The J. Scheidegger Center for the Arts opened in the fall of 2008 with two soldout performances by the legendary Liza Minnelli and has been entertaining the St. Louis region ever since. After going dark for 18 months during the pandemic, the Scheidegger Center reopened for the 2021-2022 season to record crowds for great artists such as funk and soul band Tower of Power, jazz master Branford Marsalis, and ventriloquist and impressionist Terry Fator!

Located on the campus of Lindenwood University in St. Charles, Mo., the Scheidegger Center presents high-quality, professional entertainment in an intimate setting, boasting a 1,175-seat theater with a Broadway-style stage, a 200-seat black box theater, and a large art gallery. For 15 years, the Scheidegger Center has provided cultural enrichment to the community with national theater tours, classical and popular music concerts, world-renowned dance, comedy, and celebrity entertainers, as well as hosting student productions by the theatre, dance, and music programs of Lindenwood University.

THE SPINNERS

FRIDAY, OCTOBER 6 8 P.M.

Timeless in a way few other acts are today, the Spinners are one of the most iconic and enduring groups in R&B history. The group came to define the smooth sound of "Philly Soul," channeling the highs and lows of romance and heartbreak into a catalog of classic hits, beloved across generations — including smash singles like, "I'll Be Around," "Could It Be I'm Falling In Love," "Then Came You," "The Rubberband Man," and "Working My Way Back to You."

With a legacy spanning over six decades, six Grammy nominations, 18 Platinum and Gold albums, and selling millions of records worldwide,

the Spinners never have lost their universal appeal. In 2021, the Spinners returned with their first all-new original album titled "Round the Block and Back Again," and they were inducted into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame in 2023. The Spinners kick off the Scheidegger Center's 2023-24 season!

The Queen's Cartoonists perform music from cartoons! Projections of animated films — pulled from over 100 years of animation from around the world — will dazzle the audience, while the band re-creates original soundtracks note-for-note or writes its own fresh compositions to modern pieces, perfectly synchronized to the films. The band matches the energy of the

cartoons, leading the audience through a world of virtuosic musicianship, multiinstrumental mayhem, and comedy.

Watch your favorite classic cartoon characters interact with the musicians on stage and expect the unexpected from the "golden age of animation," cult classic cartoons, and modern animated films.



JACK FROST: SNOW KIDDING!

Veteran New York-based variety performer and physical comedian David Engel has delighted audiences since 1989 with his special blend of theatrical clown and slapstick antics. Engel has enjoyed a varied career performing Shakespeare, avant-garde, contemporary drama, spectacle theatre, and Restoration comedy — and has over 30 commercial, film, and television credits. His work is nonviolent and aims to incite curiosity, empathy, social-courage, and empower today's increasingly distractible youth.

In Jack Frost: Snow Kidding!, Engel brings to life the worldfamous, winter sprite and drums up holiday cheer in this engaging variety show that features slapstick antics, cartoonlike sound effects, bubble play, musical bell chimes. adept magic, and eye-popping puppetry. With audience participation, occasional flurries, and a minor indoor snowstorm, this holiday show will delight audiences of all ages. BIG BAD VOODOO DADDY: WILD AND SWINGIN' HOLIDAY PARTY THURSDAY, DECEMBER 14 | 8 P.M.

A Scheidegger Center holiday tradition! Get in the *swing* of the season with Big Bad Voodoo Daddy's swing revival take on your favorite holiday songs like "Jingle Bells," "Mr. Heatmiser," and "Run Rudolph Run," and jam along to BBVD original holiday music.

Famously named after an autograph by blues guitar legend Albert Collins. Big Bad Voodoo Daddy is synonymous with the contemporary swing revival movement. They renewed interest in big-band music and helped popularize swing dancing since the 1990s. Together for over 30 years, Big Bad Voodoo Daddy has played sold-out concerts across the world, sold millions of records, and has had their music appear in hundreds of movies and television shows. Their sound — a medley of jump blues, jazz, and swing — is unmistakable, and the band spreads holiday spirit each year with its annual holiday concert tour.

DIANE SCHUUR AT 70:

AN EVENING OF SONGS AND STORIES

FRIDAY, FEBRUARY 23 | 8 P.M.

Long regarded as one of contemporary jazz's leading vocalists, Diane Schuur is as eclectic as she is brilliant. She was blind from birth but was gifted with perfect pitch and three-and-a-half-octave vocal range. Nicknamed "Deedles" as a child, she grew up surrounded by the world of jazz and initially taught herself piano by ear, later receiving formal piano training.

The two-time Grammy Award winner (with three additional nominations) has a distinguished recording career spanning over three decades and has explored almost every corner of the American musical landscape. Schuur's musical collaborations include the Count Basie Orchestra, B.B. King, Ray Charles, and José Feliciano, among countless others. Her voice is bold and expressive, simultaneously romantic and mischievous, radiating soulful passion.




Bruce Hornsby first rose to national prominence with The Way It Is, his 1986 Grammy-winning debut album with the Range. The title track became a No. 1 hit song in 1987, while Tupac Shakur's timeless song "Changes" builds on "The Way It Is" and set the stage for subsequent versions of the track. Hornsby was a part-time member of the Grateful Dead from 1990 to 1992, performing over 100 concerts in America and Europe. The threetime Grammy Award winner (and 13-time nominee) has sold over 11 million records worldwide and also has solidified his status as a highly sought-after collaborator. Hornsby has appeared on over 100 records. including releases with Bob Dylan, Bonnie Raitt, Don Henley, Stevie Nicks, Branford Marsalis, Ricky Skaggs, Bob Seger, Chaka Khan, Bon Iver, Brandon Flowers, Sting, Mavis Staples, Willie Nelson, and more.

Founded in New York City in 2008, yMusic believes in presenting excellent, emotionally communicative music, regardless of style or idiom. Their virtuosic execution and unique configuration (string trio, clarinet, trumpet, and flute with vocals) has attracted the attention of high-profile collaborators from Paul Simon to Bill T. Jones to Ben Folds — and inspired original works by some of today's foremost composers, including Nico Muhly, Missy Mazzoli, and Andrew Norman.

Aptly described as "a ragtag collection of hippies, bohemians, and musicians of no fixed ambition," the Ozark

Mountain Daredevils always have been indefinable in terms of music genres: producing sounds of country-rock and electric bluegrass all on the same record, writing lyrics both whimsical and poetic, and singing harmonies that would send shivers up your spine.

Founded in Springfield, Missouri, in 1971, the band initially called themselves the Family Tree before finally settling on the catchy moniker of Cosmic Corncob & His Amazing Ozark Mountain Daredevils — The Ozark Mountain Daredevils, for short. The band has released eight

studio albums (in addition to live and compilation albums) and hit singles "If You Wanna Get to Heaven" in 1974 and "Jackie Blue" (which reached No. 3 on the Billboard Hot 100) in 1975. These local favorites perform throughout North America and Europe and continue to grow and maintain a loyal fan base throughout the world and back home.

- Tickets may be purchased online 24 hours a day, seven days a week at LUBoxOffice.com.
- The Box Office will open two hours prior to curtain and remain open until the end of intermission. For shows without an intermission, the Box Office will remain open through the first 30 minutes of the show.
- The Box Office accepts MasterCard, Visa, American Express, Discover, cash, checks,* and gift certificates. *Checks are only accepted when ordering in person.
- Refunds and exchanges are not permitted except in the case of event cancellation. Applicable refunds are for the face value of the ticket only and do not include any relevant fees.
- If you are unable to attend an event, you can return your ticket as a donation. Your donation will be a tax-deductible gift for the face value of the ticket! You can return as a donation at the Box Office or at LUBoxOffice.com (using the "return ticket without refund" option on the Your Orders page). Please contact us if you have questions.
- All patrons (including children) are required to have their own ticket for ticketed events and should occupy the seat indicated on their ticket.

THEATER

- Smoking is not permitted on the Lindenwood University campus, including in or around the J. Scheidegger Center for the Arts.
- Parking at the Scheidegger Center is free. Accessible parking is located on the east and west sides of the building.
- Concessions, including beer and wine, will be available at professional touring shows in the lobby during the pre-show hour as well as through intermission. Only beverages in a container with a lid will be allowed in the theater.
- The Scheidegger Center has a secure cloak room, located in the lobby near the Box Office. Free coat check is available for all patrons at touring series events when relevant weather conditions arise.
- Assistive listening devices are available at the cloak room window and the Box Office. A driver's license may be held until the return of the device.
- Children ages five and up are welcome to attend performances at the Scheidegger. If you have questions about the content of a performance and the appropriateness for younger audiences, please call 636-949-4433.
- As a courtesy to fellow theater patrons and the performers, late arrivals will be seated at the discretion of management at an appropriate point in the performance.
- For most performances, the use of recording devices and flash photography is prohibited. Camera policies vary by event and are determined solely at the discretion of the show's performers. Some performers welcome audiences to use mobile devices to share their experiences on social media. Mobile devices should be silenced prior to the start of the performance. When permitted by the performers, we encourage patrons to share their experiences with us on social media but we ask guests to wait until after the show or during intermission to avoid disturbing other audience members.
