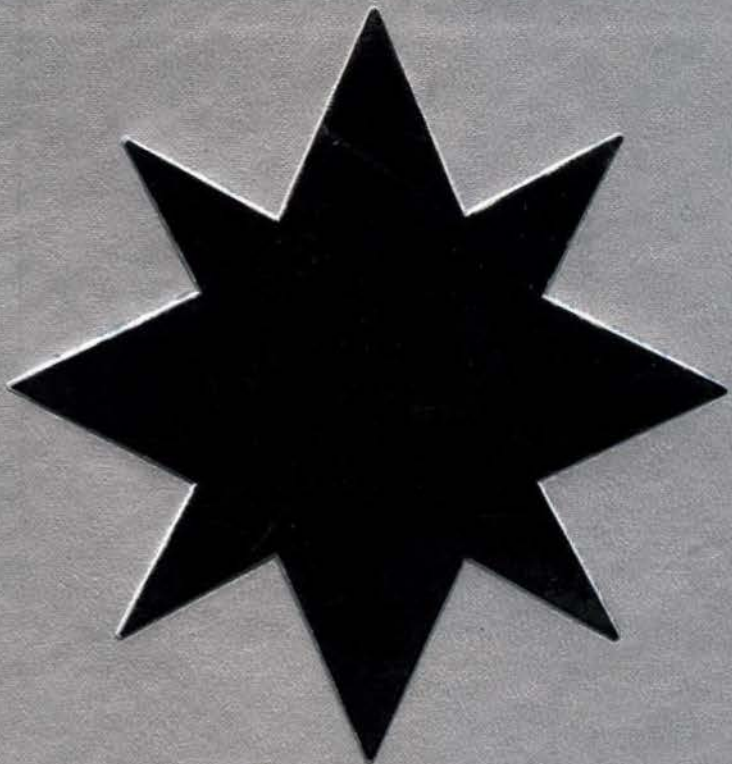

From farming towns and steel-stacked cities . . . We come;

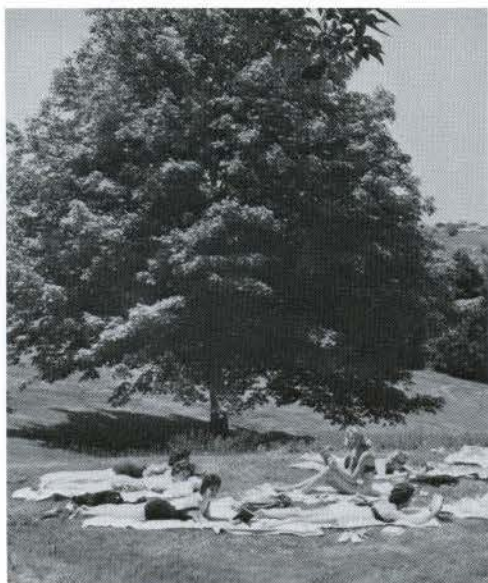
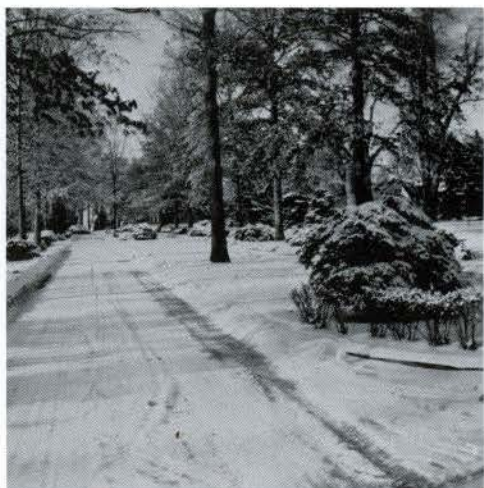

The importance of our origins is undeniable.

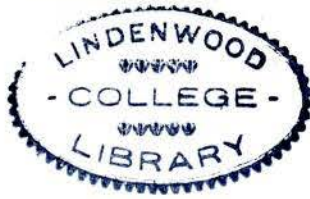
AND we come to understand the possibilities;

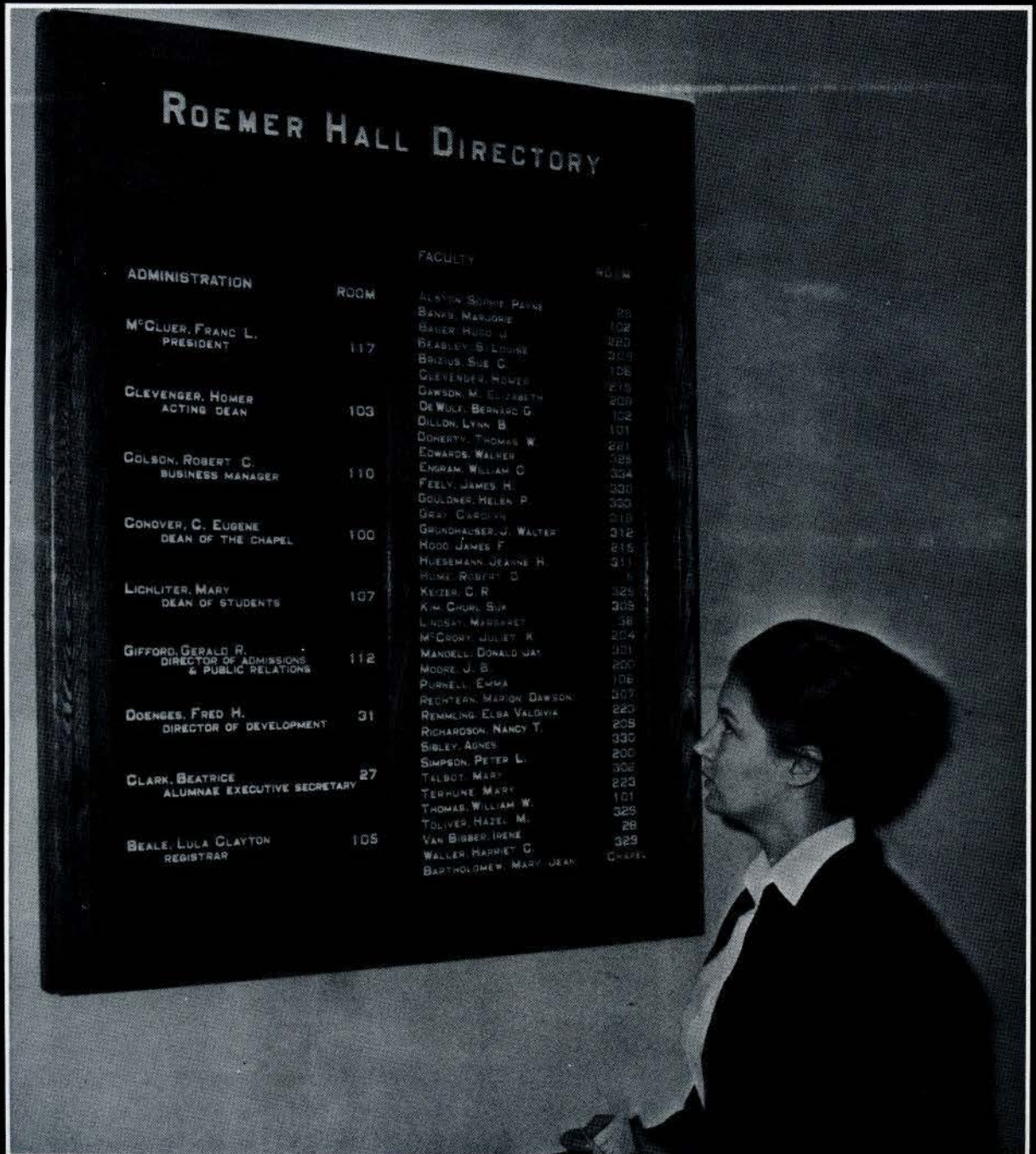

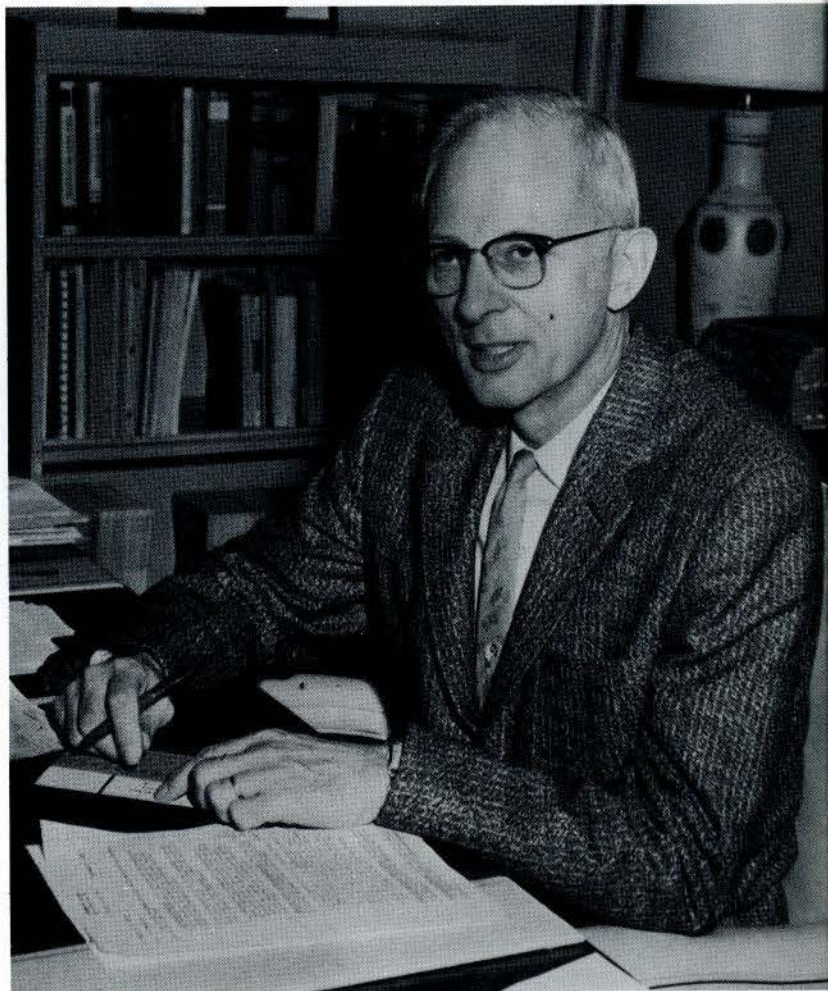
PRESIDENT OF THE COLLEGE

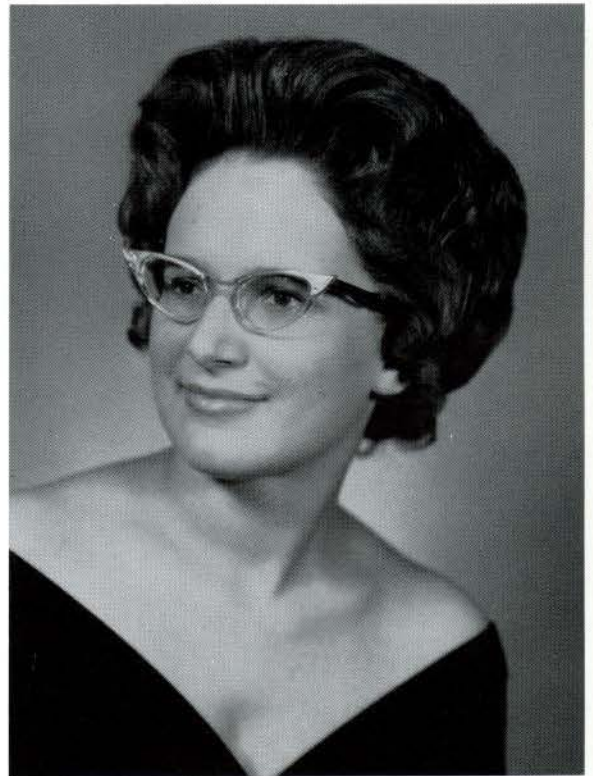
SENIOR CLASS

STUDENT COUNCIL

SOCIAL STANDARDS

The Social Standards Council, part of the Student Council, is comprised of representatives from each dormitory who discuss and suggest changes in dress regulations to meet the changing college community. The Council also cooperates with the administration and faculty in achieving a proper and comfortable classroom, dining room, and chapel atmosphere.





SOCIAL COUNCIL

The functions of the Social Council and the Social Chairman are to plan parties and dances and to help arrange dates for Lindenwood students. Unlike many offices, the Social Chairman begins her duties in January and continues them until after the first semester of the following year. This year Meg Blumers was succeeded by Barbara Sell. All other social activities are planned and arranged by Miss Odell, Social Director.

STUDENT ARTISTS GUILD

Sponsored by John Wehmer, the Student Artists Guild stimulates added interest in the areas of art by various activities. Trips to the St. Louis Zoo, Climatron and Art Museum, as well as the annual weekend at Mound Ridge give creative students an opportunity to explore individually the different art media. Special meetings this year included lecture-demonstrations by Pat Degner, Rudy Torini, and Harland Goudie, and a combined meeting with the Poetry Society.



ETA SIGMA PHI

Eta Sigma Phi is a national honorary fraternity for students of the Classics. The Lindenwood chapter of Eta Sigma Phi is relatively young, chartered in 1960. It has four active members, three of which are on campus. The principal activity of the organization is to act as a steering committee for the classics club discussions.

PHILOSOPHY CLUB

Small but active, the Philosophy Club meets often to discuss problems of philosophy by sharing and comparing ideas and points of view. Topics discussed this year included "The Limits of Reason," "Existentialism," and the philosophy of Paul Tillich. Dr. C. Eugene Conover and Professor William W. Thomas sponsor the group.





PI ALPHA DELTA

Pi Alpha Delta is a campus organization which strives to promote an understanding of the classical Greek and Roman cultures and their relationships to our own. The club has informal meetings to discuss topics chosen by the group. A traditional banquet closes the yearly activities.

POETRY SOCIETY

A closely cooperative group of students and faculty members, the Poetry Society holds informal discussion meetings each month. Often original poetry is contributed by students and some of the faculty for discussion, although other activities provide some variety in the programs. This year a combined meeting with the Student Artists Guild gave students a chance to become more acquainted with contemporary trends in both fields.





YEARBOOK

Appointed in the spring of 1962, the Linden Leaves Staff began work toward the present annual. From snapping informal shots around campus to approaching the businessmen of St. Charles for advertisements, the students work faithfully throughout the year. Staff members busied themselves with reporting stories, writing copy, editing and proofreading copy and galleys, drawing cartoons, taking and developing pictures. Extensive staff reorganization took place at the beginning of the first semester, during which semester Dr. Agnes Sibley served as faculty advisor to the Bark.





THE GRIFFIN

The literary editing class, working under the emblem of the mythological guardian of sacred treasure, selects outstanding pieces of student writing for publication in the literary annual. The class, led by Mr. Simpson, sponsors a freshman writing contest, collects creative writing from upperclassmen, discusses all the contributions, and prepares the best manuscripts for the press. Traditionally, the Dean presents the Griffin to the college on Honors Day.



CHOIR

The regular function of the Choir, under the direction of Mr. Franklin Perkins, is to provide music for Sunday evening vesper services. Occasionally special programs are presented by the choir during the school year, such as this year's traditional English Christmas candlelight service of nine lessons and nine carols, and the performance of a jazz setting of the Episcopal Mass. The spring tour is an honored tradition.



CHORALAIRES

The members of this select ensemble are chosen by audition from the college choir. They learn the methods and literature of ensemble singing. Under the direction of Mr. Franklin Perkins, the Choralaires represent the college in performances throughout the area and present special musical programs on campus.



MU PHI EPSILON

Phi Theta Chapter of Mu Phi Epsilon, national music sorority, chooses its members for musician-ship, academic achievement, and personality. During the year, the sorority has given a Founder's Day tea, a vesper concert, several programs, and has sponsored some faculty recitals. Faculty sponsor is Miss Gertrude Isidor.

MENC

Lindenwood's chapter of the Music Educators National Conference serves students working toward a degree in Music Education. M.E.N.C. gives its members opportunities to meet socially and professionally with other music educators. This year all of the members attended the Southwestern Division M.E.N.C. and Missouri Music Educators Association Convention held in St. Louis in January. The chapter also sponsored a trip to the Wicks Organ Factory for its members and guests.





SCA OFFICERS

The Student Christian Association membership includes nearly all of the student body. Its purpose of contributing to the spiritual and social life of the campus is carried out through various permanent committees working both on and off campus. Some activities include play reading, World University Service, and helping with the Salvation Army, Boys' Club, and mentally retarded children. SCA is affiliated with the National Student YWCA and the World Student Christian Federation.

S.C.A. JR. CABINET

Junior Student Christian Association is an organization in which freshmen learn what leadership and responsibility are and through which they receive a new outlook on religion. This year the freshmen have been very active; a brunch for information about summer service jobs, sponsoring "Toys for Tots," planning and presenting the Universal Day of Prayer, have busied the members. They hope to work again at Caroline Mission in St. Louis and also at the Kansas City Weekend Work Camp.





KCLC

In the spring of 1962 the CBS network in New York gave KCLC a control board which was remodeled to fit Lindenwood's radio station. In order to install the new board, broadcasts were postponed until February. Programs have been planned this year so as to offer the greatest possible variety. During the thirteen and a half hours each week of broadcast time, students hear music ranging from jazz to classical, book reviews with faculty members participating, interviews, panel discussions and women's shows, not to mention the newscasts and editorials, which were emphasized this year.

ALPHA EPSILON RHO

Three major events comprised the activities of Alpha Epsilon Rho this year. Four members and pledges from Lindenwood's Tau-Chapter attended the regional convention at Stephen's College in Columbia, Missouri. This national honorary society for radio and television students initiated new members in February, many of whom attended the annual national convention held this year in Kansas City.



PI MU EPSILON

Pi Mu Epsilon is an honorary mathematics fraternity. During the year 1961-62 the mathematics department at Lindenwood was invited to become affiliated with the Missouri Gamma Chapter of Pi Mu Epsilon at St. Louis University. Members are superior mathematics students of Junior or Senior rank. In addition to four seniors of 1962, two seniors this year were initiated, Joan Leiper and Judy Ross. S. L. Beasley, Jeanne Huesemann, and Churl S. Kim are members from the faculty of Lindenwood.



TRIANGLE

Triangle Club honors students in math, biology, and chemistry who achieve high scholastic standing. This year the membership grew to thirty-six students and nine honorary faculty members. A "cook's tour" through the new St. Louis Planetarium, and sponsorship of several all-school teas for visiting mathematicians and scientists constituted the major activities of the year. IRC

Eason, also of Washington University.

COLHECON

Colhecon, the College Home Economics Club, is associated nationally with the American Home Economics Association. The organization consists of students interested in the field, and presents programs in various areas of Home Economics including personal appearance, food, education, and gift and decoration ideas.



KAPPA OMICRON PHI

Kappa Omicron Phi is a national, professional home economics honorary fraternity. The sponsor of the Lindenwood Chapter is Miss Sophie Payne Alston. Activities this year included an open meeting with guest speaker Mrs. Marie Davis Huff, State Director of Home Economics; a bake sale and pledge service in the fall, and a pledge service and initiation in the spring.





WOMEN'S RECREATION ASSOCIATION

The Women's Recreation Association, better known as the W.R.A., has been organized to give leadership to the recreational activities of the girls on campus. Its main purpose is that of sponsoring intramural sports activities between the dormitories. This year, to get away from the competitive side of sports and give greater emphasis to the fun and pleasure side, a participation trophy was awarded to the dorm having the greatest number of girls participating. W.R.A. also sponsors Sports Days, Conventions, and Camping Trips.

ORCHESIS

The purpose of Orchesis is to extend to all members experience in the dance beyond that available in regular classwork, to exert constructive leadership in interesting others in dance as an art form, to study the dance with its accompanying arts, and to present demonstrations, recitals, and other educational programs.





BETA CHI

Beta Chi is the campus organization which promotes good horsemanship. It strives to encourage sportsmanship through learning the development and recent trends in equitation. Members of Beta Chi produce, direct, and participate in the annual horse show and style show.



BASKETBALL TEAM

"You play roving forward, I'll play roving guard." Yes, something new has been added to the game of basketball this year and Lindenwood's extramural team was out to meet the challenge. The sixteen members of this year's team played games with Washington U., Monticello, Principia, and S.U.I. The team played a total of six games, three at home and three away.



ALPHA LAMBDA DELTA

As a reward for high scholastic achievement, Alpha Lambda Delta taps freshmen who attain a 3.5 grade average. New students are introduced to this national academic fraternity at a tea during the first month of school. Alpha Lambda Delta honors its graduating seniors with a steak fry in May.

LINDEN SCROLL

Linden Scroll is a senior service organization. Students are tapped for membership based on excellence in leadership, citizenship, scholarship and loyalty. The sale of calendars and address books enabled Scroll to raise money for the scholarships given this year to an outstanding sophomore and junior. This year Linden Scroll sponsored discussion groups in preparation for the college visitor and lecturer Arnold Toynbee.



YOUNG REPUBLICANS

The main event of the Young Republicans' calendar for 1962-63 was the Midwest College Convention in St. Louis in April. STUDENT COUNSELORS

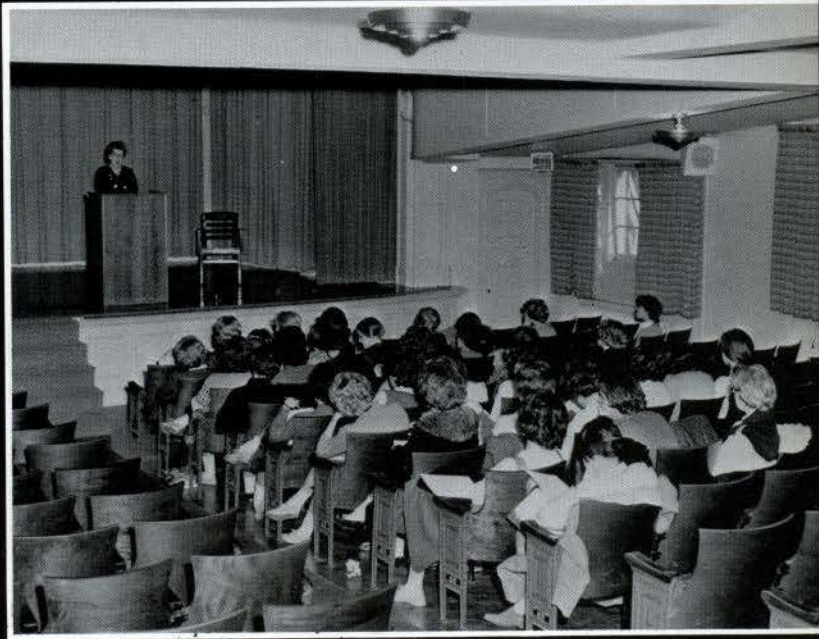

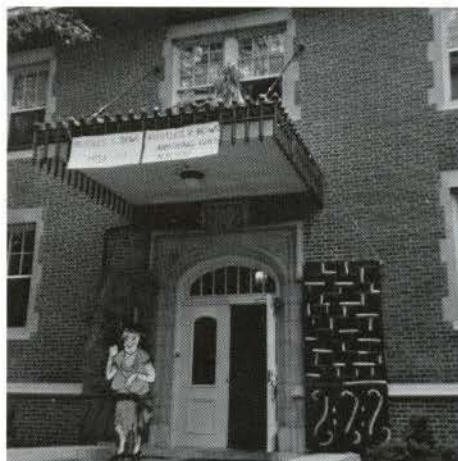
AYRES HALL

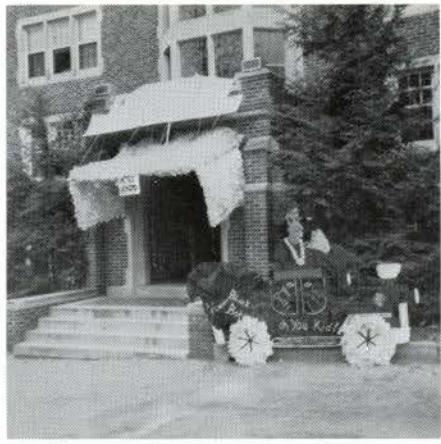

The four students this year were Sue Widman, Barb Sell, Sue Wood and Mary Sue Stockenberg.

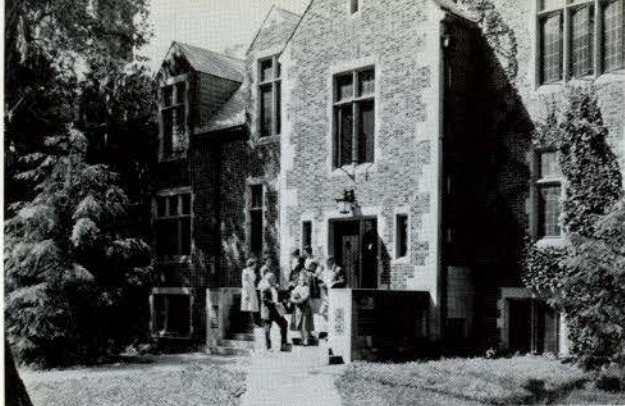

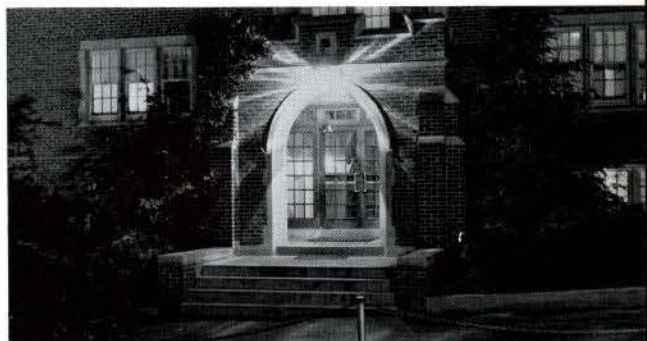

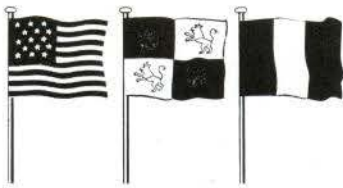
