- The **Missouri Colleges Fund, Inc.** held their Board of Directors meeting at Drury University (September 23rd); new board member Michael Shonrock joined the meeting 'virtually' from St. Charles. The Fund raises over \$1 million annually from private business/etc. distributed to member colleges/universities.
- The **Honors College** had a meet and greet for parents, Honors Panel members and Michael Shonrock at the Family Day event. The Honors

College is also working with Academic Services and Admissions on Honors articulation agreement with St. Charles Community College.

- Belleville students, faculty, and staff participated in a **Moment of Remembrance** on 9/11/2015. Participants paid their respects to the Firehouse in Belleville where they viewed a steel column from the fallen World Trade Center.
- The **School of Accelerated Degree Programs** offers 22 degree programs. The average quarterly enrollment in 2014-2015 was 2,156 students per quarter in Missouri and Illinois combined. They currently have 22 fulltime faculty in Missouri and 8 fulltime faculty in Illinois.
- Most crime labs will now only hire criminalists who possess science degrees and backgrounds in criminal justice. The Lindenwood St. Charles campus offers one of the only Chemistry Degrees with a Forensics Emphasis in the area.
- Belleville's "See Something, say something" is an ongoing initiative designed to encourage individuals to actively participate in the quality of their environment. The program is currently being integrated as part of the LUL 101 courses, residential hall trainings, as well as in print, digital media and social media.

- Since spring of 2015, Lindenwood University has hosted 56 Panamanian students in the **Bilingual Panama Program**. This program administered by the Department of Education in Panama, is for students to study English as a Second Language (ESL) and participate in leadership seminars.
- Lindenwood University will receive up to 10 students from **Seijoh University-Japan** for the Spring MBA II 2015 term. Students will study English as a Second Language (ESL) and audit some business classes as they live on campus and become familiar with American culture.
- U.S. News and World Report's recently ranked, Lindenwood 108th among regional universities in the 12-state Midwest region. In previous years, Lindenwood was listed as "rank not published." Lindenwood was ranked 82nd, in the Midwest region, among "best colleges for veterans."
