

- Lindenwood University Professor of History, **Don Heidenreich** contributed an article to the Library of Congress Election of 1796 site.
- The **Department of Anthropology** held this summer's Archaeological Field School, taught by Dr. Steve Dasovich, at two locations on Old

Main Street in St. Charles. Our goal was to find evidence of the first church built in St. Charles in 1791 by the French settlers who founded the city. We did not find such evidence, but we recovered over 10,000 artifacts dating from that period through the 1970s, with most dating to the early to mid-1800s. We also uncovered a human burial that is part of the city's first cemetery, active from 1790-1828. Law enforcement was called out per Missouri law (RSMO 214.000) and the Medical Examiner's (ME) office responded. They agreed it was not a crime scene. Dr. Dasovich notified Lindenwood's administration and lawyer The burial held the full skeleton of a male after calling the ME's office. in his late teens. He was approximately 5'5" and had been a clay pipe smoker for a few years. He was buried before 1830. The bones were otherwise too soft to do more analysis. He was left in place and reburied. Students did the vast majority of the work on the skeleton. We worked with two landowners, one at 401 S. Main, and the other at 322 S. Main. Contracts are in place for the analysis of the recovered materials.

• AAUP Lifts Sanction of Lindenwood University

At its annual meeting on June 18 in Washington, D.C., the American Association of University Professors voted unanimously to lift its sanction of Lindenwood University, which had been in place since 1994. The sanction addressed concerns about shared governance at Lindenwood, but the association noted that the situation had improved over the last several years. A report from a visiting team in March indicated the issue was no longer a concern. System President Michael Shonrock welcomed the vote, thanking the Board of Directors, the academic deans, the Faculty Council, and the provost's office for their work on the matter.
