Just a Degree?


Life at Lindenwood.



No. It's a personal tour of Lindenwood campus.








This musical portrays a slower-paced, less complicated time in America with a salute to the music of pre-World War I.























1990-1991

In January, America found itself engaged in its largest military action since the Vietnam War.

United States' General Norman Schwarzkopf lead the twenty-eight member U.N. force in the effort to free the country of Kuwait from Iraqi leader Saddam Hussein's control. The American people showed support for our soldiers and a high sense of patriotism. The high technology of today al-
