This season's Friday evening showings of nine comedy films are being presented by the Lindenwood Lectures & Concerts Committee in conjunction with the English Department's course, "English 216: Comedy - Its Origins & Development."

The comedy series is free to all Lindenwood students. For others, a general admission of \$1 is charged.

Other films include the 1929 Laurel & Hardy classic, "Big Business," and the 1931 Marx Brothers film, "Monkey Business," on October 1; Judy Holliday, William Holden and Broderick Crawford featured in the 1950 movie, "Born Yesterday," October 29; Buster Keaton in the 1922 classic, "Cops," and Alec Guiness, Stanley Holloway, Alfie Bass and John Gregson in the 1951 film, "The Lavender Hill Mob," November 12; and Rene Clair's 1924 film, "Entr'Acte," and Zero Mostel, Gene Wilder and Dick Shawn featured in the 1968 comedy, "The Producers," December 3. All will be in Young Hall, beginning at 7 p.m.

At this month's faculty meeting, Jeanne Donovan of the Education Department was elected Faculty Secretary. She replaces John N. Bartholonew of the Sociology Department who resigned from the faculty earlier this year.

NEW SCHOOL OPENS, NAMED FOR HENDERSON

The newest facility in St. Charles' Francis Howell School District, Henderson Junior High School, officially opened recently, serving 330 sixth and seventh-grade students. The \$2.5 million school is named for Gene M. Henderson, professor and chairman of education at Lindenwood who joined the faculty in 1981 after serving for 16 years as superintendent of the Francis Howell district.

While at Francis Howell, Henderson developed a report on future district enrollment projections, pointing the way towards construction of a new junior high school. Last year, St. Charles voters approved a bond issue for construction of the new facility and, earlier this year, approved a second bond issue for a future phase of construction. With a potential enrollment of nearly 650 sixth, seventh and eighth graders, the second phase of construction is expected to begin soon and will accommodate the additional students in the 1983-84 school year.

Currently operating 20 classrooms, the new school is located on a 12-acre parcel of land off Hackmann Road in the eastern portion of the district.
