The first faculty meeting of the year was held in Roemer Hall, room 225, Sept. 10, 1928. The Dean of the faculty presided.

After roll call, the Dean presented, in brief, the position which the Liberal Arts College holds in American Education today, together with some of the newer movements in education which are influencing this institution. Reference was made to the introduction of certain innovations in Lindenwood College which particularly affect the Freshmen, i.e. Orientation courses, personnel conferences, psychological testing, etc. It was suggested that a Freshman Advisory System would be arranged for within a short time.

The usual instructions for registration on the following two days were announced. The faculty was asked to suggest that students pursue some work in the Fine Arts, in addition to their regular Arts and Science courses.

Some discussion relative to the grading system in use in Lindenwood College was presented.

The faculty was asked to secure departmental stationary and class books from the offices.

A regular business meeting of the Faculty was held October 9, 1928 in room 225, Roemer Hall.

Dr. Roemer opened the meeting with prayer.

The minutes of the previous business meeting were read and approved.

Dr. Roemer requested the Secretary to read
the Standing Faculty Committees which had been appointed
previously by the President. (See insert).

Reports from the following committees were made:

Student Activities-Reported that the Point System, and the Schedule of regular meetings had been posted. Furthermore, that the budgets for the organizations sharing in the Student Activity Fee had been arranged for the year; and that the activities of all organizations had been arranged for the year.

Annual Board - On behalf of the Annual Board Dr. Gipson urged the Faculty to have new photographs made for the Annual. She reported that the organization of the work of the Annual Board was well started.

Y.W.C.A. - Miss Mary Terhune reported that x Faculty Advisorshad taken over the respective activities of the Y.W.C.A. and were co-operating with the efforts of the students.

Library - Dr. Stumberg called a meeting of this committee immediately after the Faculty session.

Program - Mr. Thomas reported that four program meetings for the year had been arranged for, namely, the 4th Tuesday in each of the following months: October, November, February and March.

Social - Miss Mortenson reported that the Social Committee had arranged to hold the social and program meetings in the Y.W.C.A. Room, for this year. The Social Committee requested the faculty to vote upon the following plan of defraying expenses of the social meetings: That annual dues for each faculty member be set at \$1.00 and that a charge of 25¢ be made for each guest brought to a social meeting.

The above plan was accepted unanimously by the Faculty.

The Faculty was invited to dine with Dr. and Mrs. Roemer on Friday evening, October 12, 1928, at 7:15 P.M. in the college dining room.

Dr. Gipson expressed great satisfaction for the manner in which the Faculty had co-operated in the opening of the college year.

Dr. Roemer presented the matter of increasing the Holiday session at Christmas. After considerable discussion the following action was taken by the Faculty: - That the Christmas Holiday begin December 14, 1928 at 4:00 P.M. and close January 3, 1929 at 10:00 A.M., provided the students will give two Saturdays - one in October and one in November - to make up the extra holidays.

After roll call the faculty adjourned.

A business meeting of the faculty was held on Tuesday, January 15,1929, in Room 225 Roemer Hall.

Dr.Gipson presided and made the following announcements:

1. That it was believed that a very good type of teaching was done in Lindenwood and that she appreciated all the efforts of the faculty in giving extra time to students.

2. That as regards examinations the following points ought to be noted:

a-that Freshmen ought to be told the purpose of examinations and ought to be given some idea as to how to prepare for them

b-that examinations ought not to be too long. or c-that a student who has done fair work in the term but who fails in the examination ought to be given a chance at a condition examination, aftershe has had some time in which to study for it.

d-that all students who are making I and F grades ought to be warned of thier status.

e-that all grades of I and F should be explained on the back of the grade card in an intelligent manner.

3That teachers ought to check up periodically upon the length of assignments. Each instructor needs to realize the fact that students have more then one or two course to prepare for.

4That sponsors of organizations that are planning entertainments in the near future should abandon any rehearsals for these entertainments from this time on until after examination period.

The meeting adjourned.
