# PRELUDE

"Prelude" is a modern ballet in three acts which presents a series of back-stage circus scenes - sketches of circus performers before they enter the Big Top. Each dance is a sketch in itself - the audience sees the setting as pure black and white line and form which, through color and movement, comes to life for a few moments, returning then to its sketch form. It is as if an artist, walking around the circus grounds, saw these scenes and set them down on paper for us to look at: there is no attempt to present a story, but rather to give a little of the flavor and atmosphere behind the presentation of a circus performance.
