Fruit Pizza

- 1 pkg. Pillsbury refrigerator sugar cookie dough, thinly sliced (use about 1/2 pkg. for 10" pizza pan)
- 1 (8 oz.) pkg. cream cheese, softened 1 (4 1/2 oz.) frozen whipped dairy topping
- 1 pt. strawberries (or other berries such as blueberries, raspberries, etc.)
- 2 bananas, sliced
- 2 to 3 kiwis, sliced
- 1 (8 oz.) can pineapple chunks, drain and save juice

1/2 c. sugar 1 tbsp. cornstarch 2 tbsp. lemon juice 1/2 c. pineapple juice



Press cookie dough into pizza pan to make crust. Bake at 350 degrees for 10 to 12 minutes. Cool. Whip cheese and topping and spread over cooled crust. Overlap fruit in a ring for example: First ring strawberries, then pineapple, sliced kiwis, bananas and other berries as desired.

For Glaze: Boil the ingredients for one minute. Spoon over fruit, especially bananas.

Chill before serving. Makes one fruit pizza.



Ewing Chosen to Build Lindenwood's Women's Basketball Program

Lindenwood University-Belleville announced Tuesday that it has hired former MacMurray College coach Anne Ewing to bring its women's basketball program to life. Ewing, a native of the St. Louis area, said she plans to combine her experience as a college and high school coach with her ties to the St. Louis basketball community to build the Lindenwood Belleville program from scratch. The team is expected to hit the court for the first time this fall. "I'm very excited to have the opportunity to build a basketball program from the ground up," Ewing said. "It was a chance that I just couldn't pass up." Ewing said she stresses the fundamentals like maintaining a strong work ethic and a good attitude. She keeps things fresh with a run-and-gun style of play. "We're going to be very fast paced," Ewing said. "We're going to be pressing a lot on defense and looking to run on offense. We're going to be a lot of fun to watch." At MacMurray, Ewing recruited feverishly, doubling the size of her team's roster from 7 to 14 players, an experience she said will help her fill out a roster in Belleville. Prior to taking the helm of the MacMurray women's program, Ewing worked in St. Louis at the Kozeney and McCubbin law office as an attorney where she specialized in real estate law, bankruptcies, evictions and foreclosures. She also worked for five years as basketball coach at Ursuline Academy and Lutheran South High School in St. Louis where she helped young players prepare for the college ranks. Lindenwood Belleville Vice President and CAO Jerry Bladdick said he's excited to see Ewing at the helm. "She's not only going to put a team on the floor that is going to be fun for the fans to watch," Bladdick said. "She's going to build a program that students and the community can be proud of for years to come." In addition to her coaching duties, Ewing will serve as an academic advisor and

Area Women Helping Lindenwood Start its New Athletic Program

It's never easy being a trail blazer. But Lindenwood University-Belleville's first two female soccer players had a tougher road than they expected. Ready to play when they signed up for classes at the Belleville campus in 2009, juniors Allison Stuhlsatz and Allison Fenster were left without a team when coach Dan Hogan was unable to build a full roster on short notice. The launch of the squad, originally set for 2009, was pushed back to 2010, and the duo – Stuhlsatz a midfielder and forward from Freeburg High School and Fenster a defender from Belleville West – found themselves on the sidelines. "It was tough to have to tell them we weren't going to be able to put the team together as quickly as we originally thought we would," Hogan said. "Of course we were going to honor their scholarships, but they came here to play and they couldn't. I was really impressed with how they handled the situation." The women could have quit or transferred to another school. But, instead they took the opportunity to hone their skills. While they had no female teammates, "the Allies" as they are known on campus, became honorary members of the men's team. They practiced, trained and socialized with the male players. They even traveled with the men's team to all its games to feel like part of a team. "It was a disappointment not to have the team come together, but in the long run I think we both learned a lot from the time we have spent with the men's team," Stuhlsatz said. "I think it is really going to help us when we finally get on the field." Fenster said she was impressed how the men's team, also coached by Hogan, accepted the pair. "They really have looked out for us," Fenster said. "At first I was worried about getting hurt in practice because they're bigger than us. But playing against them in practice helped us learn to play the game faster and to think ahead about the next move we're trying to make." Hogan said recruiting is going well and the team is on pace to start practicing this summer and to start playing games that count in the fall. The team's newest recruit is midfielder and back Danni Sotnyk, who played soccer for Wesclin High School and SWIC. Sotnyk said, despite the fact that the Lindenwood University-Belleville women have never played a game, she expects the team to be an immediate success. "I am excited and looking forward to a winning season this year at Lindenwood," Sotnyk said. "Go Lynx!" Fenster said, after watching the men's team get off to a good start, she's excited about finally getting on the field soon in a real game. "I think it is going to really be something in 20 years or so to be able to say that we were the first women's soccer players at Lindenwood-Belleville," Fenster said.

Director of Athletics and Head Tennis Coach Scott Spinner said, "The new tennis courts will be a wonderful addition to the university. Our recruits are excited to have a new facility to kick-off our inaugural season next year." Aside from the new facility, recruits are also excited about the professional ball machine. The Shotmaker Deluxe from Sports Tutor is used at the Association of Tennis Professionals (ATP) training facility in Florida. The machine holds over 300 balls and can be programmed for a variety of different workouts. "The Shotmaker Deluxe will be an outstanding tool for our players to improve their game. The machine can actually generate shots of varying speed, elevation, spin, interval, and shot patterns," said Spinner. Coach Spinner is still shaping up the rosters for fall and is hoping the new courts will give the program a recruiting edge for players who are still making their college choice.
