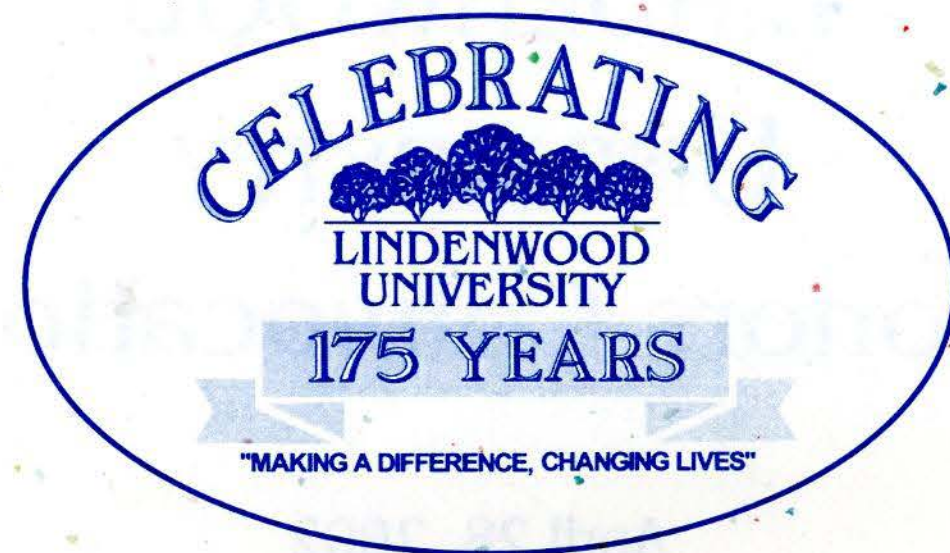

Lindenwood's approach to education has been characterized as "holistic," teaching not only the intellectual side, but helping also to develop a person socially, physically and spiritually.

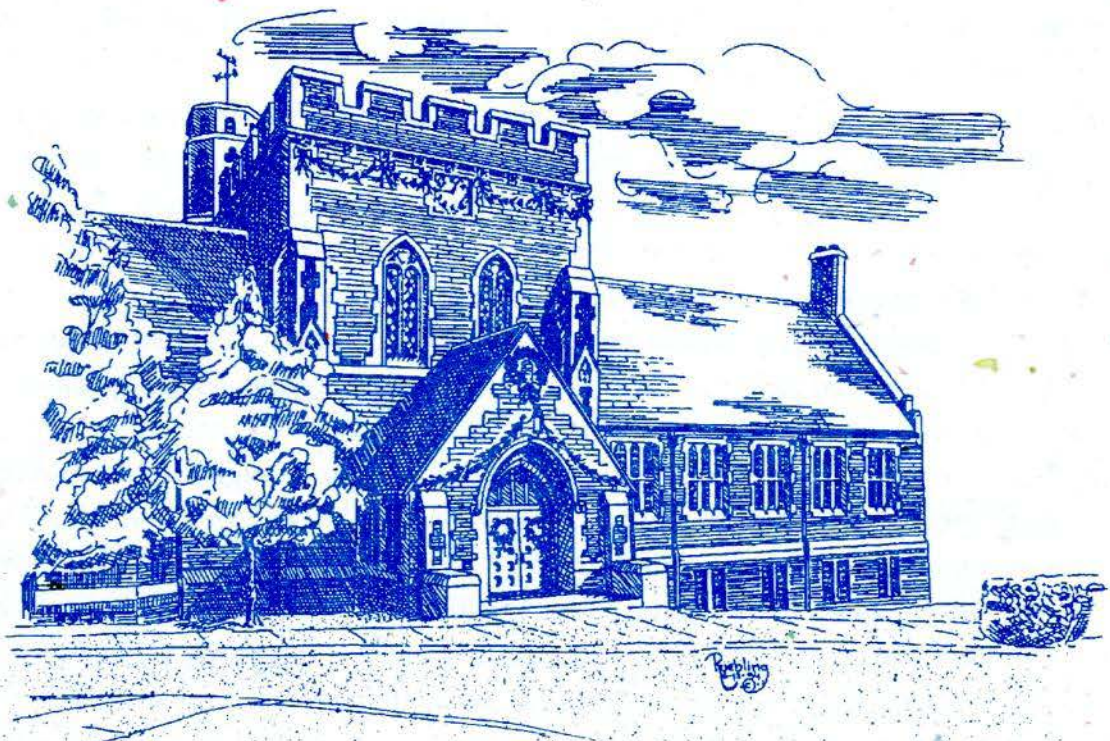
