# MISSION & HISTORY

#### MISSION:

Lindenwood is committed to

- Providing diverse opportunities for students to engage the arts within an integrative liberal arts curriculum.
- Affording cultural enrichment to the surrounding community.

#### HISTORY:

Lindenwood's J. Scheidegger Center for the Arts opened in the fall of 2008 with two sold-out performances by legendary star Liza Minnelli and has been entertaining the St. Louis region ever since. With such names gracing the stage of the 1,200-seat Lindenwood Family Theater as Hal Holbrook, Ed Asner, Debby Boone, Marvin Hamlisch, and Debbie Reynolds, as well as national tours of CATS, Jesus Christ Superstar, Legally Blonde, Annie, and the Russian National Ballet, the J. Scheidegger Center for the Arts provides an unparalleled experience in the arts and entertainment.

Home to Lindenwood University's School of Fine and Performing Arts, the J. Scheidegger Center for the Arts features regular performances and exhibits by students in the theatre, dance, art, fashion, technical theatre, and music departments. Venues include the Broadway-style Lindenwood Family Theater, the Emerson Black Box Theater, and the Boyle Family Gallery. Also included are two dance studios, a costume shop, the Charter Communications High-Definition Television Studio, several piano studios and private music rooms, separate choral and orchestra halls, and many other amenities for the students and community.

#### PROGRAMS OFFERED:

Programs available to the St. Louis Metropolitan Area include the Lindenwood Family Theater Main Stage Season, University Theatre Department productions, music and dance concerts, art exhibits, and fashion shows.

Degrees are offered in a variety of areas of interest within the fine and performing arts and are available to both undergraduate and graduate students.

In the past two years, over \$1.8 million in scholarship aid was awarded to fine and performing arts majors.

# CONDUCTOR BIOGRAPHIES

#### CHOIR

Jennifer Crane is a native of Houston, Texas, where she studied under Katherine Ciesinski and Melissa Givens. Ms. Crane has performed as a soloist with the St. Louis Philharmonic Orchestra, the Alton Symphony, and Wildewood Baptist Church, and with ensembles such as the Houston Symphony Chorus, Moores Concert Chorale, University of Houston Chamber Singers, Moores Opera Chorus in productions of Puccini's La Rondine and Mozart's La Clemenza di Tito, Southwest American Choral Directors Collegiate Honor Choir, and the Lindenwood University Concert Choir and University Chorus. Formerly, Ms. Crane served as Music Director for Applause Theatre, Children's Music Director for Wildewood Baptist Church and Greenwood Christian School, and has been a private voice instructor since 2005. She recently performed the role of Cinderella's Mother in Sondheim's Into The Woods and currently is studying under Sarah Price while learning the role of Katisha in Gilbert & Sullivan's The Mikado under the direction of Jason Mallory.

During her studies, she was a member of the choirs at Lindenwood including University Chorus, Concert Choir, and Voices Only where she was a featured soloist on many occasions. In these choirs she was chosen to be a section leader. In 2011, she was also selected to represent Lindenwood as part of the Missouri All-Collegiate Honor Choir held at the MMEA Conference. Amy
