
Dear Readers of the LINDEN LEAVES:

was typical of the Lions' season.


Although lacking in talent and depth in several areas, the Lions used hard work and hustle to come out on top in 1985.


Senior John Powers, Tim Mahoney, Juniors Sominic Condellire and goalie Dale Fiala helped keep things in order during the rough part early in the season.


Other senior players included Mike Baer, Mark Brewer, Marc Schwering, Brian Lange and Todd Herr.



Three thrilling victories over arch-rival Columbia highlighted the season. The upstart Lions also threw a scare into Division II power Siu Edwardsville before falling.



Basketball at Lindenwood College in 1910


