## SCHWAB NAMED DEAN OF COLLEGE LIFE

Allen M. Schwab, Ph.D., of Hamilton, NY, a faculty member at Colgate University, has been appointed Dean of College Life and associate professor of English at the Lindenwood College.

A 1964 graduate of the University of Illinois, he holds an M.A. degree from the University of Washington and a Ph.D. degree from Tufts University. Dr. Schwab has served on the Colgate faculty since 1973, teaching for the Interdisciplinary Division and the Department of Music. From 1974-81, he served as Dean of Residential Life and Assistant Dean of Students at Colgate.

Prior to his Colgate positions, he served as a visiting assistant professor of English at Northwestern University, as an instructor in English at Kendall College, as a teaching fellow at the Experimental College of Tufts University and as a teaching assistant in English at the University of Washington. From 1978-82, he served as a lecturer and staff consultant at several institutions, including Oberlin College, Ithaca College, the State University of New York at Binghamton, Cornell University, Delaware County Community College and Northwestern University.

Since 1976, Dr. Schwab has published 31 articles on the descriptive analysis of more than 90 works performed by the Colgate University Symphony Orchestra. He also has drafted and edited policy documents, catalog and handbook copy and student affairs materials. He has served as coeditor of "Vox Facultatis," a chapter newsletter of the AAUP, and compiled a 200-page text, RESIDENCE STAFF HANDBOOK, for Colgate University.

Dr. Schwab and his wife, Phyllis, have a son, 5. He will assume the position July 1, replacing Ginny Grady who has been serving as interim Dean of Students.

## SCHOLARSHIPS FOR EDUCATORS STILL REMAIN

Lindenwood has a few tuition scholarships and housing stipends still left for educators of the blind and visually handicapped. They can be applied to a certification program to be held this summer.

Scheduled courses include "Braille - Reading & Writing," "The Blind Child with Additional Disabilities," "Orientation & Mobility for Visually-Impaired Children," "Methods and Materials for Teaching the Visually Impaired" and "Conservation and Use of Limited Vision." The two-hour courses will be offered June 13-July 14. Each five-week course can be applied to a Master's in Education degree with an emphasis in teaching the blind and visually impaired.

Course instruction will be provided by faculty members, registered professionals and representatives of the Missouri School for the Blind and the St. Louis Society for the Blind. For further information on the availability of scholarships and stipends, contact the Education Department.

## CERAMICS WORKSHOP FOR TEACHERS SET

A four-week workshop in ceramics for teachers and beginning students will be held July 6-August 2 at the FAB.
