THE PAST AND PRESENT

Since its inception in 1827, Lindenwood College has had a long and full history. Mary Easton Sibley began it to prepare women for the greatest career—homemaking. Through her guidance and with the help of her husband, Major George C. Sibley, Lindenwood flourished and grew.

The “school for young ladies” was opened in the home of the Sibleys, although, by 1831 the first building was erected. This was a long frame building that housed 30-40 boarders, faculty, classrooms, and infirmary. A picture of this is on the endsheets. Today, on the 140 acre campus are spread eight dormitories housing approximately 700 students, three classroom buildings, a health center, four homes, and a small office building.


Not only the campus has changed, but the curriculum also. For almost 100 years Lindenwood was a two year finishing school for young ladies. Today, however, it offers a four year liberal arts education to prepare its women for an active career. The college grants baccalaureate degrees in arts, science, music, and music education.

In the 1966 **Linden Leaves** we hope to give you a glimpse of the past and a remembrance of the present.






For nineteen years Lindenwood College has had for its president a man of great versatility and stature. Though he is now retiring, the results of his many talents and accomplishments will live on for years to come.



Sibley Hall, named for Major George Sibley and Mary Easton Sibley, founders of Lindenwood College, is the oldest building on campus. Dedicated in 1860, it replaced the log cabin which was the beginning of L.C. No two rooms in the building are alike, due to the addition of a south wing in 1881 and a north wing in 1886. The latter includes a chapel still used today for student recitals and classes. In Sibley parlor is a century-old grand piano which is said to be the first concert grand to be shipped to the Midwest.






YOUNG HALL


LINDENWOOD COLLEGE CHAPEL



CATASTROPHE DRILL




This year Lindenwood began a new Asian studies course under the auspices of the Fulbright Program and the University of New York. Four Asian professors were in residence for half a semester each. Their lectures included aspects of Asian economics, philosophy, and history, presented in such a way as to give the student a glimpse of life in the Far East.
