Clerk & Collector, C. A. Pothernick then presented list of delinquent taxpayers a copy of which is filed herewith, said delinquencies were then duly declared "Delinquent" and if such taxes be not paid within thirty days same to be turned over to the County Collector for further action thereon.

An report of Street Commissioner, Mr. Le Claire that there was unreasonable dumping of rubbish and waste on various streets and in sewers and drainage outlets of the town, and on motion duly made and seconded the clerk was instructed to have signs made as follows "No dumping of waste or rubbish on streets or in drainage ditches or sewers of the town By order of Town Board of Trustees" and said signs to be placed at appropriate places in town by the Street Commissioner.

An motion duly made and seconded, the clerk was ordered to draw up a Bill for an ordinance to Prohibit the dumping of waste and rubbish in ditches or sewers or on the streets of the town.

ORGANIZATION OF NEW BOARD, April 17, 1931  
 The Board Elect, namely, Dr. C. A. Barnard, Al. J. Echels, H. J. Jacobs, W. Le Claire, and C. A. Rothermich, assembled at the Bank building in Postage des Sioux, Mo. for the purpose of organization and the selection of the several officers. H. J. Jacobs was nominated temporary chairman, and C. A. Rothermich was appointed clerk of the meeting.

By order of the Chairman, the minutes of the retiring board was ordered read and it was found that each and every member of the Board Elect had been duly voted a certificate of election and each member then to and subscribed his qualifying Oath of Office. Honorable Sirs:-

The Inhabitants of the Town of Portage des Sioux acting by and thru its Board of Trustees respectfully petition your honorable body to oil the main street leading thru the town of Portage des Sioux, from west to east connecting the Wunsch or Weber Lake road with the Lower Portage (or Payne) road by the following route thru the said town:

Beginning at the eastern terminus of the said Weber Lake road at the southwestern entrance to the said town thence northward 1 block, thence eastward 1 block, thence northward 2 blocks, thence eastward 8 blocks, thence southward 2 block blocks, thence eastward  $1\frac{1}{2}$  blocks, thence southward 2 blocks, thence eastward  $2\frac{1}{2}$  blocks to the connecting point of the county road commonly known as the lower Portage or Payne road, being a distance of about  $1\frac{2}{10}$  miles.

FURTHER: The said Inhabitants respectfully petition your honorable body to oil additional streets in the said town at the expense of the said inhabitants of the said town of a distance of about three-fourths ( $\frac{3}{4}$ ) mile.

FURTHER: In addition to the above referred to oiling, the said inhabitants respectfully petition your honorable body to oil other streets in the said town, giving certain portions of the first above referred to route thru town a second application as well as certain portions of the second referred to streets a second application, at such places where the traffic demands more oiling. This second application to be done at the expense of the said Inhabitants also, and constitutes a distance of about one-half ( $\frac{1}{2}$ ) mile.

Inasmuch as this is the identical route and other streets as has constituted the oiling petitions of previous three years of the said town, and as there is a diagram of this route in the county engineer's office, we deemed it superfluous to submit another diagram. We pray your usual favorable consideration of this petition for which you will greatly oblige.

On presentation of enrollment list of town children at the Parochial School for the months of May and June, which showed an enrollment of 54 children for each month, Treasury warrant no. 177 issued to the Ursuline Sisters in the amount of \$81.<sup>00</sup> in payment of tuition of said children for May and June was approved.

On motion duly made and seconded, the Street Commissioner, W. Le Claire, was ordered to see that streets were ready and in proper condition when oil is to be applied, and to employ such hired labor for the proper sanding of street after oiling and the clerk was authorized to draw warrants on the treasury in payment of such petty labor on verification of labor bills by street commissioner.

On motion duly made and seconded, and carried, it was ordered that J.A. Jessup be given the job of repairing the sidewalks over the main business district of town and, the street commissioner ordered to supply him with the needed materials.

The Clerk, C.A. Rothermich, having completed the ordinance providing for an Electric light and power franchise, within the corporate town limits of the town, same being ten (10) pages which are appended to the following page, and are as follows:



AN ORDINANCE OF THE INHABITANTS OF THE TOWN OF PORTAGE DES SIOUX, MISSOURI, ACTING FOR OR THRU A BOARD OF TRUSTEES GRANTING TO T. L. LEONARD AND J. M. HAVIN, HEREIN CALLED THE PORTAGE MUTUAL ELECTRIC ASSOCIATION, THEIR SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNS, PERMISSION TO ERECT, INSTALL, CONSTRUCT, RECONSTRUCT, REPAIR, OWN, OPERATE, MAINTAIN, MANAGE AND CONTROL AN ELECTRIC LIGHT, HEAT AND POWER PLANT WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF SAID VILLAGE AND FOR AN ELECTRIC DISTRIBUTION SYSTEM CONSISTING OF POLES, WIRES, CONDUITS, PIPES, CONDUCTORS AND OTHER FIXTURES, IN, UNDER, OVER, ALONG AND ACROSS THE STREETS, LANES, AVENUES, SIDE WALKS, ALLEYS, BRIDGES, AND PUBLIC GROUNDS OF SAID VILLAGE, FOR THE PURPOSE OF FURNISHING ELECTRICITY FOR LIGHT, HEAT AND POWER PURPOSES TO SAID VILLAGE AND ITS INHABITANTS FOR A PERIOD OF TWENTY YEARS FROM AND AFTER THE PASSAGE OF THIS ORDINANCE, ACCORDING TO LAW.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE INHABITANTS OF THE TOWN OF PORTAGE DES SIOUX, MISSOURI, ACTING BY OR THRU THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That there is hereby granted unto T. L. Leonard and J. M. Havin, their successors and assigns, herein called the Portage Mutual Electric Association, the right, permission, privilege and franchise for a period of Twenty (20) years from and after the taking effect of this ordinance, subject only to the laws of the State of Missouri as now in force or as may hereafter be in force, and to the conditions and limitations hereinafter contained, to erect, install, construct, reconstruct, repair, own, operate, maintain, manage and control an electric light, heat and power plant, and, or an electric distribution system consisting of poles, wires, conduits, pipes, conductors and other fixtures, within the limits of said municipality, necessary, convenient or proper for the production, transmission, distribution and delivery of electricity, for light, heat and power purposes to said municipality and its inhabitants.



Section 2. That said Portage Mutual Electric Association, its successors and assigns, is hereby granted the right-of-way in, under, over, along and across the streets, lanes, avenues, sidewalks, alleys, bridges and public grounds of said municipality for the purpose of erecting, installing, constructing, reconstructing, repairing, owning, operating, maintaining, managing and controlling said electric light, heat and power plant and said electric distribution system.

Section 3. That said Portage Mutual Electric Association shall hold said municipality free and harmless of any and from any and all liability, damages, actions and causes of action, caused by or through the neglect or mismanagement of the Portage Mutual Electric Association in the erection, installation, construction, reconstruction, repair, operation, maintenance, management or control of said electric plant and distribution system.

Section 4. That said Portage Mutual Electric Association shall not, during the erection, installation, construction, reconstruction, repairing, operation and maintenance of said plant or distribution system, unnecessarily impede public travel on the streets, lanes, avenues, sidewalks, alleys, bridges and public grounds of said municipality, and shall leave all of said streets, lanes, avenues, sidewalks, alleys, bridges and public grounds upon which it may enter for the purposes herein authorized in as good condition as they were at the date of said entry.

Section 5. That said municipality, by reason of its government body may, upon the written demand of any person whose dwelling or place of business, located within said municipality, shall have been wired for electric service, require said grantee to extend its said electric distribution system so as to furnish electric energy



to said person, provided that said grantee shall not be required to extend said electric distribution system further than 150 feet for each 500 watts of connected load, and provided further that said person demanding such service shall enter into the customary written contract with said grantee for the purpose of electric energy for a period of not less than one year.

Section 6. That any person desiring to move any building or other thing, in, over, along or across any of the streets, lanes, avenues, sidewalks, alleys, bridges or public ground of said Municipality, whereby the poles, wires, conduits, or other fixtures of said grantee or their use, shall or may be interfered with, shall make written application therefor to said municipality, specifying in such application the building or thing to be moved, the proposed route to be followed and the date of such moving which shall be not less than five days from the time of presentation of said application. If said application shall be granted the Municipality shall give said Portage Mutual Electric Association notice thereof at least five (5) days prior to the date of said moving, and said Portage Mutual Electric Association shall thereupon, but at the expense of said applicant, temporarily remove such poles, wires, conduits, pipes, conductors or other fixtures as may be necessary to allow the passage of said building or other thing for a reasonable length of time not exceeding five (5) hours in any one day and between the hours of 8 o'clock A.M. and 3 o'clock P.M. provided however, that said Portage Mutual Electric Association shall not be required to remove any such poles, wires, conduits, pipes, conductors or other fixtures until said applicant shall have delivered to it a bond in form and with surety or sureties satisfactory to said grantee, or shall give satisfactory assurance to said grantee,



covering the entire cost of the removal and replacement of such poles, wires, conduits, pipes, conductors and other fixtures and any and all damage, liability, action or cause of action resulting therefrom.

Section 7. That if any section or portion of a Section of this Ordinance shall be declared null and void by any competent authority, the remaining portions hereof shall not be affected thereby.

Section 8. That all ordinances or resolutions or parts thereof heretofore adopted by said municipality in conflict with the terms hereof are hereby repealed.

Section 9. That this Ordinance shall take effect from and after its passage and approval, and consent thereto according to law, by the Inhabitants of the town of Portage Des Sioux, Missouri, acting by or thru their Board of Trustees.

Section 10. This franchise shall be null and void on and after five (5) years from date of passage thereof, if at said expiration of five (5) Years, there shall not be a high voltage or high power line installed furnishing such electric light, heat, and power service to said town.

ORDINANCE NO 10.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE INHABITANTS OF THE TOWN OF PORTAGE DES SIOUX, MISSOURI, ACTING BY OR THROUGH A BOARD OF TRUSTEES GRANTING TO T. L. LEONARD AND J.M. HAVIN, HEREIN CALLED THE PORTAGE MUTUAL ELECTRIC ASSOCIATION, THEIR SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNS, PERMISSION TO ERECT, INSTALL, CONSTRUCT, RECONSTRUCT, REPAIR, OWN, OPERATE, MAINTAIN, MANAGE AND CONTROL AND ELECTRIC LIGHT, HEAT AND POWER PLANT WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF SAID VILLAGE AND FOR AN ELECTRIC DISTRIBUTION SYSTEM CONSISTING OF POLES, WIRES, CONDUITS, PIPES, CONDUCTORS AND OTHER FITTINGS, IN, UNDER, OVER, ALONG AND ACROSS THE STREETS, LANES, AVENUES, SIDEWALKS, ALLEYS,



BRIDGES, AND PUBLIC GROUNDS OF SAID VILLAGE, FOR THE PURPOSE OF FURNISHING ELECTRICITY FOR LIGHT, HEAT AND POWER PURPOSES TO SAID VILLAGE AND ITS INHABITANTS FOR A PERIOD OF TWENTY YEARS FROM AND AFTER THE PASSAGE OF THIS ORDINANCE, ACCORDING TO LAW.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE INHABITANTS OF THE TOWN OF PORTAGE DES SIOUX, MISSOURI, ACTING BY OR THRU THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That there is hereby granted unto T.L. Leonard and J.M. Havin, their successors and assigns, herein called the Portage Mutual Electric Association, the right, permission, privilege and franchise for a period of Twenty (20) years from and after the taking effect of this ordinance, subject only to the laws of the State of Missouri as now in force or as may hereafter be in force, and to the conditions and limitations hereinafter contained to erect, install, construct, reconstruct, repair, own, operate, maintain, manage and control and electric light, heat and power plant and or an electric distribution system consisting of poles, wires, conduits, pipes, conductors and other fixtures, within the limits of said municipality, necessary, convenient or proper for the production transmission, distribution, and delivery of electricity for light, heat and power purposes to said municipality and its inhabitants.

Section 2. That said grantee, their successors and assigns is hereby granted the right-of-way in, under, over, along and across the streets, lanes, avenues, sidewalks, alleys, bridges and public grounds of said municipality for the purpose of erecting, installing, constructing, reconstructing, repairing, owning, operating, maintaining, managing and controlling said electric light, heat and power plant and said electric distribution system.

Section 3. That said grantee shall hold said Municipality free and harmless of and from any and all liability, damages, actions, and causes of action, caused by or through the neglect or mismanagement of the grantee in the erection, installation, construction, reconstruction, repair, operation, maintenance, management or control of said electric plant and distribution system.

Section 4. That said grantee shall not, during the erection, installation, construction, reconstruction, repairing, operation and maintenance of said plant or distribution system, unnecessarily impede public travel of the streets, lanes, avenues, sidewalks, alleys, bridges and public grounds of said Municipality, and shall leave all of said streets, lanes, avenues, sidewalks, alleys, bridges and public grounds upon which it may enter for the purposes herein authorized in as good condition as they were at the date of said entry.



Section 5. That said Municipality, by resolution of its governing body, may, upon the written demand of any person whose dwelling or place of business, located within said Municipality, shall have wired for service, require said grantee to extend its said electric distribution system so as to furnish electric energy to said person, provided that said grantee shall not be required to extend said electric distribution system further than 150 feet for each 500 watts of connected load, and provided further that said person demanding such service shall enter into the customary written contract with said grantee for the purchase of electric energy for a period of not less than one year.

Section 6. That any person desiring to move any building or other thing <sup>is</sup>, over, along or across any of the streets, lanes, avenues, sidewalks, alleys, bridges, or public grounds of said Municipality whereby the poles, wires, bridges or public grounds of said Municipality, whereby the poles, wires, conduits, or other fixtures of said grantee or their use, shall or may be interfered with, shall make written application therefor to said Municipality, specifying in such application, the building or thing to be moved, the proposed route to be followed, and the date for such moving, which shall not be less than five days from the presentation of said application. If said application shall be granted, the Municipality shall give said grantee notice thereof at least five (5) days prior to the date of said moving, and said grantee shall thereupon, but at the expense of said applicant, temporarily remove such poles, wires, conduits, pipes, conductors, or other fixtures as may be necessary to allow the passage of said building or other thing for a reasonable length of time not exceeding five (5) hours in any one day and between the hours of 8 A.M. and 3 o'clock P.M.; provided, however, that said grantee shall not be required to remove any such poles, wires, conduits, pipes, conductors or other fixtures until said applicant shall have delivered to it a bond in form and with surety or sureties satisfactory to said grantee, or shall give satisfactory assurance to said grantee, covering the entire cost of the removal and replacement of such poles, wires, conduits, pipes, conductors and other fixtures and any and all damage, liability, action or cause of action resulting therefrom.

Section 7. That if any section or any portion of a Section of this Ordinance shall be declared null and void by any competent authority, the remaining portions hereof shall not be effected thereby.

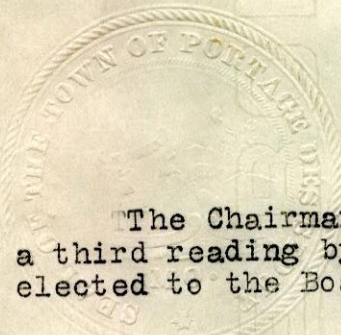

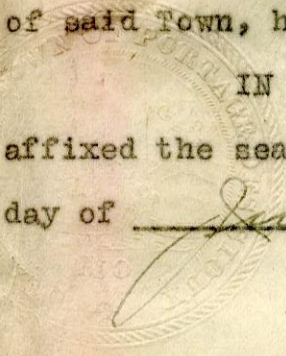

ORDINANCE NO. 13.

Section, 1

A bill providing against dumping of waste or rubbish or any obstruction on streets or in drainage ditches or sewers of the corporate limits or anything that may cause an obstruction of inlet of sewers: such as decaying vegetation, tin cans, ashes and ECT, is hereby declared a Misdemeanor.

Section, 2

That their shall be a fine of not less than \$3.00 nor more than \$15.00 for violations of this Ordinance.
