The UCAP list includes actuarial programs that maintain course coverage for at least two actuarial exams and have approved courses for at least one Validation by Educational Experience (VEE) topic.

A wide variety of services are provided but our students feel that they need more options and better coverage for alternative medical issues. An urgent care facility could allow for increasing credentialed staff and could provide more comprehensive and broad coverage beyond undergraduate residents to graduate students, commuters and likewise.
- Lindenwood University Criminal Justice faculty members, Dr.
 Pernell Witherspoon (St. Charles campus) and Dr. Andrea Boyles
 (Belleville campus), were invited participants at the annual
 conference of the St. Louis Association of Community

- **David Miller**, our first year Water Polo coach, won the 2015 Collegiate Water Polo Association (CWPA) Men's Division I title.
- The 4th annual **Pink the Rink** weekend for the Lindenwood Women's Ice Hockey team was held on November 6 and 7. The series featured two games against pre-season conference favorite Syracuse. Lindenwood lost Friday 3-1, but played to a 1-1 tie on Saturday. The team expects to raise over \$2,800 for Gateway to Hope, a local non-profit designed to secure comprehensive care and provide basic financial assistance for individuals in need that are diagnosed with, or at high risk for developing breast cancer.
- The Lindenwood **Field Hockey** team closed out the Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC) Tournament with its third victory over Newberry, solidifying a third place finish in the conference.
- Number 17-ranked Lindenwood Wrestling Team opened the 2015-2016 season red-hot after placing 14 wrestlers in the Central Missouri Open. <u>David Hamil</u>, <u>Batchka Zulkhuu</u>, <u>Dillon Archer</u>, and <u>Daniel Swan</u> won their weight divisions.
- Belleville Men's Soccer has advanced to the American Midwest Conference Tournament Championship.
- November 17, Lindenwood St. Charles Campus **Panhellenic Council** (which represents our sororities) handed out cookies to faculty members as an appreciation for all they do.
- Monday, December 7, members of the Staff Council will serve residential students participating in the Late Night Breakfast. This biannual tradition kicks off finals week and features fun activities including a dance party, waffle eating contest and prizes for the best pajamas.
- Lindenwood University St. Charles hosted the 11th Annual Missouri Undergraduate Psychology Conference (MUPC) November 6-7. There were over 250 attendees from 8 different

states and 30 different institutions of higher learning. President Michael Shonrock gave his welcoming remarks on Saturday morning November 7.

- Lindenwood University Belleville celebrated **International Week** November 15-22, with a flag hanging ceremony of the newly represented countries on campus.
- The **Eastern College Athletic Conference** (ECAC) announced the year-end awards for the ECAC Division II Field Hockey League, as voted by the league's head coaches. Lindenwood University collected seven, the most All-Conference nominations of any league school.
- Online English and Math Placement Testing for our incoming students will be piloted this spring; when students sign up for an Enrollment Day, they will be able to take their placement exams in advance and come to campus ready to meet with their advisor and choose their classes.
- Synchronized Skating started the new season with two first place finishes November 7-8. The Lady Lions earned the top spot at the Ice Skating Institute (ISI) Fall Fling in Kansas City, Missouri on Saturday and followed it with another top performance at the Best of the Midwest U.S. Figure Skating event in St. Joseph, Missouri on Sunday.
