





President Dennis Spellmann came to Lindenwood College in 1989 and has been tackling challenges ever since.





In addition, Lindenwood students may take part in a variety of intramural sports offered during the school year. Intramural activities include team, dual and single competitions.

The Harlen C. Hunter Stadium and Sports Complex features an artificial turf field and has a seating capacity of 5,000. Students may also use the lower west practice field, as well as baseball and softball diamonds located behind the College's fieldhouse. A new outdoor track and sand volleyball courts are available. Students are welcome to use an outdoor pool behind Cobbs Hall. The Butler Student Center offers an all-purpose gymnasium with a full-sized basketball court and an adjoining game room featuring foosball, table tennis and billiards. Head Football Coach Dave Schroeder plans to continue building on the team's winning spirit this season. The Lions finished their first varsity season (second season of competition) in 1990 with a 6-4 record, the best new varsity football record for 1990 in the NAIA. Schroeder and his young Lion pack have set a goal of improving on last

season's mark and to continue laying a strong foundation of a winning tradition for the Lion football program.

Two offensive cornerstones for that foundation are Lamar Wilkes (soph., QB, Ritenour) and Adam Saperstein (soph., TB, Lyndhurst, Ohio). The two combined for 2620 yards in 1990, and accounted for more than two-thirds of the Lions' 3434 yards of total offensive production last season. Saperstein had his best day in 1990 against Cumberland. He romped for 235 years and accumulated 1059 yards for the season. While defenses were trying to contain Saperstein, Wilkes used his combination of adept passing and skilled running to add an additional dimension to the Lions' offensive attack.

On defense, Schroeder relies upon his wrecking crew to demolish opposing offenses to make room for the expansion of the Lions' strong foundation. His demolition crew chiefs are Charlie Kenyon (soph., OLB, Davenport, Fla.), and Jim Paddock (soph., SS, Middleburg, Fla.) Kenyon was the Lions' top defensive performer in 1990 with 67 tackles, nine quarterback sacks, three fumble recoveries, and two interceptions. Paddock kept pace with Kenyon by contributing 50 tackles, five quarterback sacks, and four interceptions to the defensive demolition efforts last season.

The construction efforts are continuing as Schroeder leads his young Lion pack into their second varsity campaign and third season at Lindenwood. He is joined by an outstanding coaching staff that has more than 200 years of combined winning experience in the Big 8, Big 10, Ivy League and high school.

Schroeder came to Lindenwood in 1989 with an impressive record of building winning teams. He was named District 16 Coach of the Year in 1986 and 1988 and District 12 Coach of the Year in 1982.

This year's edition of the Lindenwood men's soccer team ranked 15th nationally in the initial NAIA poll. In the last two seasons, the Lions reached the NAIA District 16 playoffs twice, compiling an overall record of 19-18-3.

In his first season at Lindenwood, Head Coach Thom Champion is bringing years of experience to the Lions.

Champion holds a United States Soccer Federation (USSF) "A" coaching license, and is a member of the National Soccer Coaches Association of America. His collegiate coaching record stands at 96 wins, 41 losses and 9 ties.

Champion's collegiate coaching experience includes McKendree College in Lebanon, III., Harris-Stowe State College, and Cardinal Newman College.

He has also co-coached the Bud Light Women's Over-30 team, which won an amateur championship; and the White Star Over-30 women's team, which won a national title. Lindenwood's women's soccer coach Deborah Washburn played on both teams.

Former Lions head soccer coach Buzz Demling will continue to assist Champion, and Larry Kuberski will oversee the junior varsity team.

The team has worked hard during pre-season on

The Lady Lions' goals for the season include a district and regional championship and a return to the national tournament.

Coach Siebels, in his fourth season with the Lions, has four starters coming back. They



The Lady Lions basketball team posted a 19-10 record during the 1990-91 season under the direction of first-year coach Steve Crotz. Last year not only yielded a record for most wins in a season, but also resulted in the first-ever appearance in the District 16 Tournament and an unprecedented Show-Me Collegiate Conference Tournament Championship.

Crotz is anxiously awaiting

the start of the 91-92 campaign as the squad returns Vanessa Van Pariis seven letter-winners. (sophomore, Eede, Holland), returns to anchor the Lady Lions' inside game. She is joined by All-Conference selections Angie Warren (sophomore, Hazelwood West) and Daphne Hozee (sophomore, Oostende, Belgium) in the back court. Other returnees include Chantay James (junior, Brentwood), Kristen Miller (junior, Northbrook, III.), Allison Klouse (sophomore, Fort Zumwalt South), and Jamie Hensley (senior, Monroe, Mich.). Ten new recruits will challenge for starting roles: forwards Tammi Boyce (freshman, Fort Zumwalt South), Judy Cochran (freshman, Nerinx Hall), Toni Hawk (junior, East Central C.C.), Marni Johnson (freshman, Farmington, III.), and Carol McLeod (freshman, Springfield Catholic); along with guards Jenifer Chronister (freshman, Rosati-Kain), Tracy Feibig (freshman, Webster Groves), Neel Hugh (freshman, Vireu, Denmark) and Stacey Worley (freshman, Mehlville). The Lady Lions will once again look to their defense to control their opponents as they were ranked 10th in the nation in team defense in 1990-91.

Prior to taking over the helm of the Lady Lions, Crotz coached at Brentwood High School for nine years. There, he compiled a record of 210-50 and 7 consecutive district championships. HIs teams made five state tournament appearances, winning the Class 2A state title in 1985, placing second in 1984 and 90, and placing third in 1986 and 89.

Recently, Crotz was named Lindenwood's Director of Athletic Administration.

Crotz holds a masters of education from the University of Missouri-St. Louis, and a bachelor of science degree in physical education and health from the University of Missouri-Columbia.
