DIRECTOR'S NOTES

Les Liaisons Dangereuses, was first published in French in 1782 as a series of letters. It was almost immediately translated into German and then English. The English translation was entitled Dangerous Connections, or Letters collected in a Society and published for the Instruction of other Societies. Choderlos de Laclos' series of letters outlines a story of seduction, betrayal, and revenge amidst the decadent era of the French aristocracy immediately preceding the French Revolution. Unfolding before us is a complex weave of psychological games being perpetrated by wonderfully articulate and compelling characters. Their actions are both entertaining and appalling. In this world, the two are rarely mutually exclusive. You will be transported to a culturally prosperous and lush period where magnificent clothing, rich architecture, and beautiful music elegantly create a façade that masks a world of deception, lies, and narcissism – perchance a metaphor for the theatre. A society in which hypocrisy is just as readily denounced as practiced. It is a seductive world wherein the blatant coexistence of the sacred and the profane compels us and, perhaps, repels us simultaneously. These words - these letters - these scenes -so artfully pieced together in Mr. Hampton's play give us a peek into one of the most hedonistic eras in history and, in hindsight, perhaps serve to instruct.
