A DREAM OF FLIGHT

A Dream of Flight is an excerpt from the first movement of On Great White Wings by Greg Danner. On Great White Wings is a musical portrayal of four scenes in the quest for flight, a la the Wright Brothers. A Dream of Flight is a brass and percussion fanfare suggesting the noble spirit of those pioneers who dared to explore this frontier.

ST. ANTHONY CHORALE AND VARIATION

This famous melody of *St. Anthony Chorale* has been attributed to Haydn, but there is doubt as to whether he was the composer or simply quoted an older theme taken from an unknown source. Johannes Brahms wrote a famous set of variations based on this melody calling it *Variations on a Theme* by Joseph Haydn. This arrangement for brass and percussion is based on the theme and one variation.

FLOURISH FOR WIND BAND

Ralph Vaughan Williams, a highly respected English composer, wrote some of the earliest works for twentieth-century concert band, with many of his pieces considered pillars of band literature. Flourish for Wind Band was written as an overture to the pageant Music and the People performed in the Royal Albert Hall in 1939. The score was then lost, only to reappear in 1971. It was not made available to American bands until it was published in 1972. Flourish for Wind Band followed on the heels of Vaughan Williams' great masterworks for band, English Folk Song Suite and Toccata Marziale.

ENCANTO

Encanto, Spanish for "charm," is a very impressive composition by Robert W. Smith, opens with a distinctive full brass fanfare and evolves into an infectious rhythmic statement. The lyrical section presents a beautiful theme that defines the piece. The opening fanfare reappears at the end of the piece and leads decisively to a powerful ending.

SCARBOROUGH FAIR

This fiery setting of the well-known folk song starts quietly, then builds to a heart-pounding finish. This arrangement makes up the final movement of *Three Folk Song Settings for Band* by Andrew Boysen. The final movement, Scarborough Fair, concludes the suite with a rousing setting of this well-known folk song, and includes references to the previous two movements. *Three Folk Song Settings for Band* was commissioned by Russ Kramer and the Mason City (lowa) High School Symphonic Band and was premiered in 2007.

BENEDICTION

Benediction features flowing melodies and counter lines in a rich, peaceful, chorale-like setting. It was originally scored for tuba quartet.

BLAZE OF GLORY

Blaze of Glory was commissioned by the Southwestern Oklahoma Band Directors Association for their 2003 Honor Band. The work was written as an overture in a style influenced by the cowboy and pioneer spirit of the frontiersmen who settled the area.

SYMPHONY NO. 1, THE LORD OF THE RINGS V. HOBBITS

Johan de Meij's first symphony *The Lord of the Rings* is based on the trilogy of that name by J.R.R. Tolkien. This book has fascinated many millions of readers since its publication in 1955. The symphony consists of five separate movements, each illustrating a personage or an important episode from the book. *V. HOBBITS* The fifth movement expresses the carefree and optimistic character of the Hobbits in a happy folk dance; the hymn that follows emanates the determination and noblesse of the hobbit folk. The symphony does not end on an exuberant note, but is concluded peacefully and resigned, in keeping with the symbolic mood of the last chapter, The Grey Havens, in which Frodo and Gandalf sail away in a white ship and disappear slowly beyond the horizon.

STUDENT CONDUCTORS

TREVOR MCGRAW is a senior pursuing a bachelors degree in instrumental music education. He is President of the National Association for Music Education collegiate (NAfME-C) chapter and is also a member of the Jazz Education Network (JEN) chapter, Wind Ensemble, Jazz Band, Marching/Pep Band, University Chorus and the St. Louis Wind Symphony Youth Ensemble. After graduation, his goal is to teach band at the middle school or high school level.

GRACE COOKE is a junior majoring in Instrumental Music Education. She is a member of Lindenwood's Wind Ensemble, Marching Band, Pep Band, Brass Ensemble, Jazz Band, University Chorus as well as the St. Louis Wind Symphony Youth Ensemble. She is also a member of the National Association for Music Education Collegiate, Jazz Education Network, and Women Band Directors International. After graduation, she hopes to teach middle or high school band.


