CHICAGO, MAY 3-- (UP) -- SEN. A. B. (HAPPY) CHANDLER, BASEBALL'S NEW COMMISSIONER, SAID TODAY HE BELIEVED THAT NEGROES SHOULD HAVE A CHANCE "LIKE EVERYBODY ELSE" TO PLAY MAJOR LEAGUE BASEBALL.

"THE ARRANGEMENTS ARE YET TO BE WORKED OUT," HE SAID, "BUT I BELIEVE THAT THIS IS A FREE COUNTRY AND EVERYBODY SHOULD HAVE A CHANCE TO PLAY ITS FAVORITE PASTIME."

THE KENTUCKY SENATOR, WHO WAS NAMED TO BASEBALL'S HIGHEST POST ONLY NINE DAYS AGO, ARRIVED TODAY FROM ST. LOUIS, ACCOMPANIED BY HIS WIFE. HIS REMARKS WERE IN REPLY TO QUESTIONS ABOUT A RESOLUTION INTRODUCED IN CONGRESS WHICH WOULD AUTHORIZE THE SECRETARY OF COMMERCE TO INVESTIGATE ALLEGED RACIAL DISCRIMINATION IN THE MAJOR LEAGUES.

CHANDLER SAID HE DIDN'T KNOW ANYTHING ABOUT THE ALLEGED DISCRIMI-NATIONS, BUT THAT HE WAS SURE THERE WAS ROOM FOR COLORED BASEBALL PLAYERS IN THE BIG LEAGUES.

"THIS MATTER WILL TAKE A LOT OF GOOD THOUGHT," HE SAID, "BUT IN TIME IT'S BOUND TO WORK.

"NEGRO BASEBALL OFFICIALS AND PLAYERS DON'T KNOW EXACTLY WHAT THEY WANT AT PRESENT," CHANDLER SAID. "THEY MAY WANT TO PLAY IN THEIR OWN LEAGUES AND THEN MEET THE MAJOR LEAGUE CHAMPION IN A PLAY-OFF GAME. MANY NEGRO BASEBALL PLAYERS MAKE MORE MONEY PLAYING IN THEIR OWN LEAGUES THAN MAJOR LEAGUE PLAYERS DO.

"AT PRESENT, IT'S TOO INDEFINITE TO KNOW WHAT THE DESIRES ARE OF BOTH PARTIES. CONFERENCES MUST BE HELD. THERE ARE REASONABLE MEN IN BASEBALL AND THE WAYS AND MEANS OF BRINGING THIS ABOUT MUST BE WORKED OUT BY DISCUSSIONS BETWEEN MAJOR LEAGUE OWNERS AND NEGRO LEADERS."

CHANDLER SAID THAT HE HAD HOPED TO ASSUME HIS DUTIES AS COMMISSIONER JULY 1, BUT THAT IT MAY BE LATER BECAUSE OF SENATORIAL BUSINESS.

HE SAID HE PROBABLY WOULD MOVE THE COMMISSIONER'S OFFICE TO CINCINNATI.

"THE OFFICE FOLLOWS THE COMMISSIONER," HE SAID. "AND I BELIEVE THAT IT WILL BE IN CINCINNATI."
