

MISSION & HISTORY

MISSION:

To culturally enrich the St. Louis Metropolitan Area through the arts while providing an environment for the fine and performing arts students of Lindenwood University to develop through the implementation of an integrative liberal arts curriculum.

HISTORY:

Lindenwood's J. Scheidegger Center for the Arts opened in the fall of 2008 with two sold-out performances by legendary star Liza Minnelli and has been entertaining the St. Louis region ever since. With such names gracing the stage of the 1,200-seat Bezemes Family Theater as Hal Holbrook, Ed Asner, Debby Boone, Marvin Hamlisch, and Debbie Reynolds, as well as national tours of CATS, Jesus Christ Superstar, Legally Blonde, Annie, and the Russian National Ballet, the J. Scheidegger Center for the arts provides an unparalleled experience in the arts and entertainment.

Home to Lindenwood University's School of Fine and Performing Arts, the J. Scheidegger Center for the Arts features regular performances and exhibits by students in the theatre, dance, art, fashion, technical theatre, and music departments. Venues include the Broadway-style Bezemes Family Theater, the Emerson Black Box Theater, and the Boyle Family Gallery. Also included are two dance studios, a costume shop, the Charter Communications High-Definition Television Studio, several piano studios and private music rooms, separate choral and orchestra halls, and many other amenities for the students and community.

PROGRAMS OFFERED:

Programs available to the St. Louis Metropolitan Area include the Bezemes Family Theater Main Stage Season, University Theatre Department productions, music and dance concerts, art exhibits, and fashion shows.

Degrees are offered in a variety of areas of interest within the fine and performing arts and are available to both undergraduate and graduate students.

For the 2011-2012 academic year, over \$660,000 in scholarship aid was awarded to fine and performing arts majors.

CHOREOGRAPHER BIOS:

Kari Ann Davis is currently in her first year serving as adjunct faculty in dance for both the Belleville and St. Charles campuses. Kari Ann received her BA in dance and her MA in teaching from Lindenwood University and is certified to teach dance in the K-12 setting. Between her undergrad and graduate studies, Kari Ann spent two years dancing with the Modern America Dance Company, where she had the opportunity to work with nationally and internationally acclaimed choreographers. She also performed and taught creative dance to elementary students as part of MADCO's outreach program. In addition to performing, Kari Ann has modeled for St. Louis Bride Magazine and choreographed for local universities, industrial flash mobs, and television commercials.

Rainy Demerson is a life-long dancer and has studied dance in Indonesia, Cuba, Brazil, and Senegal. She graduated from the World Arts and Cultures Department at UCLA with a concentration in dance, and holds an MA in dance education from New York University. As an educator, she has worked with hundreds of at-risk youth and spearheaded an Intercultural Dance program in Brooklyn. As a choreographer and producer, she has presented her work in the city of St. Louis, in Senegal, and in New York City.

Tracy Dupre is currently part of the adjunct dance faculty at Lindenwood University, tap dance coordinator at the Center Of Creative Arts (COCA) and owner of Brookstone Video. Tracy has earned a B.A. in Video Production from UMSL and an MA in mass communications with an emphasis in digital media from Lindenwood University, In addition, she teaches master classes at local dance studios and choreographs for corporate events and dance companies. She is a member of International Tap Dance Association (ITA), Wedding & Event Videographers Association (WEVA), and the St. Louis Videographers Association (SLVA). She trained at Performing Arts Centre, was a member of the Dance Co. of St. Charles and from there went to Stephens College studying Dance and Video Production. She has taught at the American College Dance Festival (ACDF), and her chareography has won national titles and awards. She has choreographed for the Bob Costas Benefit, St. Louis Bilikens, St. Louis Panera Bread Company, and for a Bobby McFerrin concert. In 2009, Tracy was interviewed by Dancer Magazine regarding the "tap scene" in St. Louis. She has danced in the Cotton Bowl Parade and attends national tap dance festivals around the country, where she has studied under Jason Samuels Smith, Diane Walker, Arthur Duncan, Bril Barrett, Lane Alexander, Diane Walker, Brenda Bufalino, Acia Gray, Savion Glover, Sam Weber, Henry Le Tang, Van Porter, and others.

WeiWei Fu is originally from Shanghai, China, where she studied traditional Chinese dance and acrobatics from the age of 12 to 17. After graduation, WeiWei came to Branson, Missouri, as a performer with the New Shanghai Circus and worked her way up from dancer to choreographer to stage manager. She then decided to further her education and came to Lindenwood University, where she received a Bachelor of Arts in dance. While still an undergraduate, WeiWei spent five months touring as a dancer with Lehrer Dance Company (based in Buffalo, NY). Some of WeiWei's awards include a third place scholarship to the Shanghai Dance Academy, second place at the International Brotherhood of Magicians Convention in Kansas City, a staff assistantship at the 2008 American Dance Festival at Duke University, and a gold medal at the 2003 International Acrobatic Competition in Paris, France.

Sam McReynolds is a sophomore at Lindenwood University and a candidate for the BFA in Dance. Sam has been dancing since the age of 4 and has won numerous dance awards both locally and nationally, including "Mr. Primetime St. Louis 2009" and first runner up for Dance Masters "Mr. Dance St. Louis 2011." Sam has also danced back-up for Far East Movement in the Party Rock Tour 2010 at the Pageant. Although Sam is known for his technical versatility, his true passion is choreography.

Michael Mizerany is the Associate Artistic Director for the San Diego-based Malashock Dance and teaches advanced modern dance at The Malashock Dance School. Michael studied dance at Southern Illinois University at Edwardsville and then joined The Modern America Dance Company (MAD/CO) in 1986. After three seasons with MAD/CO, Michael relocated to Los Angeles to join Loretta Livingston & Dancers and, in 1996, Michael joined the internationally renowned Bella Lewitzky Dance Company for its final season of touring. He has also served as a guest artist with such companies as Yorke Dance Project, Francisco Martinez Dance Theater, and Los Angeles Chamber Ballet. Michael has been

nominated a record seven times for the Lester Horton Dance Award for Outstanding Achievement in Performance, winning the prestigious award in 1995 and 1996 for his solos *Tin Soldier* and *Bump in the Road*, respectively. Additionally, Michael was nominated for a Regional Emmy Award for his portrayal of the misogynistic antagonist in John Malashock's dance film *The Soul Of Saturday Night*. He has danced in venues across the nation, including the Orange County Center for the Performing Arts, Lincoln Center in New York City, and the Kennedy Center in Washington, DC. Michael has choreographed extensively, and his works are in the repertory of such companies as MAD/CO, San Diego Civic Dance Company, Michigan Dance Collective, Visionary Dance Theatre, and Malashock Dance. Most recently, his male duets, *Far From Eden* and *Let Me Into Your Skin*, premiered at Diversionary Theater's Dance/Theater event to much critical acclaim. This past August, he was associate producer and choreographer for the San Diego production of *Altar Boyz*.

Kylie O'Brien is a senior at Lindenwood University and a candidate for a BFA in dance. Kylie focused on performing during her freshman year but found she had an interest in choreography during the first term of her sophomore year. As a junior, her choreography was chosen to be adjudicated at the American College Dance Festival in Springfield, Missouri. In addition to her work at Lindenwood, Kylie has taught master classes and choreographed for local studios, high school show choirs, and nationally ranked high school dance teams.

Rafael Quintas will be graduating this December with a BA in dance and mass communications. Rafael has been a part of every dance concert since his freshman year and has choreographed seven pieces for Lindenwood concerts. His very first piece, "Grounded Flight," was chosen to be performed and adjudicated at the American College Dance Festival. During his sophomore year, Rafael was asked to choreograph for the St. Louis National Dance Week Celebration at Union Station. In 2011, one of Rafael's winter concert pieces was chosen to be performed at the St. Louis Dancing in the Street Festival, and this year one of his senior project pieces was chosen not only for performance at the festival but was also selected to be part of a television promo. After graduation, Rafael will be moving to Los Angeles to start his professional journey in dance.

Janet Strzelec is an Associate Professor at Lindenwood University where she serves as Chair for the Department of Dance and as Artistic Director for the Lindenwood University Dance Ensemble. She holds a Bachelor of Science in dance, with a minor in music, and a Master of Fine Arts in theatre with an emphasis in directing/choreographing musical theatre. "Miss Jan" has trained in St. Louis, Chicago, and New York and has worked professionally as a dancer/singer/actress, choreographer, director, and stage manager. However, her biggest source of professional pride is her many years of teaching dance and experiencing the accomplishments of her students.

Anthony "Redd" Williams is a St. Louis native who brings cutting edge movement and choreography to the world of hip hop dance. He has performed with Lady Gaga, Beyonce, Jennifer Lopez, Adidas, Mariah Carey, and Corbin Bleu--to name a few. Redd has choreographed for Nelly, Starbucks Coffee, and P Diddy and has appeared in countless music videos, commercials, and live television performances. He is currently working for COCA here in St. Louis, where he serves as artistic director of its Hip Hop Dance Company. Redd has traveled all over the world teaching hip hop dance to thousands of students and is so excited to be back home in St. Louis sharing his knowledge and aifts and bringing a new life to the hip hop community.

Tricia Zweier is an educator, choreographer, and performer with a cross-disciplinary interest in dance and kinesiology. After earning a Master of Science in kinesiology and a Master of Fine Arts in dance from the University of North Carolina at Greensboro, she relocated to Missouri and is in her second year as an Assistant Professor of Dance teaching mostly contemporary and jazz techniques, dance history, dance and technology, and dance kinesiology. Tricia has also taught as an adjunct lecturer of dance history at Wake Forest University and of dance appreciation at UNC-Greensboro. While working on a Bachelor of Science in biology at The Richard Stockton College of New Jersey, she danced as an apprentice with the Atlantic City Ballet (formerly Atlantic Contemporary Ballet Theatre), then toured internationally in the cruise line industry as a dancer and dance captain. Tricia's modern dance performance credits include the works of Hanya Holm, Merce Cunningham, and Martha Graham. She has also had the pleasure of working with more contemporary artists, including Sean Curran and Mark Dendy. Tricia has been commissioned to teach master classes in New Jersey and Pennsylvania and recently completed a residency as a guest artist for The Center for Contemporary Dance Pre-professional Student Intensive in Orlando, Florida.
