- President Michael Shonrock has announced that **Dr. Michael Mason** is assuming the role of **Chaplain** on the Lindenwood University St. Charles campus. He will also assume the Butler Religion Chair, a position that was endowed at the university in 1917.
- Mrs. Grace Harmon was surprised Saturday by the Women's Basketball team, which presented her with a thank-you gift and many hugs to show their appreciation for her donations to the program.



- The John W. Hammond Institute for Free Entrepreneurship has received the first installment under the grant agreement with the Charles Koch Foundation. The **\$197,000** will allow the Hammond Institute to expand its mission of fostering free enterprise through market oriented approaches to economic and social issues. The grant has allowed the institute to employ Ms. Carol Felzien as Director of Administration. A Criminology Research Center has been established, headed by Dr. Jeanie Thies. We will also be hosting approximately 200 college students this spring who will be taking part in the Students for Liberty regional conference.
- The **Office of the President** and the **Development Office** have reached 100% participation in the Doors to the Future Campaign.
- The **Duree Center for Entrepreneurship** has received **\$40,000** from the Economic Development Center of St. Charles County. This contribution will allow the Duree Center to continue to offer the entrepreneurship program, "Who Owns the Ice House" to residents of St. Charles County.
- Lindenwood University's **MFA in Writing Program** has been ranked eighth in the nation by Nonprofit Colleges Online among online master's programs in English and creative writing. A release by the organization states the rankings were of accredited nonprofit

colleges and universities with objectively lower than average tuition costs. The ranking was based on the programs' affordability.

- The next gathering of the *Leadership Like No Other* program will be February 16-17. The groups will center on a small group learning process called Peer Consultation.
- The Lindenwood **Gymnastics** team won a tri-meet at Illinois State in Normal, Ill. The Lady Lions defeated Ball State, their first win in program history over a member of the Mid-American Conference. Lindenwood also topped conference rival Illinois State to move to 3-0 against Midwest Independent Conference (MIC) opponents this year.

The \$1,000 grant is annually renewable, provided a 2.5 GPA or higher is maintained. The incentive also includes an additional benefit for recipients to complete a tuition free three credit hour general education online course during the summer of 2016.
