Vanessa VanParijs of Holland, a freshmen center for Lady Lions Basketball, was named Player of the Year for the 1990-91 Women's Show-Me Collegiate All-Conference Teams. Vanessa led the conference with a .620 field goal percentage, ranking her eighth in the nation at the end of the season. She was second in scoring (17.5 ave.) and second in rebounding. Vanessa established a career high with 30 points scored against Maryville and McMurray, in two consecutive nights of play. She was chosen District 16 Player of the Week for the week ending February 23 and was selected for the First Team of the SMCC All-Conference Teams and earned honors as an Academic All-Conference athlete.

Other members of the Lady Lions who made their marks on this year's record-breaking season include: Angie Warren, who was named to First Team All-Conference; and Daphne Hozee of Belgium, who received honorable mention and honors as an Academic All-Conference Athlete. Jamie Hensley of Florence, Ala., and Denise White of Hillsboro, Mo., were also honored as Academic All-Conference Athletes. Overall, the Lady Lions achieved their first-ever District 16 seed, and were ranked eleventh in the nation for team defense. **WAY TO GROWL!!**

In men's basketball, Clint Bolser of Richmond, Ind., a freshmen for the Lions, was named First Team All-Conference and Academic All-Conference. Clint led his team in scoring (17.2 ave.) and established a school record by sinking 85.1% of all his free throws. Jody Scott of Little Rock, Ark., was named Second Team All-Conference and was second in team scoring. Derek Garvin of St. Louis, and Scott Henke of Montgomery City, Mo., were both honored as Academic All-Conference athletes. **CONGRATULATIONS LIONS!**
