New Campus OneCard System

IT announces the launch of the new ID Card system, Transact Campus. Over five months, the project team installed the Transact Campus software, card access controls for residence halls, point-of-sale systems for food services, and re-carded faculty/staff/students. September marks the beginning of phase 2, including completing administrative building card access and preparing for the roll-out of Mobile Credentials! The project team will limit administrative building card access to a small group of employees at this stage. Further expansion of access will be considered at a later date.

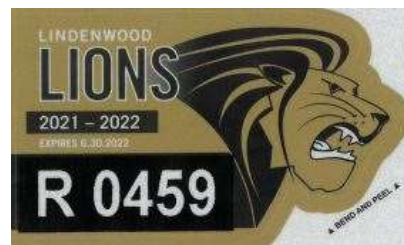
