
LINDENWOOD UNIVERSITY'S DANCE PROGRAM PRESENTS

CHOREOGRAPHER BIOGRAPHIES

Colby Danner is a sophomore Marketing major with a minor in Dance. He has choreographed for several musicals, but this is his first experience choreographing in the style of contemporary dance. He would like to thank all of the dancers, and creative team for their hard work and assistance throughout this process.

Kelsey DeRousse is a senior at Lindenwood University, pursuing a BA in Dance with a minor in Psychology. Prior to attending Lindenwood, she studied dance and exercise science at Missouri Valley College, where she danced and choreographed for the competitive dance team. Before college, Kelsey sang in choir and choreographed musicals for her high school in her home town of DeSoto, Missouri. Her dance training includes contemporary, ballet, jazz, tap, hip hop and musical theatre. This is Kelsey's first time choreographing for a Lindenwood dance concert.

Sydney Gibbs is in her second year of pursuing a Bachelor of Arts degree at Lindenwood University. Her training started at a ballet conservatory, Ballet Arts Center, in Farmington, Missouri when she was four years old. She continued studying all styles up until her graduation of high school. Sydney was also a performer with the Young Peoples Performance Arts Theatre in their bi-annual Nutcracker productions and Merry Christmas Show productions. She also spent all four years of her high school career on the State winning Knightline Dance Team. Sydney has also had the opportunity to perform in the musical productions of "Bring it On!" and "Beauty and the Beast" with the Center of Creative Arts (COCA). Sydney has been given performance opportunities at her time here at Lindenwood through University Dance Department Concerts and American College Dance Association adjudicated concerts. Sydney's choreography credits include "Unsound" from the 2017 Fall Informal Concert at Lindenwood.

Michelle Hughes, raised in Saint Louis, MO, was introduced to dancing through her high school's dance team. As she fell in love with the art, Michelle started her training at Ms. Bridget's Conservatoire of Dance, where

she trained in ballet, jazz and hip hop. She developed a fondness for jazz and hip hop because of the adrenaline that these forms provided. Wanting to pursue a career from her passion, she decided to further her training in dance at the collegiate level. She is now a Junior at Lindenwood University getting her BA in Dance and intends to pursue a career in Dance Therapy.

Armani Johnson, of Minneapolis, Minnesota is currently a double major in Dance and Spanish. He is also involved in competitive cheerleading and the student ambassador program. Armani's training and passion for dance began as a young boy participating in majorette/jazz with his school's traveling marching band (2006-2012). He has also done various theatre work at E. E. Bass Cultural Center in Greenville, Mississippi (2007-2011). While there, he met hip hop Choreographer Brianne Connelly, with whom he took private lessons. This is Armani's first opportunity to choreograph for a Lindenwood University production. Armani would, most importantly, love to express his greatest appreciation to Lindenwood for all their guidance, support and inspiration.

Previously, Kellyn danced with Mrs. Tina Stemmler learning tap, ballet, jazz, and lyrical dance. She also taught the younger children and was able to have a hand in choreographing pieces for recitals, not only for the students, but also for her and her duet partner. She hopes to continue onward in dance and see where this path takes her.


