Dec. 16 & 17- Killed 10 Hogs making 1340 lbs Pork in all.

17, Marked 18 B: Pigs and 13: S. Pigs all about a month old
Same day a large white sow had 7 pigs and eat them all

Ab^t. the 3^d of Jan.- spotted Sow had pigs- 3 of them only saved.

Ab^t. the 3^d of Feb. Young blk & Wh. Sow had 7 pigs- 5 saved

Abt. the 7 of Feb. another Sow had Pigs and eat them.-

12th Feb.- Hung up in Smoke House

20 Hams- 13 Shoulders- 14 Middlings & 9 Jowls for Bacon.

also 1 Bear Ham and ab^t. 30 Vension Hams.

23. Mar. Got up young Brindled Cow (commonly called "Star") with a
young Bull Calf which is about 3 days old.

Note. On the 1^t. of March the Ice began to break up in the Missouri-
about the 5th it entirely cleared out of the Eddy- about the 10th
the River began to Rise and was by the 15th nearly overflowing all
the Sand bars in Sight of the Fort, it kept up for 2 or 3 days and
then fell pretty fast- Since the 10th, the weather has been quite
mild, the ground is now thoroly thawed, and we are thinking of com-
mencing to dig up the Gardens and Sow Some early Seeds.-

Sept. 17, '18- white frost this morning, the first this season.

it was pretty heavy, but did not injure that I know of in the
neighborhood of Ft. Osage.
