## THE PAST AND PRESENT

Since its inception in 1827, Lindenwood College has had a long and full history. Mary Easton Sibley began it to prepare women for the greatest careerhomemaking. Through her guidance and with the help of her husband, Major George C. Sibley, Lindenwood flourished and grew.

The "school for young ladies" was opened in the home of the Sibleys, although, by 1831 the first building was erected. This was a long frame building that housed 30-40 boarders, faculty, classrooms, and infirmary. A picture of this is on the endsheets. Today, on the 140 acre campus are spread eight dormitories housing approximately 700 students, three classroom buildings, a health center, four homes, and a small office building.

Not only the campus has changed, but the curriculum also. For almost 100 years Lindenwood was a two year finishing school for young ladies. Today, however, it offers a four year liberal arts education to prepare its women for an active career. The college grants baccalaureate degrees in arts, science, music, and music education.

In the 1966 Linden Leaves we hope to give you a glimpse of the past and a remembrance of the present.
