



Our athletic philosophy is the same as our educational philosophy, and that is to include, not exclude. We believe all student-athletes, if they so choose, should have the opportunity to compete at the intercollegiate level in the sport of their choice, just as they have the opportunity to select what particular field of study they will enter.

To accommodate our unprecedented growth and increasing number of athletic programs (28), Lindenwood is continuously upgrading current facilities and/or constructing new ones. Such is evident in Lindenwood's state-of-the-art Performance Arena (where basketball, wrestling and volleyball teams compete), and the recently installed artificial surface called "Astroplay" in our athletic stadium. The new surface is designed to simulate grass and limit injuries. Football, soccer and field hockey all compete on the new surface.

We hope this book gives you a glimpse of our outstanding athletic program, where character and sportsmanship are part of our mission.

At Lindenwood, we are committed to our students in the classroom and on the athletic field. It is that very commitment that sets Lindenwood

apart from other universities.

After a fourthplace finish in 1999, Lindenwood University finished second to Simon Fraser University in British

Columbia for the coveted 2000 Sears Directors' Cup. The Cup is given annually to the top NCAA

and NAIA athletic programs in the country.

"The fact is that we are the best NAIA program in the United States," said Dan Kratzer, Lindenwood's athletic director, regarding Simon Fraser's



Canadian base. "We want to stay as the top program in the United States. We strive for excellence in all sports, and we want to do better in a few areas."

Fifth-place national finishes in women's basket-ball, women's soccer and softball paced Lindenwood's second-place cup finish. The men's basketball team also made its first-ever appearance in the NAIA playoffs, and the men's volleyball team finished third nationally. Yet, men's volleyball is not recognized as a NAIA sport.

Kratzer said Lindenwood would not become content with its success in athletics, and that there is always room for improvement.

"I'd like to see football step up a notch and get men's soccer back in the playoffs," he said. "We'd also like to establish a solid women's field hockey program." Kratzer credits much of Lindenwood's success to President Dennis Spellmann. Spellmann is responsible for building Lindenwood's state-ofthe-art Performance Arena and laying down the new Astroplay surface on its Athletic Field.

"It's is like the old Field of Dreams line," said



Kratzer, commenting on Lindenwood's world-class facilities. "If you build it, they will come."


The expectations for the 2000-2001 fall, winter and spring seasons are high, but Kratzer believes all

Lindenwood's athletic programs will meet the challenge.


"The expectations step up each year," Kratzer said. "When one or two of our programs have done really well, it makes the other coaches and other athletes want to be contributors to that kind of success."

Football

After receiving their firstever national playoff berth in 1998, key injuries hindered the 1999 Lions, who finished 5-5. In an effort to return to championship



form, Coach Dan Kratzer and his staff added some much-needed depth in the off-season to



combine with the returning talent.

"We don't rebuild here at Lindenwood," said Kratzer. "We reload!"

Lions to watch this year include quarterback Mike Hofbauer, who is coming off a season-ending knee injury; punter Reggie Kratzer; linebacker Tim Mercer; center Steve Coning; and the Heart of America Athletic Conference (HAAC) Defensive Player of the Year, defensive lineman Joe McKinney. All five players are seniors.

Look for an attacking style defense and an air-itout offense from this year's Lions. It will be a wild ride.

Women's Soccer

The 1999 Lady Lions had an overall record of 20-4, won the Heart of America Athletic Conference, were ranked No. 4 in the country and advanced to the NAIA National Women's Soccer Tournament.

With the nucleus of last year's squad intact, HAAC Coach of the Year Kevin Kilcullin has reason to be keyed up. According to Kilcullin, anything short of a trip back to nationals is unacceptable.

Men's Soccer

Last year, the Lions finished the season as conference regular-season and post-season champions and advanced to the NAIA semi-finals in the Midwest Region Soccer Tournament. Those accomplishments leave expectations high for the 2000 Lions. Coach Carl Hutter and his squad have their sites set on building on 1999's 14-8 record.

LU has a wealth of talent returning and a strong freshman class coming in. Yet, look for senior forward/midfielder Jake Bleyenberg — the MVP of the HAAC, a first-team all-region and all-conference selection and honorable mention all-American — to put up some big numbers.



Bleyenberg finished


1999 with 10 goals and 16 assists.

According to Hutter, the pieces needed for a title run are intact; the Lions just need to put the puzzle together.

Cross Country

The men and women repeated as HAAC champs and advanced to the NAIA National Cross-

Country championships in 1999. The men finished 13th overall, and the women placed 18th. Both teams have talented runners returning, leaving coach Bart Gray excited about 2000's possibilities.



Women's Volleyball

Despite some disappointment in the postseason, Coach Dave Witter believes his squad can regroup and reload for the upcoming season. The 1999 Lady Lions finished 35-7, ranked third in the region, 18th in the country and in a three-way tie for the HAAC title. Last season's success will be tough to duplicate. Yet, Witter says he always wants to improve on the past year's accomplishments.

Performers to keep an eye on this season are junior middle blocker Lyn Schenk, junior setter Jill Plassmeyer, junior setter Kate Bostwick, senior defensive specialist Lori Helmsing and senior defensive specialist Molly Blume.




Tennis

The men's team won the HAAC tournament in last year's fall competition, while the women finished third. In the spring, the men finished sec-

ond in conference play and the women placed fourth. With the talent returning, both teams are primed for success.

Key returnees for the men include J.C. Beeson, Vincente Brochato and Brian Moran. Top returning players for the women include juniors Kara Dennett and Ali Huck, along with senior Jaemi Tiongson.





Wrestling

Coach Joe Parisi and his team have their goals set high for the upcoming season and believe they

will be contenders for the 2001 national title.

There are reasons for such optimism. The Lions return 125-pound sophomore and 2000 NAIA National Wrestling Tournament



champion Brant Bruner, 125-pound sophomore Josh Buchanan, 141-pound junior Tim Michel, 157-pound senior Benji Main, 174-pound senior John Venne and 184-pound junior Nate James. Bruner, Mickel, Venne, Main and James all are returning all-Americans.

Parisi says the Lions have trained like champions and are prepared for their national title chase. If you love wrestling, you don't want to miss this aggressive group in action.

Women's Basketball

The 1999-2000 Lady Lions were dominating, finishing as the conference regular-season champions and conference tournament champions and advancing to the NAIA National Tournament's Elite Eight. They also finished ranked ninth in the country and broke seven long-standing school records.

Those broken records included: most single-season wins (30-6), most points scored (2,389), most three-pointers (115), most free throws made (675), best overall team free-throw percentage (74 percent), most steals (380) and most blocked shots (169).

Replacing conference Player of the Year Jaime Bonney, HAAC all-conference forward Amy Chase and HAAC honorable mention selection

Donna Simon, all of whom were lost to graduation, will be difficult. Yet, Witter believes the cupboard is far from being empty.

He expects junior guard Katie Pizzardi, sophomore guard Julianne Van



Daniker and senior veteran guard Katie Cannon to fill the open voids of last year's standouts. Look for a faster, up-tempo game from the Lady Lions, led by their offense-minded guards.

Men's Basketball

It was an historic 1999-2000 season for the Lions. LU broke the school's 1977 single-season wins record (22) by finishing 23-14 and made its first-



ever appearance in the NAIA Division II National Tournament, not to mention its conference-second place finish. As for this year's expectations, Coach Dale Ribble would like to win 20 games and get back to the national tournament for an encore.

Key returnees from last year's memorable season include: senior guard Steve Medford and senior center R.J. Romani, along with late season standout sophomore guard Dustin Roberts.

Will LU have a shot at the HAAC title and a return trip to the national tournament this season? According to Ribble, they do, and these 2000-2001 Lions want to prove that last year was no fluke.

Indoor/Outdoor Track

The men's and women's track teams continue to reign supreme in conference competition and make national tournament appearances. LU's women's and men's indoor track teams repeated as conference champions, while the women placed seventh in the NAIA Indoor National Track and Field Championships and the men



placed ninth.

Outdoor results weren't much different, with the men bringing home the conference title and the women finishing second. In the NAIA Outdoor Track and Field Championships, the men finished tied for

eighth while the women placed ninth.

Look for the status quo out of both LU's indoor and outdoor teams this season under the guidance of coach Bart Gray.

Swimming and Diving

The Lady Lions finished the 2000 season strong.

LU placed eighth in the NAIA Swimming and Diving National Championships and will return senior Sarah Herholz and juniors Kelli Wind and Jessica Metcalf. Metcalf won the national championship in the onemeter and three-meter diving competitions and set a national record in the three-



meter dive (555.45). All three are all-Americans.

LU's men's team fell short of their lofty goals in 2000, but the return of sophomore Michael Ferguson and seniors Kyle Matlock and Ryan Teson will put the men's team back on the championship track.

Coach Craig Penrose said he'd like to see both teams break into the top four at nationals this year.

Softball

The Lady Lions softball team was electrifying during the 2000 season. They finished 34-12, won their third-straight regular-season and conference tournament title, won the regional championship, advanced to the NAIA National Softball Tournament and finished ranked fifth in the country.

LU was victorious in the first two rounds of the

16-team, double-elimination national tournament, defeating Georgian Court (N.J.) 3-0 and No. 4-seed University of Mary 4-2 to advance to the quarterfinals. However, the Lady Lions lost 7-5 to No. 1-ranked Simon Frazier and 4-3 to Azusa Pacific in an extra-inning thriller.

Following the conclusion of the national tournament, LU pitcher/first baseman Dawn Cameron was named to the all-tournament team. She also was a first-team all-conference/all-region selection and second-team all-American. Along




with Cameron, the Lady Lions will return
Michelle Patrico, a senior all-American outfielder. With much of last year's talented squad
returning, look for the Lady Lions to again be
electrifying during the 2001 season.

Baseball

After the Lions won the HAAC championship in 1999, injuries dampened a promising season in 2000, LU fin-

ished 18-25 overall and 9-15 in conference play. Yet, there were

many bright spots for the Lions, includ-



ing freshman pitchers Travis Bruns and Adam Jahnsen and senior third baseman Adam Shafer.

Bruns and Jahnsen received conference Pitchers of the Week honors during the regular season, and Shafer was named the conference Player of the Week. Bruns and Jahnsen will be expected to throw the "heat" to opposing batters next spring, and Shafer will be expected to supply the consistent "bat."

According to Coach Tom Broyles, a healthy group of Lions will be tough to reckon with this season.

Golf

The women's and men's golf teams had outstanding seasons in 2000. The Lady Lions won the conference tournament, while the men won the regional crown and both made trips to the NAIA national golf tournaments.



During the national tournament, the women finished 16th overall and the men finished 14th. This season, the men will return three allregion selections in iuniors Dan Emrick and Colin Hsu and sophomore Ryan Dunn. The women will lean heavily upon the play of sophomores Colette Giroux and Itzel Nieto, Giroux was an all-conference selection and Nieto was an all-American.

During the conference tournament, Emrick finished second after suffering a devastating sudden death playoff loss to break a three-way tie. Nieto won the women's conference tournament and Giroux finished third.

"We played some outstanding golf this past season and I expect both teams to improve on last year's marks this year," said Roger Ellis, LU's head women's and men's golf coach. "We're beginning to play some great golf here at LU."


Men's Volleyball

The men's volleyball team finished 20-8 in a three-way tie for second place in the conference, was ranked No. 3 in the country and made an appearance in the NAIA Men's Volleyball Tournament, all in the team's inaugural season. What will this year's squad do for an encore? According to newly hired Head Coach Ron Young (formerly the assistant coach), LU will try to build upon last season's success.

Coach Young will have plenty of talent to work with; the Lions return virtually every starter from

last season's nationally ranked squad. Two of those key returnees are senior setter Zach Young and sophomore opposite hitter Mike Diperro.

Zach and Diperro were both named to the Midwestern Intercollegiate



Volleyball Association's All-Conference Team. Expectations are high, and the Lions are looking forward to the challenge.

Bowling

Like LU's other new athletic programs, the men's and women's bowling teams experienced success in their first year. Yet, according to Coach Mike

Halwe the best is still to come.

"We used last season to lay our foundation and get some experience," Halwe said. "I believe we'll be much stronger this season."

The Lions were very young last season, but the youth has begun to mature. The




women's team will return sophomore anchor Kori Kuhlenschmidt and sophomore team captain Michelle Maddock. On the men's side, the Lions will return sophomore captain Mike Solovic. All are expected to be the glue of their teams.

"We'll have the talent to compete for tournament titles this season," Halwe said. "We're just anxious for the season to get started.

Field Hockey

This fall will mark the second season for field hockey at Lindenwood, and first-year Coach Jill Jokerst is looking to lay a solid foundation. "Lindenwood's athletic programs strive for success on and off of the field of play," Jokerst said. "We have a tradition to uphold and we will do our best to uphold it. I'm definite-



ly looking forward to the challenge. LU is a great place to be."

The Spirit of the Lions

The exciting atmosphere at Lindenwood University's sporting events can be attributed in no small part to the Lion Cheerleaders, Lion Line Dancers and Spirit Squad. The award-winning squads

pride themselves not only on entertaining Lindenwood's students and fans, but also the opposing team's students and fans.

However, don't let the bright smiles, swift feet and positive words of encouragement fool you. The cheerleaders, led by coach Kim Kitchen, and dancers, led by coach Alice Bloch, are a competi-



tive bunch. Both squads competed in national competitions across the country last year, and if their performances were any indication of what is to come this year, Lindenwood followers will have plenty to cheer about.
