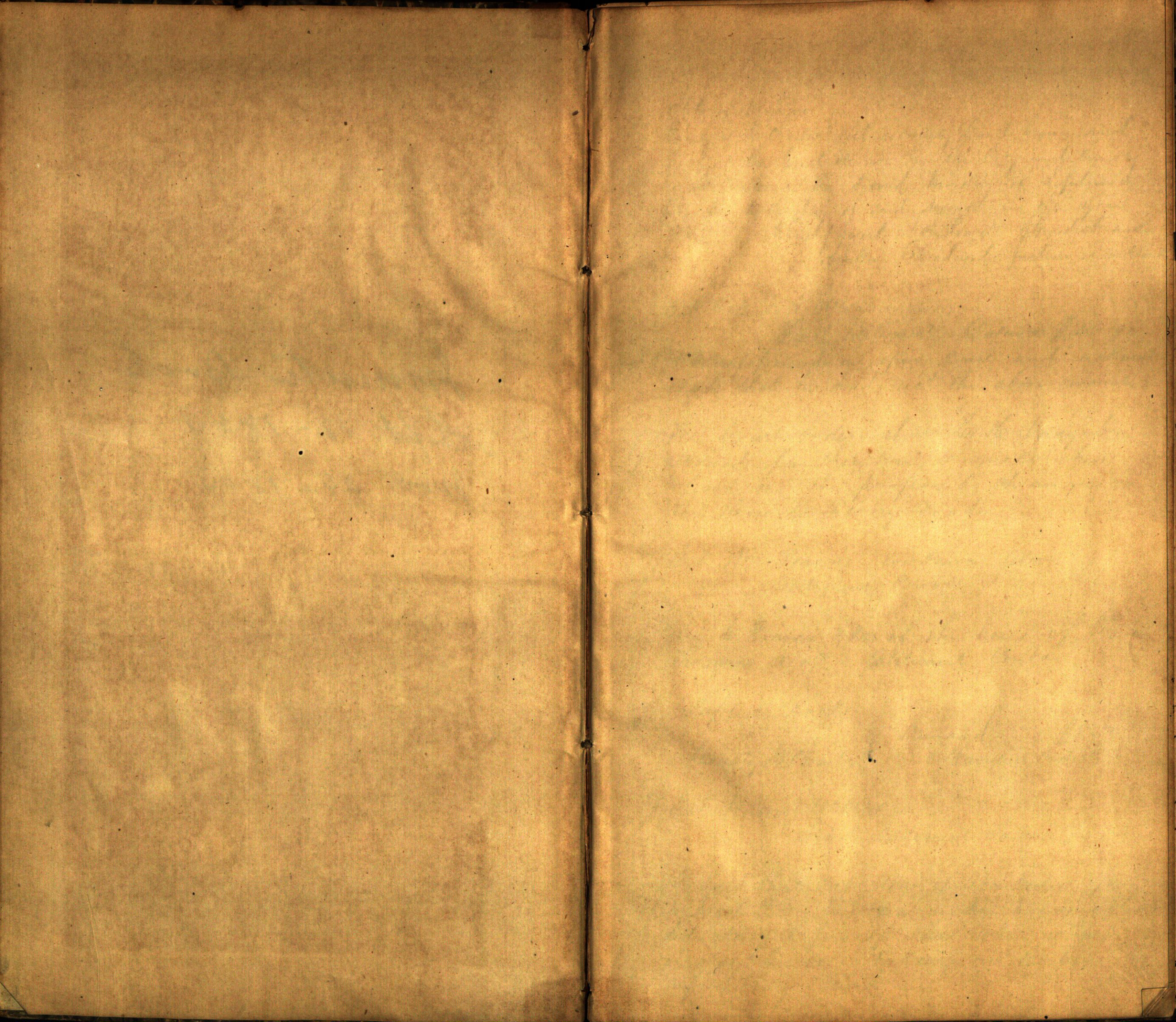

It appearing to the satisfaction of the Court that a Bridge is necessary across Spencers Branch where the Fall River Road crosses the same it is ordered that the same be built at the County expense upon the plan and of the Materials as follows viz.

First Two Stone abutments twenty six feet apart one on the East bank fifteen feet by three feet at the base and to taper to fourteen feet by two at the top to be sunk one foot below the bed of the Creek and to be nine feet high.

Second There will be two wing walls to be built at right angles from the abutment and to be sunk on a level with the abutment to run back six feet at the base and run back to sixteen feet on the top to be three feet thick at the base and two at the top.

Third The other abutment to be built on the west bank in the same manner as the first.

Fourth Two Caps one to be placed on each abutment each Cap fourteen feet long twelve by fourteen inches square and to be bolted down to the abutment with iron bolts three feet long two bolts in each Cap.

Fifth Five String pieces each twenty eight feet long twelve by six inches square to be placed on the Caps as first and to be sunk in the caps six inches with a dovetail so as to prevent them from raising by high water to be supported by a beam fourteen feet long ten inches by four to pass through under their center and resting in the lower ends of two King posts which will be twelve feet long ten by eight inches square where they pass down on the outside of the string piece leaving four inches shoulder on the string piece, standing perpendicular

Sixth Four braces thirteen feet long four inches by eight to be placed on the ends of the string pieces and let in with two inch tenants and let in the King posts with two inch tenants four feet from the string piece

Seventh One Collar beam sixteen feet long six inches square placed on the top of the King posts and to be braced from the King posts with braces four feet long four inches square

Eighth Four posts three feet long one to be placed on each corner on which post will rest the hand railing four inches square

Ninth Three Hummock and Crutch four feet of plank two and a half inches thick thirteen feet long and not more than ten inches in breadth to be laid as flooring for sand bridge to be bound on the ends with timbers twenty eight feet long six by four inches to be placed on the ends as binders, and fastened with three bolts in each binder to the string pieces the bolts to be nineteen inches long and half an inch in thickness

and lime mortar, and the wing walls to be capped with timbers six inches by twelve and to be filled with earth between the walls to a level with the top.

First Two Stone abutments 16 feet long at the bottom 14 feet long at the top 3 feet thick at the bottom and battered on the inside to two feet in thickness at the top the abutments to be 10 feet high.

Second Four wing walls 10 feet high six feet long 18 inches thick

Third Two Caps 16 feet long 8 inches thick and fourteen inches wide to be laid on the top of the abutments.

Fourth Seven string pieces 19 feet long 12 by 8 inches square to be laid on the Caps at equal distances

Fifth Four bolts with anchors to be built in the abutments to pass through the ends of the outer string pieces and through the floor of the bridge and binders and fastened with inch taps and screws the bolts to be of inch iron 5 feet long the anchors 2 feet deep

Sixth Two binders secured as above stated with bolts, to be 19 feet long 6 by 10 inches

Seventh The Bridge to be floored with 2 inch flooring

Eighth Two one-inch bolts to pass through the outer string pieces floor and binders in the center of the string pieces to be fastened with inch taps

Ninth Four Posts to be let on the ends of the string pieces 8 inches square extending 3 feet above the floor (~~of the bridge~~) to receive the round rails

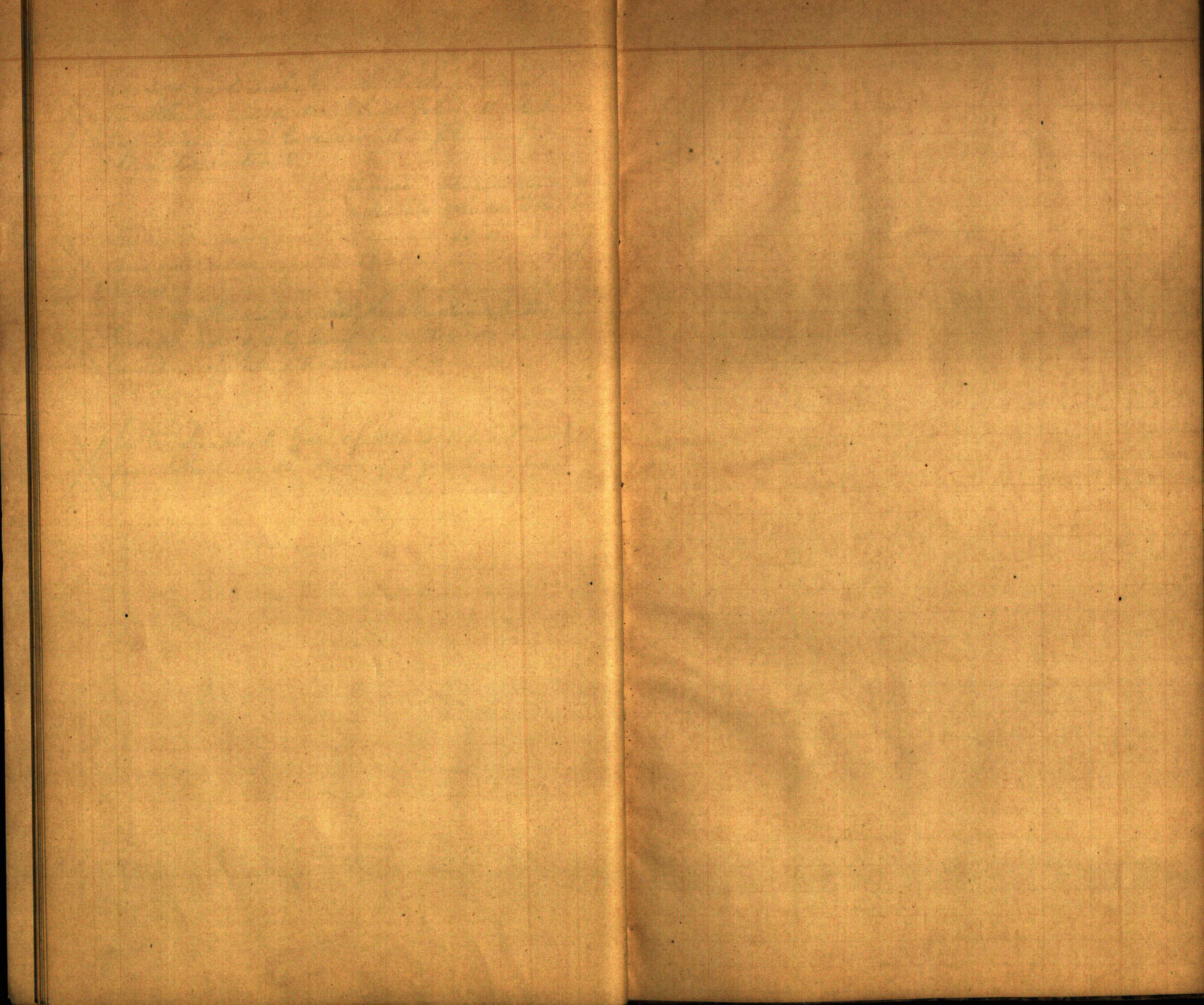
