THE CARDINALS have some 120 players signed with their six minor league clubs. Five of the clubs are in action now and one, Sarasota, will open its season in the Florida Rookie League about July 1.

There were around 140 players in training camp at St. Petersburg, Fla., and after the cutoffs they were sent to Jacksonville, Fla., in the Class AAA International League; Tulsa, Okla., in the Class AA Texas League; Raleigh, N. C., in the Class A Carolina League; Cedar Rapids, Ia., in the Class A Midwest League, and Rock Hill, S. C., in the Class A Western Carolinas League.

"We are very happy with the way our new minor league site operated," said Art Felzner, who has been in the Red Bird organization for over a quarter century and is an assistant in the minor league scouting department. "There were players in camp from 26 states and because of the facilities, we feel this year's training camp was the finest we've ever had."

TWO OF THE Cardinal minor league teams are managed by native St. Louisans—Grover Resinger at Jacksonville and Vern Rapp at Tulsa. A third St. Louisan, Fred Koenig, was to have managed Rock Hill, but decided to retire from baseball and now lives in Tulsa.

Ray Hathaway managed Raleigh, Ron Plaza is the pilot at Cedar Rapids, Sparky Anderson is the Rock Hill manager and veteran George Kissel is the Sarasota pilot. There are four St. Louisans—and that number is expected to increase, playing with the Cards' minor clubs.

These are outfielder Ted Savage at Jacksonville, outfielder Rogers Robinson, and pitcher Cliff Poitte and first baseman Nat Colbert at Cedar Rapids.

At Jacksonville, infielder-outfielder Ed Spiezio, recently cut by the Cards after a great training camp average, of Joliet, Ill., and pitcher Dennis Higgins of Jefferson City.

At Rock Hill, second baseman Jim Bane of Branson, Mo., outfielder Bob Bost of Evanston, Ill., third baseman Lenny Boyer of Alba, Mo., catcher Larry Snyder of Mason City, Ill., and pitcher Ken Winter of Carmi, Ill. At Cedar Rapids, pitcher John Meier of Cape Girardeau, pitcher Don Newton of Zanoni, Mo., and catcher Gary Stone of La Grange, Ill.

At Tulsa, pitcher Joe Hamende of Springfield, Ill. At Raleigh, first baseman-outfielder Mel Patton of Belleville.

(who was never a team member but a good friend to
all of them). Among others who participated but were
unable to attend were Rufus Burns, Carl Lindsey, Roy
Brown, and John (Bootsack) Bailey... Back in 1945, a
group of young teen-age boys who were playing "knock
Out" on a lot near Sixth Street where they lived, heard
a man ask them if they would like to learn to play base-
ball. They concurred and this began a team relation-
ship that lasted for ten years. Not only did he supply
them with balls and bats and unmeasurable hours of
his time and wisdom; but he gave them love, a feeling
for team spirit and good sportsmanship, a firm hand
but a warm heart to which they could pour out their
problems, as well as a simple code to live by: 1. Go
to Sunday School every Sunday. 2. Maintain passing
grades in school. 3. Never tell a lie. Did it work?
You bet! Those screwy teen-agers are now full
grown men in responsible positions, by and large
college trained or working towards it. As major
spokesman Lindell Oglesby put it: "Foster Calvert
came along 20 years too soon. Now the Poverty Pro-
gram is paying people now to do something that he
did for nothing." It was difficult for any of the usually
very verbal group to find exactly the right words to
say about a man who had done so much for them. It
must have been difficult for Mr. Calvert, too, when he
rose to receive gifts of an orchid, hope chest, and
check for his wife, Doris, (who had put up with them
all those years) and a big check for himself. It took
him a little time to find just the right words to thank
them; but find them he did and he expressed pride in
"his boys" who had developed into such fine young
men and especially because they had not been in jail.
He spoke of various ones, individually, and the parts
they played in making a winning team. He admonish-
ed those who had not married and praised those who
had and bit by bit each fellow must have relived a bit
of the past as colorful episodes of the team were re-
called. Even some of the Cavaliers, the female
cheering squad, were there like Thelma Morgan, Vi-
van Love, Tony Carpenter, and Freddie Smith. Cer-
tainly one of the wonderful things is the camaraderie
that still exists among the former Midgets Team
mates and their pride in the one member who made
the Major Leagues, Ted Savage. Even now, as in
the days when money was short (but somehow they
would find a way to buy shoes for some or a suit for
others or provide a little honeymoon trip for a young
couple just starting out), they stand together in the
good times as well as the bad. And, as they say,
many of them are where they are today because of a
man who was devoted to and interested in the welfare
of a group of boys -- and his name is Foster Calvert.

I TOLD YOU SO

You'll have to excuse me for my gloating this week, but what else can you expect of a fellow when he calls the turn of a story of three former players of the Mathews-Dickey key Knights in the Tandy League. It's all about these new stars on the horizon; Nathan Colbert, Ezell Carter and Frank Pickens. Remember these names.

Nathan Colbert, 19-year-old ex-Summer High star, could be the Houston Astros' first sacker this season. He will be off for spring training this week, determined to win a berth on the Astros. He is the most promising young ballplayer since Elston Howard.

In this column last fall, long before the St. Louis Cardinals lost Colbert in the baseball draft on November 28, I stated that he will be playing in the new stadium by 1967. It could be this year.

Ezell Carter was voted the most valuable player in the Tandy Leagues in 1964 by this writer. I predicted he would be in the minors the following year. Carter, a graduate of Soldan High, was signed by the Minnesota Twins on June 22, 1965. Did I hit it on the head?

Carter can play all nine positions well. Last season he played the infield in the minors. In the Tandy League he was a part time catcher and pitched in relief. He was shifted to different positions on many occasions. However, he played short stop most of the time.

Frank Pickens, a 375 hitter at Washburn University last season caught the eye of New York Mets scouts because of his defensive play.

My first look at Pickens was at Forest Park in 1961, when the Knights won the Khoury's Missouri Ill. championship by defeating the Kirkwood Leader 6-4 as Barry Shelton's two-out ninth inning single drove in the 2 inning runs. Frank played a sensational game at third base.

His sparkling play in the fourth inning saved two runs. His Tandy League record was limited to only a few games.

Hats off to the Mathews-Dickey Boys Club for developing three of

Those barber shop arguments and betting get more reporters in trouble than perhaps any other sport. It can be a cold day in January on a hot day in July. Time and again someone writes a letter or calls on the phone asking this player of that team the first to do this or that and before the ink is good and dry, there's telephone calls coming to this desk saying the story errs as this that player did thus or so years ago.

While standing on Taylor and Detroit, waiting for the lights to change at Saturday evening, two old time baseball fans walked up to me and one of them said:

"I'm betting this guy that Satchell Paige was a great pitcher 50 years ago. I saw him play up at the Chicago White Sox park 45 years ago at Negro league game. Tweed, that old man must be eighty now," I shot back and told him that he'll lose his bet, even if he would bet old Satch is even 70. However, the baseball fans and the press were that Paige is over 70 years old.

In 1960, his mother and ex-teams including "Cool Papa" Bell and Chick O'Neil said he's just 54 fit them.

During the depression days, Satchell was in his prime. In many record books he is credited with 250 shut outs and at least 25 no hitters. One sign poster on the park where he and his All Stars appeared reads: "Satchell Paige-World's greatest pitcher, guaranteed to strike out the first nine men or your money back."

Best Negro big league pitchers before Paige's day... Few played after Paige made his debut. They are: Rube Foster, Smokey Joe Williams, John Donaldson, Nip Williams, Dick Redding, Dave Brown, Joe Mendez, Bulliet Rogan, Walter Ball, Mincer Brown and Frank Wickware. These men ages are from 75 to 85 years.

The proof of the pudding is that Satch wasn't listed among Who's Who 50 years ago, he was a kid. Finally they both agreed to settle the bet after my half hour talk, that Satch is around 60. Oh, I forgot to tell you, it was a \$1,000 bet. For local baseball write to 4574

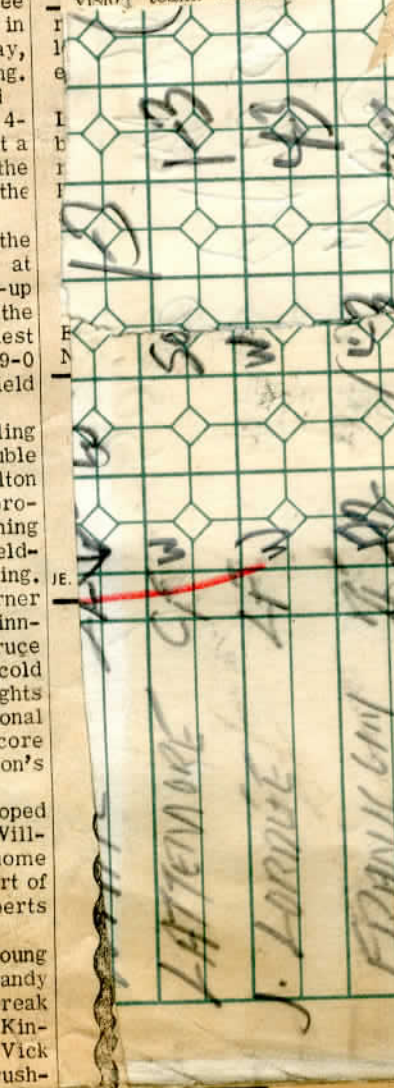
