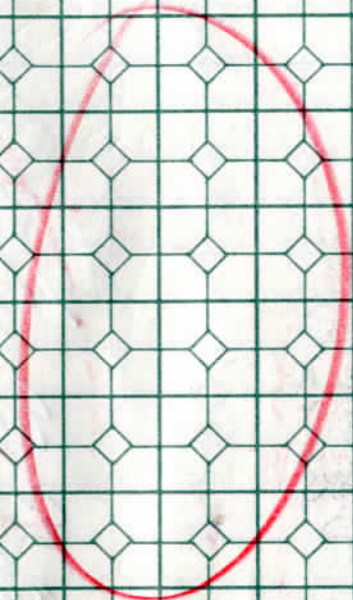

Ratican Funeral Services to Be Held Tomorrow

Funeral services for Harry Ratican, former soccer great, will be held Tuesday at 9 a.m. at All Souls Catholic Church with burial in Calvary Cemetery. Ratican, 70, died Saturday after a long illness.

Rated as the greatest soccer player ever to come out of the St. Louis area, Ratican was the top center forward in the country during the 1915-1922 era.

He began playing soccer as a youngster in the Parochial Soccer League in the early 1900s. His prowess brought him to the attention of the big leagues in St. Louis and, in 1912, he joined the Ben Millers for whom he played the next five years.

In 1916 he joined the Bethlehem (Pa.) Steel team and played there for four years before joining the famed Todd Shipyard club in Brooklyn in 1921. He was with the Todds for two years and played one year with Fall River, Mass. In the 1921-1922-1923 seasons he coached soccer at West Point.

Ratican suffered a paralytic stroke in 1967 and had been bed-ridden since.

He is survived by a brother, William, and a sister, Mrs. Margaret Becker. His wife died in 1948.

The body is at Baumann Undertakers, 2504 Woodson rd.

In separate meetings held with the Tandy League on April 29 and with the Hall Community League on May 15 a set of guidelines to govern our baseball participation during the season ahead were discussed and agreed and, therefore, are reported here. If you question any portion of the wording of either statement do not fail to mention it immediately or at the next joint meeting.

The Tandy League and the Hall Community League are in process of being merged into one complete whole. The mutual advantages of such a move will provide new leadership for the Tandy group, new prestige and organization to the Community group, and a new and better opportunity for recreation to many, many players. We are desirous of your cooperation in making this merger work.

PLAYING REGULATIONS - 1962

1. Each team shall be limited to seventeen (17) players. In addition a team may have three managers or coaches. All of the players, managers, and coaches are expected to be uniformed.
2. Official roster lists are due after June 10. Must be in before the game of June 15. Seven day rule for contract cards is always in effect.
3. A trade of players already registered by two teams may be made at any time during the season. A free agent who has not played with his team for three scheduled Sundays (consecutive) may be granted his release by the league at any time that he requests it.
4. Except in cases of team emergencies, no new player may be signed by any team after July 15 (All Star game on July 15, 1962)
5. Any player given a release by a team during the season is prohibited from being signed by any team of higher standing.

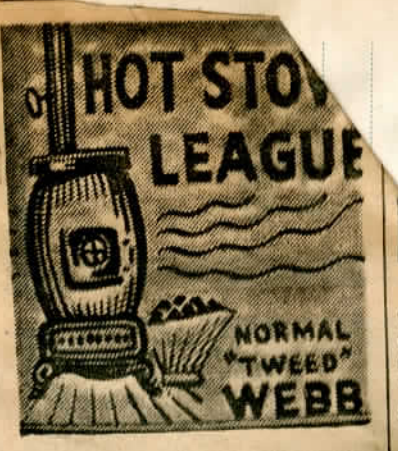
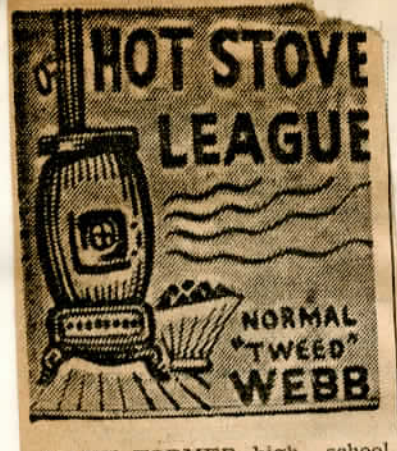

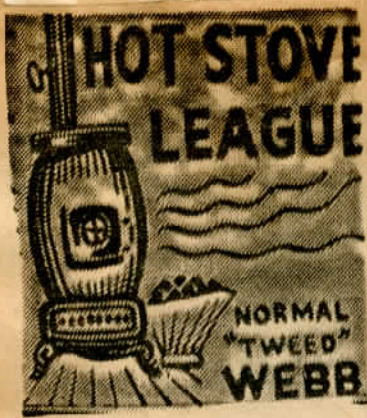
