- The Lindenwood **Track and Field** teams wrapped up competition at the two-day Saint Louis Invitational. The men placed second of the 13 teams competing, while the women finished third of 15 teams.
- Dr. Michael Shonrock was the featured speaker at the **Department of Education Leadership Speaker Series** on April 11. He spoke of leadership and the book "Your Leadership EDGE Lead Anytime Anywhere" by Ed O'Malley and Amanda Cebula.
- The Belleville **Men's Basketball** team hosted students from Union Elementary to talk about what it means to be a "Champion of Character." The five core values of the NAIA Champion of Character program are respect, responsibility, integrity, servant leadership and sportsmanship.
- Lindenwood will have 69 students graduating with **University Honors**. In 2015, there were 392 St. Charles students and 42 Belleville students (434 total) that completed 872 honors courses.
- The Lindenwood **Baseball** team defeated Fort Hays State by a final of 3-0 on Sunday, April 10 at the Lou Brock Sports Complex in St. Charles, Missouri.

- The **Hammond Institute** has been asked if it could provide an administrative home for the Missouri Supreme Court Constitution

 Project, a mock case and trial competition held at the high school level. The Constitution Project has grown by spreading its geographic reach and by adding a college-level component. To date, the Hammond Institute has submitted a proposal for the purposes of cultivating a part-time administrative position in support of this effort. The proposal was recently approved by the Koch Foundation in the grant amount of \$67,000. Next steps include posting the position, and recruiting faculty oversight.

- Exercise Science undergraduate student, Quinton Reed received a strength and conditioning internship with Mississippi State football.


- As part of a **Social Psychology** class, students in Dr. Stephanie Afful's courses practiced different compliance strategies when discussing forms of social influence. Specifically, students asked 10 friends or family members to donate to a charity using door-in-the-face (ask for a lot, settle for a little), foot-in-the-door (ask for a little, followed by a larger request), and a direct request. The students voted to raise money for the **Water for Flint Fund** through United Way. The project was a huge success. Students in two sections raised over \$1200.00 for the residents of Flint. In addition, the students' efforts mimicked the research in this area in that the door-in-the-face strategy was the most effective.
- Gymnast **Andavea Alexander** scored a 9.975 on the floor exercise in the qualifying competition which advanced the Lady Lions to finals. The Lindenwood Gymnastics team then captured its second straight **USA Gymnastics Women's Collegiate National Championship**. The Lady Lions set a school record as they won in front of a large home crowd at Hyland Arena.
- While the Lindenwood gymnasts were winning their second straight national championship this weekend, the students at Lindenwood's LUTV were busy making sure everyone could see it. The USA Gymnastics Woman's Collegiate Championship has never been broadcast in the history of the event. LUTV productions were directed and presented by students in the Lindenwood School of Communications. This was also the first time that LUTV has ever been the sole provider of video for an NCAA national championship. Because the NCAA reserves the broadcast rights to the vast majority of its sports' national championships contest for major professional sports networks, having a university student-broadcast handle the chore is extremely rare. The students working on the production gained valuable experience and made lifelong memories.

- The Lindenwood **Women's Tennis** team took care of business against MIAA rival Fort Hays, sweeping all nine matches.
