AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR A MAJOR STOP SIGN ON LEFAIVRE STREET GOING SOUTH AT INTERSECTION OF COMMONFIELD STREET, AND ESTABLISHING TRAFFIC REGULATIONS THEREFOR, PENALTY FOR VIOLATION, EFFECTIVE WHEN.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF PORTAGE DES SIOUX ST. CHARLES COUNTY, MO., AS FOLLOWS;

SECTION 1 A MAJOR STOP SIGN ON LEFAIVRE STREET GOING SOUTH AT INTERSECTION OF COMMONFIELD STREET AND TRAFFIC REGULATIONS PERTAINING THERETO.

EFFECTIVE FROM AND AFTER THE PASSAGE OF THIS ORDINANCE: A MAJOR STOP SIGN SHALL BE ESTABLISHED ON LEFAIVRE STREET GOING SOUTH AT THE INTERSECTION OF COMMONFIELD STREET. ALL TRAFFIC COMING FROM THE NORTH ON LEFAIVRE STREET, SHALL, UPON REACHING COMMONFIELD STREET, COME TO A COMPLETE STOP UPON REACHING SAID SIGN.

SECTION 2 PENALTY FOR VIOLATION VIOLATION OF ANY PROVISION OF THIS ORDINANCE SHALL BE A MISDEMEANOR, PUNISHABLE BY A FINE OF 300 FOR FIRST OFFENSE, AND 600 FOR EACH OFFENSE THEREAFTER COMMITTED.

SECTION 3 EFFECTIVE WHEN THIS ORDINANCE SHALL BE IN FULL FORCE AND EFFECT, FROM AND AFTER ITS PASSAGE BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN AND SIGNED APPROVAL OF THE MAYOR

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE LEVY OF AN ANNUAL MOTOR VEHICLE
 LICENSE TAX, PRESCRIBING THE MANNER FOR COLLECTION THEREOF AND PRESCRIBING THE
 PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF PORTAGE DES SIOUX
 MO. ST. CHARLES COUNTY, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1

IT SHALL BE UNLAWFUL TO OPERATE ANY MOTOR DRIVEN VEHICLE OVER OR UPON
 ANY PUBLIC HIGHWAY, STREET, ALLEY OR THOROUGHFARE, WITHIN THE CITY LIMITS OF THE
 CITY OF PORTAGE DES SIOUX, UNLESS THE OWNER THEREOF SHALL HAVE FIRST PROCURED A
 LICENSE TO DO SO FROM THE CITY COLLECTOR AND HAS PAID AN ANNUAL MOTOR LICENSE TAX
 AS HEREINAFTER PROVIDED.

SECTION 2

THE OWNER OF ANY MOTOR DRIVEN VEHICLE DESIRING TO OPERATE THE SAME OVER
 OR UPON ANY PUBLIC HIGHWAY, STREET, ALLEY, AVENUE, OR THOROUGHFARE WITHIN THE CITY
 LIMITS OF PORTAGE DES SIOUX, MO., SHALL FIRST APPLY TO THE CITY COLLECTOR FOR A
 LICENSE, FEE AS FOLLOWS:

- (A) THAT THE ANNUAL LICENSE FEE FOR EACH VEHICLE DESIGNED TO BE USED
 FOR PRIVATE PASSENGER USE SHALL BE TWO DOLLARS AND FIFTY CENTS PER ANNUM.
 (B) THAT THE ANNUAL LICENSE FEE FOR EACH VEHICLE DESIGNED TO BE USED
 FOR COMMERCIAL OR DELIVERY PURPOSES OR A TRUCK, SHALL BE TWO DOLLARS AND FIFTY CENTS
 PER ANNUM.
 (C) THAT THE ANNUAL LICENSE FEE FOR EACH VEHICLE DESIGNED AS A
 MOTORCYCLE OR MOTOR PROPELLED BY CYCLE SHALL BE ONE DOLLAR AND FIFTY CENTS PER ANNUM

SECTION 3

ALL LICENSES FOR MOTOR PROPELLED VEHICLES AS HEREIN DESIGNATED SHALL BE
 ISSUED FOR A FULL CALENDAR YEAR IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE ANNUAL FEE'S HEREIN ~~XIXXX~~
 ABOVE SET FORTH.

THE TERM "FULL CALENDAR YEAR" SHALL BE CONSTRUED AS BEGINNING ON THE
 FIRST DAY OF JANUARY AND ENDING AS OF THE 31ST DAY OF DECEMBER FOLLOWING.

SECTION 4

IF APPLICATION FOR A MOTOR VEHICLE LICENSE IS MADE ON OR AFTER THE 1ST DAY OF JULY IN ANY YEAR, SUCH LICENSE MAY BE ISSUED UPON PAYMENT OF ONE HALF OF THE FULL ANNUAL LICENSE FEE HEREINABOVE PRESCRIBED.

SECTION 5 THE OWNER OF ANY MOTOR VEHICLE SHALL APPLY FOR LICENSE FOR SAME FOR ANY CURRENT YEAR BY MARCH 15TH, AFTER WHICH THERE SHALL BE A PENALTY IMPOSED, SUCH PENALTY TO BE 50% OF THE ANNUAL FEE OF THAT TYPE VEHICLE FOR WHICH APPLICATION IS BEING MADE.

SECTION 6

IN THE EVENT A LICENSE STICKER ISSUED IN CONFORMITY HEREWITH HAS BEEN LOST OR DESTROYED A DUPLICATE THERE OF SHALL BE FURNISHED UPON APPLICATION THEREOF TO THE CITY COLLECTOR AND THE PAYMENT OF THE SUM OF FIFTY CENTS, AND ON PROPER PROOF OF THE LOSS OR DESTRUCTION OF THE ORIGINAL LICENSE STICKER.

SECTION 7

AT THE TIME APPLICATION IS MADE FOR A MOTOR PROPELLED VEHICLE LICENSE AS HEREIN PROVIDED, THE APPLICANT SHALL EXHIBIT TO THE CITY COLLECTOR A RECEIPT FOR PERSONAL TAXES LEVIED BY THE CITY OF PORTAGE DESSOUX FOR THE CURRENT FISCAL YEAR; NO APPLICATION FOR A MOTOR VEHICLE LICENSE WILL BE RECEIVED AND NO LICENSE FOR A MOTOR VEHICLE SHALL BE ISSUED UNLESS THE TERMS OF THIS SECTION ARE COMPLIED WITH.

SECTION 8

ALL LICENSES STICKERS ISSUED IN PURSUANCE OF THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ORDINANCE SHALL AT ALL TIMES BE DISPLAYED IN A CONSPICUOUS PLACE UPON OR NEAR THE FRONT OF THE VEHICLE FOR WHICH THE LICENSE STICKER WAS ISSUED.

SECTION 9

THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ORDINANCE SHALL NOT APPLY TO A MOTOR VEHICLE OWNED BY A NON-RESIDENT OF THIS CITY, UNLESS SUCH MOTOR VEHICLE SHALL REMAIN IN THE CITY THIRTY DAYS (30) OR MORE.

SECTION 10

EVERY PERSON OR PERSONS, FIRM, PARTNERSHIP, OR CORPORATION VIOLATING THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ORDINANCE SHALL BE DEEMED GUILTY OF A MISDEMEANOR AND UPON CONVICTION THEREOF SHALL BE PUNISHED BY A FINE OF NOT LESS THAT FIVE (\$5.00) DOLLARS OR MORE THAT ONE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$100.00).

SECTION 11

ALL ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT WITH THIS ORDINANCES ~~SHALL~~ BE REPEALED

SECTION 12

THIS ORDINANCE SHALL TAKE EFFECT FROM AND AFTER ITS PASSAGE AND APPROVAL BY THE MAYOR.
