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The following Notes are the results of the Surveys made by G. C. Sibley in May June, and July 1827 to correct the old survey and straighten and complete the marking of, the Road to N. Mexico-They commence at the western boundary of the State of Missouri and end claims beyond a famous spring on the Road called "The Diamond of the Plains"-These notes are to be substituted for those in Mr. Brown's field Book, embraced within the Red ink brackets see Pages 10 60 30.
