## **Lindenwood College Faculty Meeting Minutes, 1932-1933**

Lindenwood College

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1932-33.

The first faculty meeting for the year 1932-33 was held in Roemer Hall, Room 225, September 12, 1932, at 7 P.M. Dr. Roemer opened the meeting with a word of welcome to the faculty. Dean Gipson presided during the following business session:

1. The roll was called and the faculty welcomed by the Dean.

2. Registration Instructions:

Time: 8:30 - 11:30; 1:30 - 4:00 on Tuesday and Wednesday.

Teaching Requirements: Students who plan to teach should be advised by the faculty to confer with Dr. Dewey, Miss Lear, Miss Hankins, and Dr. Schaper.

Bible Requirement: Students should be advised to register for only two hours of Bible in the Freshman year.

Program for two Semesters: Students should be urged to plan their course of study for the entire year during the September registration.

Music: The faculty are urged to suggest that students enroll for courses in music, public speaking, or art, along with the regular A.B. course. It was explained that a student can secure an A.B. degree and a diploma in music in four years, if the course is properly planned. Courses should be planned to leave Friday afternoon free for students who wish to attend the St. Louis Symphony Concerts.

A.B. Requirements:

Faculty are requested to consult carefully the A.B. requirements listed on page 32 of the catalogue, however, all of these requirements do not need to be met during the sophomore year.

Language Requirement: Students who are prepared to carry advanced language courses should be advised to consult some member of the language faculty.

Vocational Requirements: Students should be advised of the maximum number of vocational hours credited on the A.B. degree.


