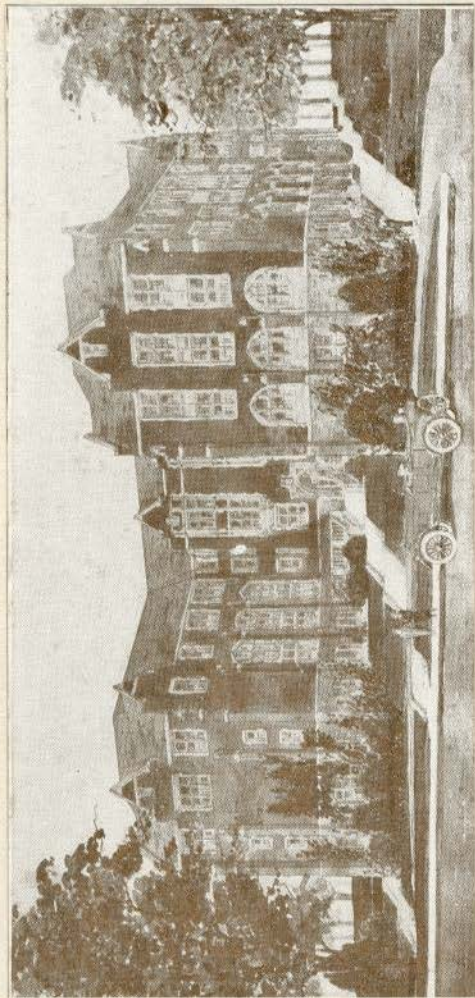

Important Dates in History of Lindenwood College

- 1827. Land acquired by Major Sibley.
- 1828. Site for College selected.
- 1831. Log Cabin completed, with accommodations for forty girls.
- 1853. College incorporated by Legislature.
- 1856. Property deeded by Major and Mrs. Sibley to Board of Directors of College.
- 1869. Sibley Hall erected.
- 1881. South wing of Sibley added.
- 1886. North wing of Sibley added.
- 1907. Jubilee Hall built.
- 1909. Purchased Margaret Hall.
- 1914. Election of Dr. J. L. Roemer as President.
Art Pottery built.
- 1915. Butler Hall dedicated February 15, by Col. Butler.
- 1916. August 22, Death of Col. James G. Butler.
- 1917. Niccolls Hall dedicated.
- 1917. Permanent endowment left College by Col and Mrs. Butler.
- 1918. Death of Mrs. Margaret L. Butler, July 16.
- 1918. Board of Directors established a four-year College curriculum, June 11.
- 1920. Breaking ground for the new administration building, February 23.
- 1920. Lindenwood Home-Coming, May 24-27.
- 1921. Formal announcement of admission to membership in Missouri College Union.
