


For Mark Hopper, it was his first event since he was elected Student Activities Chair of the Lindenwood Student Government. According to the senior, a good time was had by everybody who attended.


The Christmas Walk kicks off the holiday season for Lindenwood students and the community and is Lindenwood's way of celebrating the holidays since students go home for Christmas break.


The annual Christmas dance was held in beautifully decorated Sibley Hall. The dance featured a D.J. with videos and a light show.


# DANCE SQUAD SHAKES IT!!

This year's team beat Maryville College for the first time since 1976. The men ended their season on a positive note by beating Blackburn in their final game of the season.





The memories of my times at "lucky Lindywood" can never be repeated — but at least I will always have those memories and those friends.





