Fort Osage March 6th. 1811.

Dr. Sir,

I have Recd. your Letter of the 24th. January and agreeably to your desire (and as I conceive to your interest) I have conditionally Sold all your Hogs and one Hundred Bushels of Corn to Mr. Cottle- Wells is now collecting the Hogs as fast as possible (which are very much Scattered Since the Indians arrived from their hunt) and as Soon as he has got them together I Shall conclude with Cottle, and inform you fully on the Subject- There will Remain about 200 bushels of Corn (more or less) which I fear cannot be Sold to advantage, as L^t. Brownson is to Send a Boat down for what Corn he wants, and at the Same time I expect to be able to Send you a full acc^t. of all your affairs here closed except as to the Corn.- At present in haste,
