ballet, pointe, jazz, tap, modern, musical theatre, dance appreciation, dance composition, dance pedagogy and a variety of special topics that includes a dance program study abroad trip to Paris. In addition to teaching dance courses, Strzelec has also enjoyed serving as director and/or choreographer for many, many dance concerts and musicals at Lindenwood. Professor Strzelec's performance credits include ballets, musicals, dinner theatre, television commercials, industrials, and Six Flags Show Productions. Some of her favorite roles are Miss Adelaide (Guys and Dolls), Roxie (Chicago), Anna (the King and I), and dancing as a Friend and Wili in her favorite ballet, Giselle, Janet Strzelec has a great love for all things dance, and a great passion for sharing that love with others.

TRICIA ZWEIER (FACULTY) is an Associate Professor of Dance and The Dance Program Coordinator at Lindenwood University, where she teaches mostly contemporary and jazz techniques, dance history, dance & technology, and dance science courses. She earned a Master of Science in Kinesiology and a Master of Fine Arts in Dance, with a concentration in choreography, from The University of North Carolina at Greensboro. Zweier performed with Leverage Dance Theater, The Atlantic City Ballet, and Flatlands Dance Theatre, as well as international tours in the cruise line industry as a lead dancer and dance captain. Other performance credits include the works of Hanya Holm, Merce Cunningham, Martha Graham, Sean Curran, Mark Dendy, and Nejla Yatkin. Her recent creative works seek to embody historical people, places, and events in an effort to bring underrepresented, forgotten, or misinterpreted historical narratives to the dancing body. These works have been showcased with Lindenwood University students in national festivals including The Boston Contemporary Dance Festival and The Detroit Dance City Festival. She has also been commissioned to create original work for The Center for Contemporary Dance Pre-professional Student Intensive (Orlando, FL), The College of Lake County (Grayslake, IL), and Texas Tech University (Lubbock, TX), amongst others. She is also a PBT/PCT certified teacher and a Certified Yoga Teacher (CYT-200). Her scholarly research focuses on integrating kinesiology with dance to promote healthy training practices. She regularly presents her research at conferences including The National Dance Education Organization, The Missouri Dance Organization, and The International Association for Dance Medicine and Science. Tricia serves as the Operations Coordinator for The Dance Science and Somatics Educators and Secretary for Modern American Dance Company's Board of Directors. www.triciazweier.com
